#### **RIGHT-OF-WAY**

THIS RIGHT-OF-WAY AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is made by and between FAYETTE COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT FINANCE CORPORATION, an agency, instrumentality, and constituted authority of the Board of Education of Fayette County, Kentucky, and the BOARD OF EDUCATION OF FAYETTE COUNTY, KENTUCKY, both of which have a mailing address of 1126 Russell Cave Road, Lexington, Kentucky 40505 (collectively "Grantor"), and COLUMBIA GAS OF KENTUCKY, INC., a Kentucky corporation, with principal offices at 2001 Mercer Rd, Lexington, KY, 40511, ("Grantee").

**GRANT.** In consideration of \$1.00 and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, Grantor hereby grants to Grantee the right to:

- Construct, operate, maintain, replace, repair, alter the size of, upgrade, remove or abandon
  in place, pipelines and appurtenant equipment, together with valves, service connections
  and lateral connections for transporting gas with associated products, or other substances
  that can be transported through pipelines, and appurtenant facilities including, but not
  limited to, cathodic protection;
- 2. Perform pre-construction work;
- Ingress to and egress from the Right-of-Way area (defined below) by means of existing or future roads and other reasonable routes on the Premises (defined below) and on Grantor's adjoining lands; and
- 4. Exercise all other rights necessary or convenient for the full use and enjoyment of the rights herein granted, including the right from time to time to: (a) clear the Right-of-Way of all dwellings, garages, out-buildings, pools, decks, man-made bodies of water, trees, shrubbery, leach beds, septic tanks, unapproved utility installations, or any other obstruction of any kind; and (b) clear, cut, trim and remove any and all vegetation, trees, and brush and overhanging branches from the Right-of-Way by various means {(a) and (b) together shall collectively be known as "Encroachments"}

On, under, across and through Grantor's property situated in Fayette County, Kentucky, containing 14.39 acres, more or less, and more particularly known as:

Deed Reference: Deed Book 3009, Page 464, dated May 23, 2011, in the Fayette County, Commonwealth of Kentucky Clerk's Office, hereinafter referred to as "Premises."

Address Reference: 2319 Clays Mill Road, Lexington, Kentucky, 40503

The gas pipeline laid pursuant to the terms of this Agreement is to be located within the limits of a thirty (30) foot wide permanent easement ("Right-of-Way"). The Right-of-Way is shown on Exhibit A attached hereto and made a part hereof.

In addition to the Right-of-Way, Grantor grants Grantee a temporary easement twenty-five (25) feet on either side of and adjoining the permanent Right-of-Way, for the purpose of enabling Grantee to initially construct the pipelines and to conduct all activities related thereto, including restoration or clean-up activities.

Grantor may use and enjoy the Right-of-Way, except to the extent such use and enjoyment interferes with the rights granted to Grantee under this Agreement. Grantor shall not construct or permit to be constructed or place any Encroachment on or over the Right-of-Way that will, in any way, interfere with the use and enjoyment of the Right-of-Way by Grantee. Grantor shall not change the depth of cover in Right-of-Way; conduct grading operations within the Right-of-Way; permit the dumping of refuse or waste in the Right-of-Way; nor operate heavy machinery or equipment in the Right-of-Way except as may be consented to in writing by Grantee.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, Grantor reserves the right to construct and maintain driveways, entranceways, curbs, and sidewalks within the easement area as well as the existing marquee (message board) school sign and rain garden, so long as the above construction and maintenance has no adverse impact on the safe operation of the gas pipeline(s) to be installed, and the term "Encroachment" as used herein does not include these types of improvements.

Grantee shall replace and restore any area on the Premises disturbed by Grantee's laying, construction, operation, replacement, and maintenance of said pipelines to as good a condition as the Premises' original condition, except as provided herein. Grantor and Grantee agree that any damage to the Premises outside of the Right-of-Way that cannot be agreed upon by the Grantor and Grantee shall be submitted to a mutually agreed upon Mediator who will mediate the disagreement before any legal action is commenced in any appropriate court having jurisdiction.

