MINUTES OF A SPECIAL MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE FAYETTE COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT FINANCE CORPORATION

A special meeting of the Board of Directors of Fayette County School District Finance Corporation (the "Corporation") was convened on September 25, 2017, at approximately 5:50 p.m., EST, at the Fayette County Board of Education offices in Lexington, Kentucky, pursuant to call and written notice duly given in accordance with KRS 273.257 and KRS 61.823.

The following Directors were present: Melissa Bacon, President, Raymond Daniels, Vice President, Doug Barnett, Daryl Love and Stephanie Spires. Also present, among others, were Emmanuel Caulk, Secretary of the Board of Education and Superintendent of Fayette County Schools; and Myron Thompson, Treasurer of the Board of Education and Senior Director of Operations and Support of Fayette County Schools; and John White II Senior Director of Administration of Fayette County Schools.

It having been determined that a quorum of the Directors was present for the transaction of business, the meeting was called to order by President Bacon.

President Bacon first requested approval of the minutes of the last meeting of the Board of Directors of the Corporation. On motion duly made by Raymond Daniels, seconded by Doug Barnett, the minutes of the last meeting were approved.

President Bacon next requested a motion to elect John White II as Treasurer of the Corporation. Doug Barnett moved for a vote to elect John White II as Treasurer of the Corporation, which was seconded by Daryl Love. President Bacon put the question to vote and all Directors voted "aye." The President then declared, John White II to be the Treasurer of the Corporation.

There being no further business, upon motion duly made, seconded, and unanimously carried, the meeting was adjourned.

CONTRACT OF LEASE AND RENT

This CONTRACT OF LEASE AND RENT (this "Contract"), is dated as of [Closing Date], by and between the FAYETTE COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT FINANCE CORPORATION (the "Corporation"), a Kentucky nonprofit corporation created pursuant to Sections 162.385, 58.180 and 273.161 through 273.390 of the Kentucky Revised Statutes and acting as the agency, instrumentality and constituted authority of the Board of Education of Fayette County, Kentucky, as lessor, and the BOARD OF EDUCATION OF FAYETTE COUNTY, KENTUCKY (the "Board of Education"), as lessee, both of which have a mailing address of 1126 Russell Cave Road, Lexington, Fayette County, Kentucky 40505-3412.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, that in order to carry out the duty and authority vested in it by the Constitution and Statutes of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, the Board of Education finds it necessary, desirable, and in the public interest to advance refund the Corporation's outstanding School Building Revenue Bonds, Series 2011A maturing on June 1, 2022 through (and including) June 1, 2031 in the aggregate principal amount of \$31,035,000 (the "Refunded Bonds"), which School Building Revenue Bonds, Series 2011A (the "Series 2011A Bonds") were previously issued to finance the reconstruction, renovation, improvement, and equipping of the Clays Mill, Mary Todd, Millcreek, Cardinal Valley, and Breckinridge Elementary Schools in the Fayette County School District, including buildings, additions, structures, fixtures, equipment, furnishings, appurtenances, improvements, and the sites thereof, such properties being referred to collectively herein as the "Projects"; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education previously caused title to the Projects, including their sites, to be conveyed to the Corporation; and pursuant to authority vested in it by the laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, including Sections 162.120 through 162.300 and 162.385 of the Kentucky Revised Statutes, the Corporation, by Resolution of its Board of Directors, dated December 18, 2017 (the "Bond Resolution"), authorized, offered, and competitively sold its School Building Refunding Revenue Bonds, Series 2017A in an aggregate principal amount of \$33,690,000 (the "Series 2017A Bonds") for the purposes of advance refunding the Refunded Bonds and paying related costs; and

WHEREAS, under the terms of that certain Participation Agreement dated as of [Closing Date], by and between the Kentucky School Facilities Construction Commission (the "Commission") and the Board of Education (the "Participation Agreement"), the Commission has determined that the Board of Education is entitled to an Agreed Participation (as defined in the Participation Agreement) by the Commission in an annual amount to satisfy a portion of the principal and interest requirements of the Series 2017A Bonds, subject to biennial renewal because of the constitutional limitation on obligations undertaken by agencies of the Commonwealth of Kentucky; and

WHEREAS, the Corporation and the Board of Education are parties to a Contract of Lease and Rent dated as of June 1, 2011, with respect to the Projects, which will remain in effect until June 1, 2021, subject to the terms and conditions thereof, and which creates a prior pledge of rentals from the Projects to secure the unrefunded Series 2011A Bonds maturing on June 1, 2018 through (and including) June 1, 2021.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Corporation hereby agrees to cause the Refunded Bonds to be advance refunded and to lease the Projects, including the sites thereof as described in APPENDIX A hereto, to the Board of Education, and the Board of Education hereby agrees to lease the Projects from year to year, for one year at a time, for a rental payable from year to year amounting to a sum sufficient to pay the principal and interest requirements of the Series 2017A Bonds as may from time to time be outstanding, together with the cost of maintaining and insuring the Projects, all subject to the following terms and conditions, to which the parties agree:

Section 1. The Board of Education agrees that the Projects, the sites of which are described in **APPENDIX A** hereto, shall be used and occupied for educational purposes and that the rental for each rental year beginning June 1st and ending on the next succeeding May 31st (the last such rental year ending on May 31, 2031) shall be a sum equal to the interest payment on the Series 2017A Bonds which will become due on December 1st during such rental year plus the principal amount of Series 2017A Bonds which will mature and interest which will become due on June 1st immediately following the close of such rental year, based upon the interest rates made applicable to the Series 2017A Bonds, as fixed by the Corporation.

All such rentals, other than the portions thereof which are payable by the Commission pursuant to the Participation Agreement, shall be payable in semiannual installments in accordance with the preceding paragraph on or before the 20th days of May and November of the respective rental years, beginning May 20, 2018, and shall be paid by the Board of Education in immediately available funds.

The Board of Education further agrees to pay as additional rental the appropriate fees and charges of the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar named in the Bond Resolution and any other administrative costs of the Series 2017A Bonds.

As a part of the consideration for the initial rental payments, the Board of Education is hereby given the right to use and to occupy any portions of the Projects as the same are reconstructed, renovated, improved, and equipped and are available for such use.

Section 2. The Board of Education may terminate this Contract at the expiration of any rental year by giving written notice to the Corporation of its determination to so do ninety days before the June 1st immediately following the end of such rental year, and it is specifically understood and agreed that the obligation of the Board of Education hereunder is an obligation to pay rentals on a year-to-year basis for services rendered as a result of the use and occupancy

of the Projects, and that such obligation ceases upon its election to terminate this Contract as herein provided. If, in any year, this Contract is not terminated as herein provided, the obligation to pay rentals shall automatically extend for an additional rental year.

Section 3. If the Board of Education shall pay rentals from year to year as herein provided for said period of years ending May 31, 2031, then upon the completion of such payments the leased premises shall be and become the property of the Board of Education and shall be reconveyed to it or its nominee, subject, however, to the provisions of similar agreements or contracts which may hereafter be entered into between the Board of Education and the Corporation. The consideration of such deed of conveyance shall be the recital of the fulfillment of this Contract.

Section 4. In case the Board of Education exercises its option to terminate this Contract, as hereinabove provided, then this Contract shall become null and void and shall be no longer binding, and all rentals and obligations due and unpaid for the then current rental year shall forthwith become due and collectible, and the Board of Education shall give immediate possession of the Projects to the Corporation.

Should the Board of Education fail to pay the stipulated rentals due hereunder for the original rental period or during any rental year for which this Contract is renewed, at the times herein stipulated, then this Contract may be immediately terminated by the Corporation, all rentals for which the Board of Education has become committed hereunder shall become due and payable, and all rights for the option to renew this Contract on the part of the Board of Education may be terminated and forfeited to the Corporation.

Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Section 4, the Board of Education shall have a continuing beneficial interest in the Projects and the Projects' sites, which continuing beneficial interest is hereby acknowledged and granted and shall survive any such termination of this Contract, consisting of the unqualified right for a ninety-day period following any such termination or default to elect in writing to acquire and receive title to the Projects and the Projects' sites when all Series 2017A Bonds and interest obligations thereon have been discharged pursuant to the Bond Resolution, if the Board of Education provides for such discharge before any disposition of the Corporation's interests in the Projects' sites; provided that no such disposition may occur within ninety days from any such election.