Grantee shall indemnify and hold harmless Grantor and their respective successors or assigns from and against all claims, damages, losses, suits, and actions arising or resulting from the installation, construction, operation, maintenance, repair, renewal, replacement, or removal of said pipelines and appurtenant equipment, unless caused by the negligence of Grantor or their respective successors or assigns.

Any and all work or construction activities performed by Grantee under this easement shall be conducted with adequate barricades so as to protect school children from the work area and so as not to present any hazard affecting the safe operation of the school located near the easement, and said work or construction activities shall be carried out in a manner that does not interrupt or interfere with any school operations.

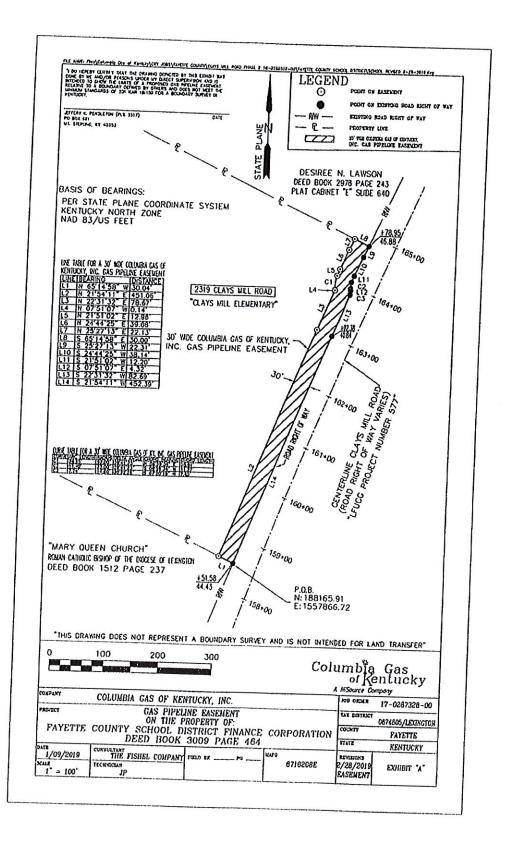
The parties agree that all monetary consideration payable hereunder shall be paid solely to the Board of Education of Fayette County, Kentucky.

Grantor represents and warrants to Grantee that, to the best of Grantor's knowledge: (a) no pollutants, contaminants, petroleum or hazardous substances have been disposed or released on or under the Premises that would cause or threaten to cause an endangerment to human health or the environment or require clean up; (b) neither the Premises, nor any portion thereof, is legally or contractually restricted as to its use or is subject to special environmental protections that would affect the use of the Right-of-Way for Grantee's intended use; and (c) the Premises, or any portion thereof, is not currently and has not previously been used for commercial or industrial purposes. Grantor further represents that it has informed Grantee, prior to the execution of the Agreement, of any and all pollutants, contaminants, petroleum, hazardous substances and endangerments which the Grantor knows or has reason to know exist or may exist on or under the Right-of-Way.

Grantor and Grantee agree that, except to the extent caused by the acts or omissions of Grantee or its representatives and contractors, Grantee shall not be liable for, and is hereby released from, any and all claims, damages, losses, judgments, suits, actions and liabilities, whether arising during, prior to or subsequent to the term of this Agreement, related to the presence of pollutants, contaminants, petroleum, hazardous substances or endangerments in, beneath or along the Premises.

The rights, privileges and terms hereby shall be covenants running with the land and extend to and be binding upon Grantor and Grantee and their respective representatives, heirs, successors and assigns.