Section 5. The Board of Education may purchase the Projects and the sites thereof and thereby terminate this Contract at any time by giving to the Corporation at least sixty days' advance written notice of its intention so to do and by depositing with the Corporation, on or before the designated purchase date, a sum sufficient to provide for the redemption, defeasance, or retirement of all of the then outstanding Series 2017A Bonds in accordance with the terms of the Bond Resolution, together with a further sum equal to the expenses, if any, which the Corporation and the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar designated in accordance with the Bond

Resolution may incur in calling outstanding Series 2017A Bonds for prior redemption and other related expenses. If the Board of Education shall elect to exercise such right to purchase and acquire the Projects and the Projects' sites, then in depositing the required funds with the Corporation as aforesaid the Board of Education may take credit for the balance, if any, then held by the Corporation to the credit of the Bondholders; provided, however, that provision shall be made for paying all proper costs, expenses, and charges of the Corporation and the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar designated in accordance with the Bond Resolution. Upon the happening of such event of purchase of the Projects and the Projects' sites by the Board of Education, and the issuance by the Corporation of an appropriate certificate evidencing defeasance of all outstanding Series 2017A Bonds, the Corporation shall immediately convey all its right, title, and interest in the Projects and their respective sites to the Board of Education.

Further, the Board of Education may purchase any of the three component parts of the Projects, including their respective sites, as described below, free and clear of the statutory mortgage lien securing the Series 2017A Bonds, at any time by giving to the Corporation at least sixty days' advance written notice of its intention so to do and by depositing with the Corporation, on or before the designated purchase date, a sum sufficient to provide for the redemption, defeasance or retirement of the applicable Pro Rata Share (as defined below) of the then outstanding Series 2017A Bonds in accordance with the terms of the Bond Resolution, together with a further sum equal to the expenses, if any, which the Corporation and the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar designated in accordance with the Bond Resolution may incur in calling outstanding Series 2017A Bonds for prior redemption and other related expenses. Upon the happening of such event of purchase of any of the five component parts of the Projects, including their respective sites, by the Board of Education, and the issuance by the Corporation of an appropriate certificate evidencing defeasance of the applicable Pro Rata Share of outstanding Series 2017A Bonds, the Corporation shall immediately convey all its right, title, and interest in such component part or parts of the Projects, including their respective sites, to the Board of Education. As used above in this paragraph, the term "Pro Rata Share" means, on the date of calculation, with regard to the Series 2017A Bonds and the Projects, a percentage with respect to (and based on an approximate allocation of Series 2017A Bond proceeds to) each component part of the Projects, as follows:

Clays Mill Elementary School - 22.92%
Mary Todd Elementary School - 17.67%
Millcreek Elementary School - 17.81%
Cardinal Valley Elementary School - 22.58%
Breckinridge Elementary School - 19.02%

The foregoing provisions of this Section 5 are subject to any applicable liens and restrictions relating to the unrefunded Series 2011A Bonds and any similar restrictions that may

hereafter be provided in the issuance of school building revenue bonds for properties constituting the Projects.

Section 6. In case the Projects or any portion thereof are damaged or destroyed by fire, lightning, windstorm, or other hazard covered by insurance, such property shall be restored by the Corporation through application of the proceeds of such insurance, unless such proceeds are applied as permitted in the foregoing Section 5 hereof.

Section 7. It is agreed and understood that so long as the Board of Education continues to lease the Projects it will, at its own expense, maintain, and keep the Projects in good state of repair and will procure and pay the cost of insurance on the Projects against loss by fire, lightning, and windstorm, and the amount of such insurance shall be at all times the full insurable value of the Projects. From and after occupancy of the Projects by the Board of Education and so long as such occupancy continues under the terms of this Contract, the Board of Education shall, on or about July 1st of each year, furnish to the Corporation a report showing the types and amount of insurance coverage procured and maintained with respect to the Projects, together with evidence that premiums for such insurance have been paid in full for the ensuing year, or, if such premiums are not then due and payable, that the amounts which will become payable during the ensuing year have been properly budgeted. The Board of Education shall likewise furnish an annual report to the Corporation describing the condition of the Projects, reporting any maintenance and repair work undertaken during the previous year and furnishing evidence that the cost thereof has been paid or properly budgeted by the Board of Education.

Section 8. The rentals herein stipulated and agreed to be paid by the Board of Education to the Corporation represent compensation for the use and occupancy of the Projects, and such rentals are separate from and in addition to any rentals which the Board of Education may hereafter agree to pay to the Corporation for the use and occupancy of any portion of the Projects' sites covered by any subsequent similar contract as provided in Section 9 hereafter.

Section 9. It is contemplated by the parties that the Board of Education may at some time in the future, or from time to time and before the full retirement of the Series 2017A Bonds, find it necessary or desirable that other school buildings and appurtenances be constructed upon one or more of the sites herein described, financed through the issuance of one or more additional series of similar bonds. It is acknowledged that in the Bond Resolution, and in the form of the Series 2017A Bonds, the statutory mortgage lien provided by Section 162.200 of the Kentucky Revised Statutes for the security and protection of the holders of the Series 2017A Bonds shall be restricted in its application to the buildings and appurtenances herein referred to and constituting the Projects, together with so much of the respective sites herein described as may be necessary to provide adequate ingress and egress and the rendering of necessary services to the Projects, with the right expressly reserved to the Corporation, at the request of the Board of Education, to construct and finance in a similar manner upon any unoccupied portions of the sites herein described other buildings and appurtenances for school purposes notwithstanding said buildings

are connected by use of party walls with structures which are subject to the lien securing the Series 2017A Bonds; and provided said additional buildings are (a) capable of use as separate entities; (b) have their own outside entrances; and (c) no part of the costs of said additional structures and appurtenances are paid from the proceeds of the Series 2017A Bonds. The Board of Education agrees that in such event the construction at its request of such additional school buildings and appurtenances upon unoccupied portions of the sites shall not operate to reduce the rentals herein stipulated and the agreement of the Corporation to re-convey the Projects' sites as set forth in this Contract shall be ineffective with regard to any such unoccupied portions of the sites herein described on which additional buildings and appurtenances may hereafter be constructed (together with such portions of the sites as will provide for adequate ingress and egress and the rendering of necessary services to such additional buildings and appurtenances) until payment in full of all bonds at any time issued and outstanding for such additional buildings and appurtenances.

Section 10. The Board of Education and the Corporation each certifies and covenants with the holders of the Series 2017A Bonds that so long as any of the Series 2017A Bonds remain outstanding, each of them adopts and will comply or cause compliance with the tax covenants and representations contained in Section 21 of the Bond Resolution, which provisions are adopted by reference as a part of this Contract.

Section 11. The Commission has determined that the Board of Education is eligible for assistance from the Commission through annual Agreed Participation payments by the Commission in meeting the costs of the Projects. The amount of the annual Agreed Participation with respect to the Projects has been determined by the Commission to be an annual aggregate amount (payable periodically), which is allocated to the Series 2017A Bonds as set forth in the Participation Agreement; and the Commission has agreed to participate to that extent in each year, with such amount to be applied to pay principal and interest requirements of the Series 2017A Bonds until the total principal amount of the Series 2017A Bonds and interest thereon is paid in full.

The obligation of the Commission to participate in meeting the rental payments is limited to the biennial budget period of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, and the Commission's obligation to participate to the extent of the amount stated is limited to the period commencing July 1, 2016, and terminating June 30, 2018; provided, however, that if the Commission elects not to continue to participate in accordance with the Agreed Participation, it shall give written notice to the Board of Education, the Kentucky Department of Education, and the original purchasers of the Series 2017A Bonds at least sixty days before the expiration of the biennial budget period of the Commonwealth (June 30th of each even numbered year). Nothing contained herein shall be construed as binding the Commission to pay the Agreed Participation established under the Participation Agreement to be applied to the agreed rentals due hereunder for any period other than the initial biennial period ending June 30, 2018, but the obligation of the Commission to participate shall automatically renew each two years for a period of two years unless the

Commission shall give notice of its intention not to participate as set out above. The Commission has expressed in the Participation Agreement its present intention to continue to pay the Agreed Participation annually in each successive biennial budget period until the retirement of the Series 2017A Bonds, but is not and cannot become legally obligated to do so.

The Commission's participation shall be evidenced by periodic remittances on or before the due dates for interest and principal of the Series 2017A Bonds in each year; and such remittances, which shall be taken as credits against rentals due from the Board of Education pursuant to this Contract, shall be made directly to the respective paying agents for the Series 2017A Bonds to be applied to the respective principal and interest payments of the Series 2017A Bonds falling due on such respective dates. Within thirty days following each such payment, the Commission shall send the Board of Education written notice of such remittance.

In order to secure the payment in part of the Board of Education's rental obligations under this Contract, the Board of Education hereby pledges to the Corporation the Agreed Participation to which it is entitled under the Participation Agreement and does hereby assign to the Corporation, for the payment of the Series 2017A Bonds, all of the Board of Education's rights in and to the Agreed Participation so long as any of the Series 2017A Bonds remain outstanding and unpaid (and not defeased).

ESCROW AGREEMENT

This ESCROW AGREEMENT (this "Agreement"), is dated [Closing Date], and is by and between the FAYETTE COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT FINANCE CORPORATION (the "Corporation") and THE BANK OF NEW YORK MELLON TRUST COMPANY, N.A., Dallas, Texas, a national banking association with trust powers organized under the laws of the United States of America, as Escrow Agent (the "Escrow Agent").

PREAMBLE

WHEREAS, on June 14, 2011, the Corporation issued its Fayette County School District Finance Corporation School Building Revenue Bonds, Series 2011A in an original aggregate principal amount of \$52,175,000 (the "Series 2011A Bonds") to finance the costs of the reconstruction, renovation, improvement, and equipping of certain facilities of the Board of Education of Fayette County, Kentucky (the "Board of Education"); and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education has directed the Corporation to undertake and implement for and on behalf of the Board of Education the advance refunding of the Series 2011A Bonds maturing on and after June 1, 2022, in the aggregate outstanding principal amount of \$31,035,000 (the "Refunded Bonds") in order to achieve debt service savings; and

WHEREAS, the Series 2011A Bonds are current as to the payment of principal and interest; and

WHEREAS, the Corporation has determined to advance refund the Refunded Bonds and to provide for their redemption on June 1, 2021, their first optional redemption date, at a redemption price equal to 100% of their par value as stipulated in the Resolution of the Corporation authorizing the Refunded Bonds, by depositing with the Escrow Agent an amount to be used to acquire United States Treasury Bills and Notes (collectively, the "Federal Securities") as described herein, which Federal Securities will produce principal and interest in amounts and at times sufficient to pay interest when due on the Refunded Bonds and to provide for such redemption on the earliest redemption date; and

WHEREAS, the Refunded Bonds are payable as to principal and interest, when due, by The Bank of New York Mellon Trust Company, N.A., Dallas, Texas (the "Paying Agent"); and

WHEREAS, in order to provide the funds needed for the advance refunding of the Refunded Bonds, the Corporation has authorized and is, concurrently with the execution and delivery of this Agreement (on [Closing Date]), issuing its School Building Refunding Revenue Bonds, Series 2017A, dated [Closing Date] (the "Series 2017A Bonds"), pursuant to a Resolution adopted by the Corporation on December 18, 2017 (the "Resolution");

NOW, **THEREFORE**, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements herein contained, the Corporation and the Escrow Agent agree as follows:

Section 1. The Escrow Fund.

- (a) There is hereby created and established in trust with the Escrow Agent a special and irrevocable escrow fund designated the "Fayette County School District Finance Corporation Escrow Fund 2011A Refunding" (the "Escrow Fund"), which shall be a trust fund held by the Escrow Agent as trustee.
- (b) The Escrow Agent shall deposit in the Escrow Fund proceeds of the Series 2017A Bonds in the amount of \$[____] (the "Bond Proceeds"), which have been delivered by the Corporation to the Escrow Agent. A portion of the Bond Proceeds will be invested in the Federal Securities in the manner described in this Agreement, which Federal Securities and the income therefrom will be sufficient (i) to pay interest on the Refunded Bonds due on June 1, 2018, December 1, 2018, June 1, 2019, December 1, 2019, June 1, 2020, December 1, 2020 and June 1, 2021; and (ii) to redeem on June 1, 2021 all Refunded Bonds (being all the Series 2011A Bonds maturing on and after June 1, 2022) at a redemption price equal to 100% of the par value of the Refunded Bonds. The Federal Securities and cash on deposit in the Escrow Fund shall be applied exclusively by the Escrow Agent, and are hereby pledged, for the foregoing purposes. The Refunded Bonds are payable, and shall be redeemed, as set out in the schedules attached hereto as **EXHIBIT A** (the "**Schedules**").
- (c) Except as may otherwise be provided in this Agreement, the deposit of Bond Proceeds in the Escrow Fund shall constitute an irrevocable deposit on behalf of and for the use and benefit of the holders of the Refunded Bonds and for their security. Subject to the foregoing requirements for the use of the Escrow Fund and the moneys and Federal Securities therein and except as otherwise provided herein, the Corporation and the Escrow Agent covenant and agree that the Escrow Agent shall have full and complete control and authority over and with respect to the Escrow Fund and moneys and Federal Securities therein, the Corporation shall not exercise any control or authority over and with respect to the Escrow Fund and the moneys and Federal Securities therein, and the Escrow Agent shall not surrender or otherwise attempt to redeem or otherwise negotiate the Federal Securities in the Escrow Fund except as they shall come due as shown in the Schedules attached hereto as **EXHIBIT A**.

Section 2. Use And Investment Of Funds.

- (a) The Escrow Agent acknowledges receipt on the date of execution and delivery of this Agreement ([Closing Date]) of the Bond Proceeds as described in Section 1(b) hereof and agrees, except as may otherwise be provided in this Agreement, to hold and apply the Bond Proceeds, together with all amounts derived from the investment thereof, in irrevocable escrow during the term of this Agreement.
- **(b)** On the date of this Agreement, the Escrow Agent shall immediately purchase the Federal Securities using \$[____] of Bond Proceeds deposited into the Escrow Fund in accordance with the Schedules. The Escrow Agent shall leave the remaining \$[____] of Bond Proceeds initially deposited into the Escrow Fund uninvested as described in the Schedules. Beginning on June 1, 2018, and continuing on December 1, 2018, June 1, 2019, December 1, 2019,

June 1, 2020, December 1, 2020, and June 1, 2021, the Escrow Trustee shall apply the proceeds of the Federal Securities and any cash then held uninvested in the Escrow Fund to the payment of interest on or redemption price of the Refunded Bonds as described in the Schedules.

Section 3. Pledge. All principal of and interest on all Federal Securities held in the Escrow Fund, all payments of principal and interest thereon and all other amounts held from time to time in the Escrow Fund are hereby pledged irrevocably, subject to the terms of this Agreement, to the payments set out in Section 1(b) hereof.

Section 4. Payments. The Escrow Agent shall pay, as the Paying Agent for the Refunded Bonds, from the moneys on hand in the Escrow Fund, (a) on June 1, 2018, December 1, 2018, June 1, 2019, December 1, 2020, December 1, 2020, and June 1, 2021, the interest on the Refunded Bonds coming due on such dates; and (b) on June 1, 2021, the redemption price of all Refunded Bonds (being all the Series 2011A Bonds maturing on and after June 1, 2022) equal to 100% of their par value, all as set out in the Schedules.

Section 5. Reinvestment.

- (a) Except as provided in Section 2 and in this Section 5, the Escrow Agent shall have no power or duty to invest any funds held under this Agreement or to sell, transfer, or otherwise dispose of or make substitutions of the Federal Securities held hereunder.
- (b) At the written request of the Corporation and upon compliance with the conditions hereinafter stated, the Escrow Agent shall invest cash in the Escrow Fund and/or shall sell, transfer, otherwise dispose of, or request the redemption of any of the Federal Securities acquired hereunder and shall apply the amounts received upon such sale, transfer, disposition, or redemption either to the purchase of Refunded Bonds or the purchase of other direct obligations of the United States in substitution for such Federal Securities. The Corporation covenants with the holders of the Series 2017A Bonds and the Refunded Bonds that it will not request the Escrow Agent to exercise any of the powers described in the preceding sentence in any manner which, if such exercise had been reasonably expected on the date of issuance of the Series 2017A Bonds or the Refunded Bonds, respectively, would have caused the bonds of such issues to be "arbitrage bonds" within the meaning of the United States Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), as implemented by such proposed, temporary, and permanent regulations as have been or may be adopted from time to time by the United States Treasury Department in effect on the date of such exercise and applicable to obligations issued on the respective dates of issuance of such issues of bonds. The Escrow Agent will comply with the written request of the Corporation hereunder only upon receipt of (i) a certificate or opinion from a nationally recognized independent public accountant or accounting firm that the principal of and interest on the Federal Securities in the Escrow Fund, after the transactions are completed, together with other moneys in the Escrow Fund, will be sufficient to pay all principal of the Refunded Bonds called for redemption as herein provided, and all interest on the Refunded Bonds to the redemption date, and (ii) an opinion from nationally recognized bond counsel to the

effect that the transactions will not cause the Series 2017A Bonds or the Refunded Bonds to be "arbitrage bonds" within the meaning of the Code.

Section 6. Redemption; Acceleration Of Maturity; Defeasance. At the request of the Board of Education, the Corporation has elected to, and hereby elects to, and shall call for redemption on June 1, 2021, the Refunded Bonds; and the Corporation represents that it has caused to be taken, or has irrevocably provided to be taken, all action legally required to call for redemption on June 1, 2021, the Refunded Bonds; otherwise, the Corporation will not accelerate the maturity of, or exercise any option to redeem before maturity, any Refunded Bonds.