- No computer classroom in STEAM Academy because students have chrome books (page 16 b.6 of 702 KAR 4:170)
- 5. Location of First Aid Area without direct view of the receptionist desk since a nurse is available (page 46 b.19.2 of 702 KAR 4:170)
- 6. Media Center is separated into a large Multipurpose Space and smaller learning commons distributed throughout the building instead of one large space (page 22 b.9 of 702 KAR 4:170)
- 7. Use of stackable chairs to be used in the Gymnasium in lieu of bleachers for entire student body (page 27 b.10.3 of 702 KAR 4:170)

8. Use of Gypsum Board on Metal Stud Partitions in lieu of CMU per KDE District Facilities Branch project managers' interpretation of page 59 part 3 paragraph C of 702 KAR 4:170.

WHEREAS, pending issuance of the Bonds, the Board desires to proceed with payment of certain costs of the Project from existing or borrowed funds, with the reasonable expectation of being reimbursed for such expenditures from the proceeds of the Bonds;

### NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF FAYETTE COUNTY, KENTUCKY, AS FOLLOWS:

- **Section 1.** The facts and statements contained in the foregoing preamble of this Resolution, including the terms defined therein, are hereby affirmed and incorporated as a part of this Resolution.
- **Section 2.** The Board hereby reaffirms and declares its official intent to finance, through the issuance of the Bonds, up to \$27,000,000 of the costs of the Project. All properties and facilities constituting the Project will have an economic life of at least one year.
- **Section 3.** It is acknowledged, and it is and has been the official intent of the Board, that costs of the Project shall be paid from existing or borrowed funds of the Board before the issuance of the Bonds; and the Board intends and reasonably expects to be reimbursed for such expenditures from the proceeds of the Bonds. The maximum principal amount of Bonds expected to be issued for the purposes of reimbursing the Board and paying costs of the Project is \$27,000,000.
- **Section 4.** This Resolution is intended to and does constitute a declaration of official intent under applicable Income Tax Regulations and shall be reasonably available for public inspection during normal business hours at the administrative offices of the Board in Lexington, Kentucky.
  - **Section 5.** This Resolution shall take effect upon its adoption.

#### CONTRACT

HIS CONTRACT is entered into this 28th day of January, 2019, by and between the BOARD ATION OF FAYETTE COUNTY, KENTUCKY, 701 East Main Street, Lexington, Kentucky Board") and • Jim Mulvihill Tours, 17014 SR 407, Nicholson, PA 18446 ("Second rarty").

#### A. PARTIES:

The Board of Education of Fayette County, Kentucky, **Wellington Elementary** has established the need to **tour Washington DC with our 5th grade students** and has determined that this need cannot be met by existing district staff.

Jim Mulvihili Tours provides Washington DC tours and has expertise or needed products as described herein.

#### B. PURPOSE:

The purpose of this contract is to improve the availability of **Washington DC tours**.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, for and in consideration of the mutual promises set out herein, it is hereby agreed by and between the parties hereto as follows:

- 1. The Second Party shall provide to the **Wellington Elementary**, as an independent contractor, services under the direction of **Julie Strange**.
- 2. The second party shall provide **DC tours for our 5th grade students from April 11th**-15th.
- 3. The Board agrees to pay the Second Party for the services/products provided in this contract the amount of \$85.879. Additional expenses to be reimbursed are 0, with a total amount of this contract not exceeding \$85.879.00
- 4. The Second Party shall provide to the Fayette County Board of Education an invoice for services rendered under this contract and any agreed upon expenses to be reimbursed. Unless otherwise stated, travel and per diem shall be reimbursed based upon the district's current travel policies.
- 5. The Second Party is not debarred or suspended or otherwise excluded from or ineligible for participation in Federal assistance programs under Executive Order 12549, "Debarment and Suspension."
- 6. This contract may be re-negotiated based upon, but not limited to, increases in services to participants. Any modifications shall be agreed to in writing and signed by both parties.
- 7. The staff providing services to the Board herein are employees of the Second Party and shall not represent to anyone that they are employees or agents of the Board.
- 8. Either party shall have the right to terminate this agreement at any time upon a fourteen (14) day written notice, either personally delivered or served by some form of return receipt mail evidencing delivery, to the other party.
- 9. Each of the parties agrees to comply with all applicable law concerning the performance of the provisions of this contract.
- 10. The Second Party certifies that it shall not discriminate in any of the services performed in connection with this contract or in any program or activity it operates on the basis of



race, color, national origin, religion, age, creed, political affiliation, marital status, sex, or disabling condition.