It is acknowledged and determined by the Corporation that the Federal Securities and cash held in the Escrow Fund shall be sufficient to make the payments on the Refunded Bonds as set out in Section 4 hereof, such determination being based upon (and in reliance upon) certain certifications and schedules of J.J.B. Hilliard, W.L. Lyons, LLC, dated the date of delivery of the Series 2017A Bonds, the mathematical computations in which have been verified as to accuracy by [Verification Agent], as evidenced by its report also dated the date of delivery of the Series 2017A Bonds, all being of record in the Transcript of Proceedings relating to the issuance of the Series 2017A Bonds.

Section 7. Payment Of Costs; Hold Harmless.

- (a) The Corporation agrees to pay the reasonable fees and expenses of the Escrow Agent described in **EXHIBIT B** attached hereto.
- (b) The Corporation hereby assumes liability for, and hereby agrees (whether or not any of the transactions contemplated hereby are consummated) to protect, save, and keep harmless the Escrow Agent and its respective successors, assigns, agents, and servants from and against any and all liabilities, obligations, losses, damages, penalties, claims, actions, suits, costs, expenses, and disbursements (including legal fees and disbursements) of whatsoever kind and nature which may be imposed on, incurred by, or asserted against at any time, the Escrow Agent and in any way relating to or arising out of the execution and delivery of this Agreement, the establishment of the Escrow Fund, the acceptance of the funds and securities deposited therein, the purchase of the Federal Securities, the retention of the Federal Securities or the proceeds thereof and any payment, transfer or other application of funds or securities by the Escrow Agent in accordance with the provisions of this Agreement; provided, however, that the Corporation shall not be required to hold the Escrow Agent harmless against its own negligence or misconduct. In no event shall the Corporation be liable to any person by reason of the transactions contemplated hereby other than to the Escrow Agent as set forth in this Section 7. The assurances contained in this Section 7 shall survive the termination of this Agreement.
- **Section 8. Responsibilities Of Escrow Agent**. The Escrow Agent and its respective successors, assigns, agents, and servants shall not be held to any personal liability whatsoever, in tort, contract, or otherwise, in connection with the execution and delivery of this Agreement, the establishment of the Escrow Fund, the acceptance of the funds deposited therein, the purchase of the Federal Securities, the retention of the Federal Securities or the proceeds thereof or any

payment, transfer, or other application of moneys or securities by the Escrow Agent in accordance with the provisions of this Agreement or by reason of any nonnegligent act, omission, or error of the Escrow Agent made in good faith in the conduct of its duties. The Escrow Agent shall, however, be liable to the Corporation for its negligence or willful misconduct, acts, omissions, or errors which violates or fails to comply with the terms of this Agreement that result in an actual loss to the Corporation. The duties and obligations of the Escrow Agent shall be determined by the express provisions of this Agreement, and no implied duties of the Escrow Agent shall be read into this Agreement. The Escrow Agent may consult with counsel, and in reliance upon the opinion of such counsel shall have full and complete authorization and protection in respect of any action taken, suffered, or omitted by it in good faith in accordance therewith. Whenever the Escrow Agent shall deem it necessary or desirable that a matter be proved or established before taking, suffering, or omitting any action under this Agreement, such matter may be deemed to be conclusively established by a certificate signed by an authorized officer of the Corporation. The Escrow Agent shall have the right to perform any of its duties hereunder through agents, attorneys, custodians, or nominees, and shall not be responsible for the misconduct or negligence of such agents, attorneys, custodians, and nominees appointed by it with due care. The Escrow Agent shall be protected in acting upon any notice, request, certificate, affidavit, letter, telegram, or other paper or document believed by it to be genuine and to have been signed by the proper person or persons and shall not be held to have notice of any change of authority of any person, until receipt of written notice thereof from the Corporation. None of the provisions contained in this Agreement shall require the Escrow Agent to use or advance its own funds in the performance of any of its duties or the exercise of any of its rights or powers hereunder.

Section 9. Resignation Of Escrow Agent. The Escrow Agent may resign and thereby become discharged from the duties and obligations hereby created, by notice in writing given to the Corporation and mailed, first class mail, to the holders of the Refunded Bonds not less than sixty days before such resignation shall take effect, provided that such resignation shall not become effective until a successor Escrow Agent shall have been appointed. Such resignation shall take effect immediately upon the appointment of a new Escrow Agent hereunder, if such new Escrow Agent shall be appointed before the time limited by such notice and shall then accept the duties and obligations thereof.

Section 10. Removal Of Escrow Agent. The Escrow Agent may be removed at any time by an instrument or concurrent instruments in writing executed by the holders of not less than 67% in aggregate principal amount of the Refunded Bonds, such instruments to be filed with the Corporation and notice thereof to be mailed in the manner and to the holders described in Section 9 hereof not less than sixty days before such removal is to take effect as stated in said instrument or instruments. A photographic copy of any instrument filed with the Corporation under the provisions of this paragraph shall be delivered by the Corporation to the Escrow Agent.

The Escrow Agent may also be removed at any time for any breach of trust or for acting or proceeding in violation of, or for failing to act or proceed in accordance with, any provisions of this Agreement with respect to the duties and obligations of the Escrow Agent by any court of

competent jurisdiction upon the application of the Corporation or the holders of not less than 5% in aggregate principal amount of the Refunded Bonds.

Section 11. Successor Escrow Agent. If at any time hereafter the Escrow Agent shall resign, be removed, be dissolved, or otherwise become incapable of acting, or shall be taken over by any governmental official, agency, department or board, the position of Escrow Agent shall thereupon become vacant. In the event of a vacancy in the position of Escrow Agent without availability of a successor for any reason, the Corporation shall appoint a successor Escrow Agent within thirty days from the occurrence of such vacancy and, if no such appointment shall be made, the holder of any Refunded Bonds or the retiring Escrow Agent, at the Corporation's expense, may apply to any court of competent jurisdiction to appoint a successor Escrow Agent. Such court may thereupon, after such notice, if any, as such court may deem proper and prescribe, appoint a successor Escrow Agent. Any corporation, association or other entity into which the Escrow Agent may be converted or merged, or with which it may be consolidated, or to which it may sell or otherwise transfer all or substantially all of its corporate trust assets and business or any corporation, association or other entity resulting from any such conversion, sale, merger, consolidation, or other transfer to which it is a party, ipso facto, shall be and become successor Escrow Agent hereunder, vested with all other matters as was its predecessor, without the execution or filing of any instrument or any further act on the part of the parties hereto, notwithstanding anything herein to the contrary.

Section 12. Term. Except as provided in Section 7(b), this Agreement shall commence upon its execution and delivery and shall terminate when the interest on and principal of the Refunded Bonds and the redemption prices of the Refunded Bonds have been paid and such payment obligations discharged in accordance with the proceedings authorizing the Refunded Bonds, upon which payment and discharge any sums remaining in the Escrow Fund shall be paid, but in no event before June 1, 2021, over to the Corporation.

Section 13. Severability. If any one or more of the covenants or agreements provided in this Agreement on the part of the Corporation or the Escrow Agent to be performed should be determined by a court of competent jurisdiction to be contrary to law, such covenant or agreement shall be deemed and construed to be severable from the remaining covenants or agreements herein contained and shall in no way affect the validity of the remaining provisions of this Agreement.

Section 14. Counterparts. This Agreement may be executed in several counterparts, all or any of which shall be regarded for all purposes as one original and shall constitute and be but one and the same instrument.

Section 15. Governing Law. This Agreement shall be construed under the laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

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A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE **FAYETTE** COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT **FINANCE** CORPORATION AUTHORIZING THE SALE AND ISSUANCE OF SCHOOL BUILDING REFUNDING REVENUE BONDS, SERIES 2017A, FOR THE PURPOSES OF ADVANCE REFUNDING A PORTION OF THE CORPORATION'S SCHOOL BUILDING REVENUE BONDS, SERIES 2011A, AND RELATED COSTS; PROVIDING FOR CREATION OF A FUND TO PAY THE INTEREST ON AND PRINCIPAL OF THE SERIES 2017A BONDS AS AND WHEN THEY BECOME DUE; AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF A LEASE OF CERTAIN SCHOOL PROPERTIES TO THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF FAYETTE COUNTY; PROVIDING FOR A PUBLIC, COMPETITIVE SALE OF THE SERIES 2017A BONDS; AUTHORIZING RELATED DOCUMENTS **ACTIONS.**

WHEREAS, all capitalized terms used in this preamble shall have the meanings set forth in **EXHIBIT A** attached hereto; and

WHEREAS, the Corporation previously issued its Series 2011A Bonds, in the original principal amount of \$52,175,000, on behalf of the Board of Education, for the purposes of financing the Projects; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education, by Resolution dated December 18, 2017, has deemed it necessary, desirable and in the best interest of the Board of Education, and has directed the Corporation, in order to achieve interest cost savings, to advance refund the Refunded Bonds; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education previously caused title to the Projects and their sites to be conveyed to the Corporation; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education has agreed to continue to use and to occupy the Projects pursuant to the terms of a Contract of Lease and Rent as hereinafter provided, and said instrument has been examined and is now found and declared to be in conformity with statutory requirements; and

WHEREAS, in order to advance refund the Refunded Bonds and to pay related costs, it has been determined to be necessary to issue the Series 2017A Bonds, all pursuant to and as permitted by KRS Sections 162.120 through 162.300 and 162.385; and

WHEREAS, under the terms of the Participation Agreement, the Commission has determined that the Board of Education is entitled to an Agreed Participation (as defined in the Participation Agreement) by the Commission in an annual amount to satisfy a portion of the

principal and interest requirements of the Series 2017A Bonds, subject to biennial renewal by the Commission; and the Board of Education has assigned the Agreed Participation to the Corporation for the payment of the Series 2017A Bonds.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE FAYETTE COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT FINANCE CORPORATION AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Affirmation Of Preamble Recitals; Authorization Of Series 2017A Bonds. All statements and recitals set forth in the preamble of this Resolution, including the terms defined therein, are hereby affirmed and adopted as a part of this Resolution.

For the purposes recited in the preamble hereof and pursuant to the Constitution and laws of the Commonwealth, particularly KRS 162.120 through 162.300 and 162.385, there are hereby authorized to be issued \$33,690,000 aggregate principal amount of Series 2017A Bonds provided that such aggregate principal amount, together with corresponding amounts of annual maturities as set out in Section 2 hereof, may be increased by as much as \$3,365,000 (in \$5,000 denominations) and decreased by any amount (in \$5,000 denominations), and principal maturities may be otherwise adjusted, upon the sale of the Series 2017A Bonds, by the Corporation's Financial Advisor, acting on the Corporation's behalf, as hereinafter provided in Section 16 hereof.

Section 2. Description Of Series 2017A Bonds.

(a) Payment Of Principal And Interest; Other Provisions. The Series 2017A Bonds shall be dated the date of original issuance and delivery and shall bear interest payable on each June 1st and December 1st, beginning June 1, 2018, to maturity or redemption and payment of the Series 2017A Bonds. Interest on each Series 2017A Bond not registered in Book-Entry Form to a Securities Depository shall be paid by check drawn upon the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar, to be designated as hereinafter described, and mailed to each Registered Holder at the address of such Registered Holder as it appears on the registration books of the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar.

The Corporation's President is hereby authorized and directed to select a Paying Agent and Bond Registrar, which selection will be affirmed by the Board of Education by a supplemental resolution designating and appointing such entity as the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar for the Series 2017A Bonds.

The principal of the Series 2017A Bonds not registered in Book-Entry Form to a Securities Depository shall be payable to the respective Registered Holders without exchange or collection charges, in lawful money of the United States of America, upon their presentation and surrender as they respectively become due and payable, whether at maturity or by prior redemption, at the designated office of the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar. Series 2017A Bonds shall be issued and reissued by the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar from time to time only as fully registered bonds without coupons in the denominations of \$5,000 and any integral multiple thereof, as hereinafter provided. Unless the Corporation shall otherwise direct, the Series 2017A Bonds shall be numbered separately from 1 upward.

Principal of and interest on Series 2017A Bonds registered in Book-Entry Form in the name of the Securities Depository or the Securities Depository Nominee shall be payable by wire transfer from the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar to the Securities Depository or its Securities Depository Nominee.

The Series 2017A Bonds shall bear interest at a rate or rates to be established by the Corporation on the basis of competition after the Series 2017A Bonds are offered for sale at an advertised, public, competitive sale as hereinafter provided. The Record Date is to be used for the purpose of determining the Registered Holder to whom interest shall be payable on the next succeeding interest payment date, and the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar may treat for such purpose the person in whose name any Series 2017A Bond is registered on the Record Date as the Registered Holder thereof. Interest shall be computed on the basis of a year of 360 days consisting of twelve 30-day months.

The Series 2017A Bonds shall mature and be payable as to principal as follows:

provided, however, certain Series 2017A Bonds may become Term Bonds subject to mandatory sinking fund redemption as described in Section 3 and Section 16 hereof.

All of the Series 2017A Bonds, together with interest thereon, shall be payable only out of the Sinking Fund, hereinafter created, and shall be a valid claim of the Registered Holder thereof only against the Sinking Fund and the revenues of the Projects pledged to the Sinking Fund, which revenues are subject to the prior and superior pledge securing payments of interest on and principal of the unrefunded Series 2011A Bonds maturing on and before June 1, 2021.

(b) Series 2017A Bonds Issued In Book-Entry Form. The Series 2017A Bonds shall initially be issued in Book-Entry Form and registered in the name of the Securities Depository or the Securities Depository Nominee as provided in this Section 2(b). Except when the Series 2017A Bonds are no longer issued in Book-Entry Form as provided below in this Section 2(b), the Series 2017A Bonds shall be registered in the name of the Securities Depository or the Securities Depository Nominee, and ownership thereof shall be maintained in Book-Entry Form by the Securities Depository for the account of the Participants thereof. Initially, the Series 2017A

Bonds shall be registered in the name of Cede & Co., as the nominee of The Depository Trust Company, which shall be the initial Securities Depository. Each of the Corporation's President, Treasurer, or Secretary is authorized to approve and execute on the Corporation's behalf a letter of representations or other appropriate instrument with The Depository Trust Company (to which the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar may also be a party) relating to the issuance and administration of the Series 2017A Bonds in Book-Entry Form.

Except when the Series 2017A Bonds are no longer issued in Book-Entry Form as provided below in this Section 2(b), the Series 2017A Bonds may be transferred, in whole but not in part, only to the Securities Depository or the Securities Depository Nominee, or to a successor Securities Depository selected or approved by the Corporation or to a nominee of such successor Securities Depository.

As to any Series 2017A Bond, the person in whose name the Series 2017A Bond shall be registered shall be the Registered Holder and the absolute owner thereof for all purposes, and payment of or on account of the principal of and interest on any such Series 2017A Bond shall be made only to or on the order of the Registered Holder thereof or his legal representative.

Neither the Corporation nor the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar shall have any responsibility or obligation with respect to:

- (i) the accuracy of the records of the Securities Depository or any Participant with respect to any beneficial ownership interest in the Series 2017A Bonds;
- (ii) the delivery to any Participant, any beneficial owner of the Series 2017A Bonds, or any other person, other than the Securities Depository, of any notice with respect to the Series 2017A Bonds; or
- (iii) the payment to any Participant, any beneficial owner of the Series 2017A Bonds, or any other person, other than the Securities Depository, of any amount with respect to the principal or interest on the Series 2017A Bonds.

So long as any Series 2017A Bonds are registered in Book-Entry Form, the Corporation and the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar may treat the Securities Depository as, and deem the Securities Depository to be, the absolute owner and the Registered Holder of such Series 2017A Bonds for all purposes whatsoever, including:

- (i) the payment of principal and interest on the Series 2017A Bonds;
- (ii) giving notices of redemption and other matters with respect to the Series 2017A Bonds;
 - (iii) registering transfers with respect to the Series 2017A Bonds;
 - (iv) selection of Series 2017A Bonds for redemption; and

(v) for purposes of obtaining any consents under this Resolution.

If at any time the Securities Depository notifies the Corporation that it is unwilling or unable to continue as Securities Depository with respect to the Series 2017A Bonds, or if at any time the Securities Depository shall no longer be registered or in good standing under the Securities Exchange Act or other applicable statute or regulation and a successor Securities Depository is not appointed by the Corporation within ninety days after the Corporation receives notice or becomes aware of such condition, as the case may be, then this Section 2(b) shall no longer be applicable and the Corporation shall execute and the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar shall authenticate and deliver certificates representing the Series 2017A Bonds to the Registered Holders.

Payment of principal of and interest on any Series 2017A Bonds not registered in Book-Entry Form shall be made as provided in Section 2(a) hereof.

Section 3. Redemption Of Series 2017A Bonds.

- (a) Mandatory Sinking Fund Redemption. If the successful bidder and original purchaser of the Series 2017A Bonds so elects in accordance with the provisions of Section 16 hereof and as may be provided in the official action of the Corporation's President, Treasurer, or Secretary awarding the Series 2017A Bonds to such original purchaser, the Series 2017A Bonds stated to mature on the maturity dates set out in the successful bid of such original purchaser shall be combined to comprise the maturities of Term Bonds as set out in said successful bid and in said official action; and such Term Bonds shall be subject to mandatory redemption in part, at the selection of the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar by lot in such manner as the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar may determine, from moneys in the Sinking Fund on each applicable June 1st at par plus accrued interest to the redemption date, according to the mandatory sinking fund redemption schedule or schedules set out in said official action and in principal amounts corresponding to the maturity schedule set out in Section 2 hereof (subject to adjustment as herein provided).
- **(b) Optional Redemption**. The Series 2017A Bonds maturing on and after June 1, 2028, are subject to redemption by the Corporation, at its option, before maturity on and after June 1, 2027, in whole or in part at any time or times in any order of maturity (less than all of a single maturity to be selected by lot in such manner as the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar may determine) at the redemption price of 100% of the principal amount thereof plus accrued interest to the redemption date.