- 11. The Second Party certifies that it has read and will comply with the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act ("FERPA"), 20 U.S.C. § 1232g; 34 CFR Part 99).
- 12. Any contractor working on school property while students are present. must submit to a national and state criminal history background check by the Department of Kentucky State Police and the Federal Bureau of Investigation and have a letter, provided by the individual, from the Cabinet for Health and Family Services ("CHFS") stating the contractor is clear to hire based on no finding of substantiated child abuse or neglect found through a background check of child abuse and neglect records maintained by the Cabinet for Health and Family Services. The required background checks and letter from CHFS must be submitted to the FCPS Human Resources Office prior to the beginning of work. Failure to comply with this statute will be considered a breach of contract and will subject the contract to cancellation without penalty.
- 13. KRS 45A.455 PROHIBITS CONFLICTS OF INTEREST, GRATUITIES, AND KICKBACKS TO EMPLOYEES OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION IN CONNECTION WITH CONTRACTS FOR SUPPLIES OR SERVICES WHETHER SUCH GRATUITIES OR KICKBACKS ARE DIRECT OR INDIRECT. KRS 45A.990 PROVIDES SEVERE PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS OF THE LAWS RELATING TO GRATUITIES OR KICKBACKS TO EMPLOYEES WHICH ARE DESIGNED TO SECURE A PUBLIC CONTRACT FOR SUPPLIES OR SERVICES.
- 14. If any section, paragraph, or clause of this contract shall be held invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, the invalidity of said section, paragraph, or clause shall not affect any remaining provisions herein.
- 15. This contract is deemed to be made under and shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky.
- 16. Venue for any legal action filed concerning this contract shall be Fayette County, Kentucky.
- 17. This writing reflects the entire agreement between the parties. No change or modification of this Agreement shall be valid or binding upon the parties hereto, nor shall any waiver of any terms or conditions hereof be deemed a waiver of such terms or conditions in the future, unless such change, modification or waiver shall be in writing and signed by the parties hereto.
- 18. This agreement will be in effect from January 28th, 2019, through April 15th, 2019, unless terminated by either party as defined in Paragraph 8. The agreement may be renewed annually based upon evaluation of the effectiveness of the agreement in meeting the goals set forth herein and funding availability.

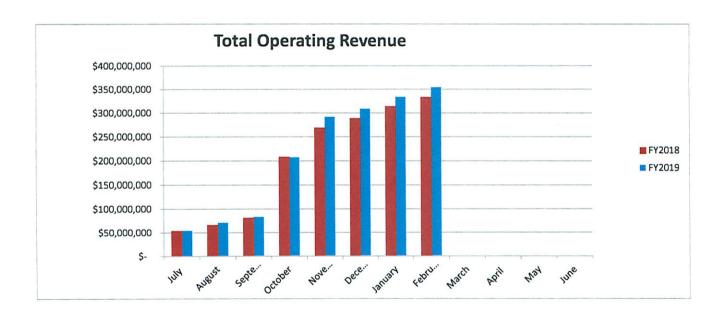

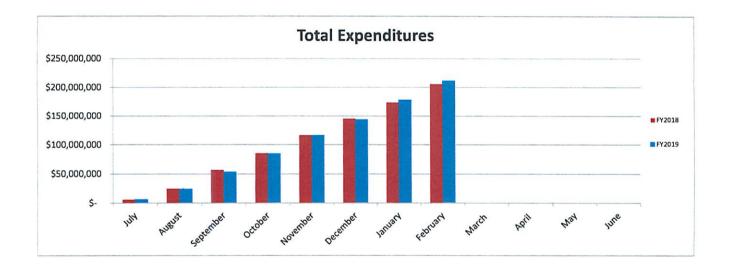