The Series 2017A Bonds maturing on and after June 1, 2028, shall be called for redemption by the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar as herein provided upon receipt by the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar at least thirty-five days before the redemption date of a certificate of the Corporation or the Board of Education specifying the principal amount and maturities of the Series 2017A Bonds so to be called for redemption and the applicable redemption price or prices.

(c) Other Redemption Provisions. The Paying Agent and Bond Registrar shall cause notice of the call for any redemption, identifying the Series 2017A Bonds or portions thereof (\$5,000 or any integral multiple thereof) to be redeemed, to be sent by first class mail at least thirty days but no more than sixty days before the date fixed for redemption to the Registered Holder of each Series 2017A Bond to be redeemed at the address shown on the registration books maintained by the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar. Failure to give such notice by mailing or any defect therein in respect of any Series 2017A Bond shall not affect the validity of any proceedings for the redemption of any other Series 2017A Bond. Any notice mailed as provided in this Section 3 shall be conclusively presumed to have been duly given, irrespective of whether the Registered Holder receives the notice.

Before the date fixed for redemption of Series 2017A Bonds, funds shall be deposited by the Corporation or the Board of Education with the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar to pay, and the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar is hereby authorized and directed to deposit such funds into the Sinking Fund hereinafter identified and to apply such funds to the payment of, the Series 2017A Bonds or portions thereof called for redemption, together with accrued interest thereon to the redemption date. Upon the giving of notice and the deposit of adequate funds in the Sinking Fund for redemption of Series 2017A Bonds, interest on the Series 2017A Bonds or portions thereof so called for redemption shall cease to accrue after the date fixed for redemption. No payment of principal or interest shall be made by the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar upon any Series 2017A Bond or portion thereof called for redemption until such Series 2017A Bond or portion thereof shall have been delivered to the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar for payment or cancellation, or the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar shall have received the items required by Section 6 hereof with respect to any mutilated, lost, stolen, or destroyed Series 2017A Bond.

A portion of any Series 2017A Bond subject to redemption may be redeemed, but Series 2017A Bonds shall be redeemed only in the principal amount of \$5,000 each or any integral multiple thereof. Upon surrender of any Series 2017A Bond for redemption in part only, the Corporation shall execute and the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar shall register, authenticate, and deliver to the holder thereof, within a period of three days from surrender of such Series 2017A Bond to the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar, at the Corporation's expense, a new Series 2017A Bond or Series 2017A Bonds of the same maturity, of authorized denominations, and in aggregate principal amount equal to the unredeemed portion of the Series 2017A Bond surrendered.

With reference to Section 16 hereof, if the date of competitive sale of the Series 2017A Bonds (presently contemplated to be [Sale Date]) is postponed and rescheduled for a later time in calendar years 2017 or 2018 (through December 31, 2018), the Corporation's President, Treasurer, or Secretary shall be authorized to act on the Corporation's behalf in adjusting, upon the advice of the Financial Advisor, some or all of the foregoing terms and provisions of the Series 2017A Bonds, including the date of the Series 2017A Bonds, the principal maturity schedule and the optional redemption dates, and the related terms and provisions of the Contract of Lease and Rent.

Section 4. Execution Of Series 2017A Bonds; Limited Obligation. The Series 2017A Bonds shall be executed on the Corporation's behalf by the manual or reproduced facsimile signature of its President and shall have impressed or imprinted thereon either a true impression or a reproduced facsimile of the Corporation's official seal and shall be attested with the manual or reproduced facsimile signature of its Secretary. An authorized facsimile signature shall have the same force and effect as a manual signature. In case any officer of the Corporation whose signature or a facsimile of whose signature shall appear on the Series 2017A Bonds shall cease to be such officer before the delivery of such Series 2017A Bonds, such signature or such facsimile shall nevertheless be valid and sufficient for all purposes, the same as if such officer had remained in office until delivery.

The Series 2017A Bonds are not and shall never in any event become general obligations of the Corporation or the Board of Education but are special and limited obligations of the Corporation payable solely from the Sinking Fund as hereinafter provided, and the Sinking Fund and the revenues of the Projects are hereby specifically assigned and pledged to the holders of the Series 2017A Bonds for the amortization of the Series 2017A Bonds in the manner and to the extent provided herein. The Series 2017A Bonds and the interest thereon shall never constitute a debt, indebtedness or pledge of the faith and credit of the Corporation or the Board of Education within the meaning of any provision or limitation of the Constitution or statutes of the Commonwealth, and shall not constitute or give rise to a pecuniary liability of the Corporation or the Board of Education or a charge against the general credit of either or against the taxing power of the Board of Education. The Corporation shall not be obligated to pay the principal of the Series 2017A Bonds or the interest thereon or other costs incident thereto except from the revenues and amounts pledged therefor.

Section 5. Form Of Series 2017A Bonds. The Series 2017A Bonds shall be issued only in the form of bonds registered as to payment of both principal and interest in substantially the following form, with necessary and appropriate variations, omissions, and insertions as permitted or required by this Resolution, set forth at **EXHIBIT B** attached hereto.

Section 6. Mutilated, Lost, Stolen, Or Destroyed Series 2017A Bonds. If any Series 2017A Bond is mutilated, lost, stolen, or destroyed, the Corporation may execute and the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar may authenticate and deliver a new Series 2017A Bond of like series, date, maturity and denomination as that mutilated, lost, stolen, or destroyed; provided that, in the case of any mutilated Series 2017A Bond, such Series 2017A Bond shall first be surrendered to the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar, and in the case of any lost, stolen, or destroyed Series 2017A Bond, there shall be first furnished to the Corporation and the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar evidence of such loss, theft, or destruction satisfactory to them and such indemnity as the Corporation and the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar may require. If any such Series 2017A Bond shall have matured, in lieu of issuing a duplicate Series 2017A Bond, the Corporation may pay the same without surrender thereof. The Corporation and the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar may charge the holder or owner of such Series 2017A Bond their reasonable fees and expenses in this connection.

Registration, Authentication, Transfer, And Exchange Of Series 2017A Section 7. Bonds. So long as any Series 2017A Bonds remain outstanding, the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar shall keep and maintain at its designated office, initially in the city and state specified by the supplemental resolution of the Board of Directors designating and appointing such Paying Agent and Bond Registrar, complete registration books for the Series 2017A Bonds and shall provide for the registration and transfer of Series 2017A Bonds in accordance with the terms of this Resolution. Each Series 2017A Bond shall be authenticated by the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar. Except as may be otherwise provided in Section 2(b) hereof for Series 2017A Bonds registered in Book-Entry Form in the name of the Securities Depository or the Securities Depository Nominee, each Series 2017A Bond shall be transferable only upon the presentation and surrender thereof at the principal office of the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar, duly endorsed for transfer or accompanied by an assignment duly executed by the Registered Holder or his authorized representative. Upon receipt of any such Series 2017A Bond, duly endorsed for transfer or accompanied by any assignment for transfer, the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar shall transfer such Series 2017A Bond within a period of three days by reissuing such Series 2017A Bond, duly executed by the Corporation and authenticated by the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar, and delivering the same to the new Registered Holder thereof forthwith.

The Paying Agent and Bond Registrar shall not be required to transfer or exchange any Series 2017A Bond (a) during any period beginning five days before the selection by the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar of Series 2017A Bonds to be redeemed before maturity and ending on the date of mailing of notice of any such redemption or (b) if such Series 2017A Bond has been selected or called for redemption in whole or in part.

Except as may be otherwise provided in Section 2(b) hereof for Series 2017A Bonds registered in Book-Entry Form in the name of the Securities Depository or the Securities Depository Nominee, each Series 2017A Bond shall be exchangeable upon the presentation and surrender thereof at the designated office of the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar for a Series 2017A Bond or Series 2017A Bonds of the same maturity, in the denomination of \$5,000 or an integral multiple thereof, in an aggregate principal amount or amounts equal to the unpaid principal amount of the Series 2017A Bond or Series 2017A Bonds presented for exchange. The Paying Agent and Bond Registrar shall and is hereby authorized to authenticate and deliver Series 2017A Bonds delivered in exchange for surrendered Series 2017A Bonds in accordance herewith. Each Series 2017A Bond delivered in exchange for a surrendered Series 2017A Bond shall constitute an original contractual obligation of the Corporation and shall be entitled to the benefits and security of this Resolution to the same extent as the Series 2017A Bond or Series 2017A Bonds in lieu of which any Series 2017A Bond is delivered in exchange. Any Series 2017A Bonds surrendered for exchange shall be cancelled by the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar and the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar shall maintain a complete record of all exchanges, transfers and cancellations of Series 2017A Bonds and shall make a report thereof to the Corporation on not less than an annual basis.

Except as may be otherwise provided in Section 2(b) hereof for Series 2017A Bonds registered in Book-Entry Form in the name of the Securities Depository or the Securities

Depository Nominee, no service charge or other transfer fee shall be charged to any Bondholder in connection with any transfer or exchange of a Series 2017A Bond. However, the Registered Holder of any Series 2017A Bond may be required to pay an amount equal to any tax or other governmental charge, if any, that may be imposed in connection with the transfer or exchange of any Series 2017A Bond.

Section 8. Destruction of Series 2017A Bonds. Whenever any outstanding Series 2017A Bond shall be delivered to the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar for cancellation thereof pursuant to this Resolution, upon payment of the principal amount or interest represented thereby or for replacement or exchange, such Series 2017A Bonds, following such replacement or exchange, shall be promptly cancelled and destroyed by the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar and counterparts of a certificate of destruction evidencing such destruction shall be furnished by the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar to the Corporation.

All Series 2017A Bonds which have been redeemed shall not be reissued but shall be cancelled and destroyed by the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar in accordance with this Section 8.

Section 9. Appointment And Duties Of Paying Agent And Bond Registrar. The Corporation's President is hereby authorized and directed to select a Paying Agent and Bond Registrar, which selection will be affirmed by the Board of Education by a supplemental resolution designating and appointing such entity as the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar for the Series 2017A Bonds.. The Paying Agent and Bond Registrar shall maintain a complete and current record of each Series 2017A Bond issued, the name and address of each Registered Holder of any Series 2017A Bonds, and such additional information as may be required for compliance with applicable laws and regulations. The Paying Agent and Bond Registrar will also make all payments of interest on the Series 2017A Bonds and pay principal on the Series 2017A Bonds as herein provided.

The recitals of fact herein and in the Series 2017A Bonds contained shall be taken as the statements of the Corporation and the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar assumes no responsibility for the correctness of the same. The Paying Agent and Bond Registrar makes no representations as to the validity or sufficiency of this Resolution or of any Series 2017A Bonds issued hereunder or in respect of the security afforded by this Resolution, and the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar shall not incur any responsibility in respect thereof. The Corporation shall, however, be responsible for its representations contained in the Series 2017A Bonds. The Paying Agent and Bond Registrar shall not be under any responsibility or duty with respect to the issuance of the Series 2017A Bonds for value or the application of the proceeds thereof or the application of any moneys paid to the Corporation. The Paying Agent and Bond Registrar shall be under no obligation or duty to perform any act which would involve it in expense or liability or to institute or defend any suit in respect hereof, or to advance any of its own moneys, unless properly indemnified. The Paying Agent and Bond Registrar shall be protected in acting upon any notice, resolution, request, consent, order, certificate, report, opinion, bond, or other paper or document reasonably believed by it to be genuine, and to have been signed or presented by the

proper party or parties. The Paying Agent and Bond Registrar may consult with counsel, and the opinion of such counsel shall be full and complete authorization and protection in respect of any action taken or suffered by it hereunder in good faith and in accordance therewith. Whenever the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar shall deem it necessary or desirable that a matter be proved or established before taking or suffering any action hereunder, including payment of moneys out of any fund, such matter (unless other evidence in respect thereof be herein specifically prescribed) may be deemed to be conclusively proved and established by a certificate signed by an authorized officer of the Corporation and such certificate shall be full warrant for any action taken or suffered in good faith under the provisions of this Resolution upon the faith thereof, but in its discretion the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar may in lieu thereof accept other evidence of such fact or matter or may require such further or additional evidences as to it may seem reasonable. Except as otherwise expressly provided herein, any request, order, notice, or other direction required or permitted to be furnished pursuant to any provision hereof by the Corporation to the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar shall be sufficiently executed if executed in the Corporation's name by its President, Secretary, or Treasurer. The Paying Agent and Bond Registrar may execute any of its trusts or powers and perform any of its duties under this Resolution by or through attorneys, agents or employees.

The Corporation shall pay to the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar from time to time reasonable compensation for all services rendered under this Resolution, and also all reasonable expenses, charges, counsel fees, and other disbursements, including those of its attorneys, agents, and employees, incurred in and about the performance of their powers and duties under this Resolution. The Corporation further agrees to indemnify and hold the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar harmless against any losses, claims, damages, fines, penalties, expenses (including reasonable attorneys' fees and expenses), and liabilities that the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar may incur in the exercise and performance of its powers and duties hereunder, and which are not due to its negligence or willful misconduct. This indemnification shall survive the termination of this Resolution.

The Paying Agent and Bond Registrar may become the owner of any Series 2017A Bonds, with the same rights it would have if it were not the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar. The Paying Agent and Bond Registrar and any other fiduciary may act as depository for, or permit any of its officers or directors to act as a member of, or in any other capacity with respect to, any committee formed to protect the rights of Bondholders or to effect or aid in any reorganization growing out of the enforcement of the Series 2017A Bonds or this Resolution, whether or not any such committee shall represent the holders of a majority in principal amount of the Series 2017A Bonds then outstanding.

Any entity into which the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar may be merged or converted or with which it may be consolidated or any entity resulting from any merger, conversion, or consolidation to which it shall be a party or any entity to which the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar may sell or transfer all or substantially all of its banking and corporate trust business, provided such entity shall be authorized by law to perform all the duties imposed upon it by this Resolution, shall be the successor to the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar without the execution

or filing of any paper or the performance of any further act, anything herein to the contrary notwithstanding.

Section 10. Lease Of Projects; Funds. Upon the issuance of the Series 2017A Bonds, the Projects located on the sites in the Fayette County School District described in Appendix A to the Contract of Lease and Rent hereinafter described shall for the purpose of this Resolution be leased, rented, and occupied as a revenue-producing undertaking on a rental year basis commencing as of June 1st of each year and ending on each succeeding last day of May, and the revenues from such lease, rental and occupancy, including specifically the revenues from the Contract of Lease and Rent with the Board of Education hereinafter described, shall be set aside and held apart from all other funds of the Corporation and shall be apportioned, as follows:

(a) There is hereby created an account to be known as the Sinking Fund, into which there shall be paid and set aside all or such portion of the revenues from the Projects (subject to the prior and superior pledge securing payments of interest on and principal of the unrefunded Series 2011A Bonds maturing on and before June 1, 2021) as will be sufficient to pay the interest on and principal of the Series 2017A Bonds as the same are scheduled to become due. All sums received as accrued interest in the issuance of the Series 2017A Bonds shall be paid into the Sinking Fund. It is hereby determined that the amount to be annually set aside from the revenues as aforesaid and paid into the Sinking Fund during each rental year for the purpose of paying the interest on and principal of the Series 2017A Bonds shall be the sum required to pay the interest coming due on the Series 2017A Bonds on December 1st of such rental year, together with the Series 2017A Bonds maturing on June 1st in the next ensuing rental year plus the interest coming due on said date, based upon the interest rate or rates applicable to the Series 2017A Bonds.

The amount by which any such payment into the Sinking Fund in any rental year may exceed the aggregate amount of interest on and principal of the Series 2017A Bonds may be held therein as a reserve for subsequent annual interest and principal requirements. No further payments need to be made into the Sinking Fund whenever and so long as such amount of the Series 2017A Bonds payable therefrom shall have been retired such that the amount then held in the Sinking Fund is equal to the entire amount required to accomplish retirement of all of the Series 2017A Bonds then remaining outstanding and to pay all interest to accrue thereon, and including the amount of any additional interest incident to redemption, in the event it is desired that any of said outstanding Series 2017A Bonds be redeemed before stated maturities as herein provided.

If, in any year, the Corporation shall, for any reason, fail to pay into the Sinking Fund the full amount above stipulated, then an amount equivalent to such deficiency shall be set apart and paid into the Sinking Fund from the first available revenues of the Projects for the following year or years and the same shall be in addition to the amount otherwise herein provided to be so set apart and paid during such succeeding year or years.

All moneys held in the Sinking Fund, as aforesaid, shall be deposited with the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar, or any successor thereto, and to the extent that such moneys shall

cause deposits of the Corporation in said bank to exceed the amount insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation or any agency thereof, such deposits shall be continuously secured by a valid pledge of bonds or notes of the United States Government having at all times an equivalent market value, or shall at the direction of the Board of Education, acting through the Board of Education's Director of Financial Services or Treasurer, be invested:

- (i) in direct obligations of the United States;
- (ii) in obligations fully guaranteed as to both principal and interest by the United States, having a maturity date before the date when the sums invested will be needed for meeting interest and principal payments;
- (iii) money market funds composed of obligations described in (i) or (ii) above and rated at least AAA (or the equivalent thereof) by Moody's Investors Service, Inc., or Standard & Poor's Ratings Services;
- (iv) in bank time deposits on an interest-bearing basis, evidenced by certificates of time deposit (issued in the name of the Sinking Fund and delivered into the custody of the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar), secured at all times by a valid pledge on the part of the issuer of said certificates of time deposit of obligations described in (i) or (ii) above having at all times during the continuance of each certificate a current market value (exclusive of accrued interest) at least equal to the full amount of such certificate. The custody of such obligations, whether actual or constructive, shall be in a financial institution other than the issuer of the certificate of time deposit in question. All such certificates of time deposit shall be issued so that the same may be reconverted into cash and deposited in the Sinking Fund as and when required to pay maturing principal and interest payments; or
- **(v)** in such other investments as may be authorized by law including those authorized by KRS 66.480, which specifically include, without limitation, certain collateralized repurchase agreements and forward purchase agreements.

All income from the investment of the Sinking Fund or any portion thereof shall be deposited as received into the Sinking Fund and constitute a part thereof, and to the extent thereof may be used as a credit to the then, or any future, deposit required to be made hereunder by the Corporation into the Sinking Fund.

The annual rental payments so required shall be made in semiannual installments on or before the 20th day of May and November of the respective rental years, the first such payment to be made on or before May 20, 2018. If the Board of Education fails to make a rental payment when due, not less than three days before the next interest due date the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar shall notify the Kentucky Department of Education of such failure.

The Sinking Fund shall be used solely and only and is hereby pledged for the purpose of paying interest on and principal of the Series 2017A Bonds as the same become due.

(b) Out of the balance of the revenue remaining after the payments into the Sinking Fund described above, there shall be set aside into a Maintenance Fund whatever amount may be necessary and is not otherwise provided for the proper maintenance of the Projects and to continuously insure the Projects against loss or damage by fire, lightning, windstorm or other calamity, in the amount of their full insurable value.

Such insurance shall be for the use and benefit of the holder or holders of any Series 2017A Bond or Series 2017A Bonds, it being the Corporation's intention to provide that insurance shall be carried which shall be at all times equal to at least the full insurable value of the Projects.

Section 11. Contract Of Lease And Rent; Participation Agreement. The Corporation hereby covenants and agrees with the holder or holders of the Series 2017A Bonds that it will faithfully and punctually perform all duties with reference to the Projects required by the Constitution and laws of the Commonwealth, including the making of reasonable and sufficient rentals for services rendered thereby, and will segregate said revenues and make application thereof to the respective funds created by this Resolution. The Corporation and its Board of Directors further irrevocably covenant, bind, and obligate themselves to perform all duties imposed upon them by the Constitution and Statutes of the Commonwealth in relation to maintaining the Projects. It is the Corporation's declared intention to continue to lease the Projects to the Board of Education for an extended period of years, as provided in the Board of Education Resolution, along with the proposed Contract of Lease and Rent, appended thereto, together with the form of this Resolution, have been previously submitted to the Corporation's Board of Directors. The Board of Education Resolution and the Contract of Lease and Rent, in substantially the form so submitted, are hereby accepted, approved, and made a part hereof; and either the President or the Vice President is hereby authorized to execute the Contract of Lease and Rent for and on behalf of the Corporation. The Corporation further binds and obligates itself not to sell, mortgage, or in any manner dispose of the Projects, including any and all additions that may be made thereto, except as specifically permitted and provided by this Resolution, until all the Series 2017A Bonds shall have been paid in full, both as to principal and interest. The Corporation further covenants and agrees with the holders of the Series 2017A Bonds to maintain the Projects in good condition and to charge and collect rents for services rendered thereby so that the gross revenues will be sufficient at all times to provide for the payment of the interest on and the principal of the Series 2017A Bonds, as and when they mature, and to pay the maintenance cost of the Projects, including the cost of insurance, as hereinabove provided.

The Contract of Lease and Rent reserves to the Board of Education the right and option to prepay rent and thereby purchase from the Corporation any of the respective Projects and to obtain a reconveyance thereof by the Corporation to the Board of Education free and clear of all liens and encumbrances provided by KRS 162.200 and herein recognized, upon the condition that a sum sufficient to retire a commensurate amount of Series 2017A Bonds then outstanding is paid in full, subject, however, to any applicable restrictions related to the unrefunded Series 2011A Bonds and any applicable restrictions that may hereafter be provided in the issuance of school building revenue bonds for properties constituting the Projects.

The Corporation acknowledges that, as set out in the preamble hereof, the Commission has agreed to provide financial assistance to the Board of Education through the payment of an annual amount equal to a portion of the principal and interest requirements of the Series 2017A Bonds, as evidenced by the Participation Agreement, such amount representing an agreed portion of the cost of the Projects, all subject to constitutional limits of agencies of the Commonwealth in each biennium requiring that such commitment be subject to renewal (or cancellation) every two years.

Section 12. Statutory Mortgage Lien; Releases And Conveyances. For the further protection of the holders of the Series 2017A Bonds, a statutory mortgage lien upon the Projects is granted and created by KRS 162.200, which lien is hereby recognized and declared to be valid and binding upon the delivery of the Series 2017A Bonds; provided, however, that said statutory mortgage lien is and shall be restricted in its application to the Projects, those portions of the Projects' sites physically occupied thereby, and such easements and rights-of-way for ingress, egress, and the rendering of services thereto as may be necessary for the proper use and maintenance of the same, the right being hereby reserved to erect or construct upon the Projects' sites described in the Contract of Lease and Rent other structures and improvements free and clear of said statutory mortgage lien, even though the same are connected by using as party walls one or more walls of structures which are subject to said mortgage lien, providing the same are capable of use as separate entities in themselves and have their own outside entrances, and providing no part of the costs of said additional structures and improvements are paid from the proceeds of the Series 2017A Bonds or any parity bonds; and provided further, that said statutory mortgage lien is subject to the prior and superior statutory mortgage lien securing the unrefunded Series 2011A Bonds.

The Corporation reserves the right (at the request of the Board of Education) to release or convey, with or without consideration, free of the statutory mortgage lien herein created securing the Series 2017A Bonds, such easements, rights-of-way, licenses or other rights over, upon, or beneath the surface of the land herein described as may reasonably be required for roads, utilities, drainage or other public purposes, provided (a) no such release or conveyance shall interfere with the ownership and efficient operation of the Projects (and the actual land on which they are located), (b) ingress to and egress from the Projects shall not thereby be impaired and (c) there shall be no reduction of the rentals otherwise required under the Contract of Lease and Rent.

Any holder of the Series 2017A Bonds, by suit, action, mandamus or other proceedings, either at law or in equity, may enforce and compel the performance of all duties required by the Constitution and the Statutes of the Commonwealth, including the charging and collection of sufficient rents and the segregation of revenues and income and the application thereof, and may by such action compel the performance of all duties imposed in the operation of an adequate school system as provided by law, but only insofar as the failure to perform such duties would or could affect the interests of any holder or holders of any Series 2017A Bond or Series 2017A Bonds.

If there is any default in the payment of the principal of or interest on any of the Series 2017A Bonds, then upon the filing of suit by any holder of the Series 2017A Bonds any court having jurisdiction of the action may appoint a receiver to administer the Projects on behalf of the Corporation or the Board of Education, with power to charge and collect rents sufficient to provide for the payment of any Series 2017A Bonds outstanding, and for the payment of the operating expenses, and to apply the income and revenues in conformity with this Resolution and the provisions of the previously cited laws of Kentucky.

Section 13. No Priorities among Series 2017A Bonds. Series 2017A Bonds authorized to be issued hereunder and from time to time outstanding shall not be entitled to priority one over the other in the application of the revenues of the Projects or with respect to the statutory mortgage lien securing their payment, regardless of the time or times of their issuance, it being the intention that there shall be no priority among such Series 2017A Bonds regardless of the fact that they may be actually issued and delivered at different times.

Section 14. **Additional Series 2017A Bonds**. While any of the Series 2017A Bonds or parity bonds herein permitted to be issued are outstanding, the Corporation shall not issue any additional bonds or incur any other obligations payable from the revenues of the Projects unless the lien and security of such bonds or other obligations on such revenues and on the Projects are made junior and subordinate in all respects to the lien and security of the Series 2017A Bonds; provided, however, that the Corporation hereby reserves the right and privilege of issuing additional bonds from time to time, payable from the income and revenues of the Projects and ranking on a parity with the Series 2017A Bonds, but only if and to the extent the issuance of such additional parity bonds may be necessary to pay the costs, not otherwise available, of completing the reconstruction, renovation, improvement and equipping of the Projects in accordance with plans and specifications approved by the Kentucky Department of Education and by the Board of Education, and filed in the office of the Board of Education; but before any such additional bonds ranking on a parity as aforesaid are issued, the issuance thereof shall be approved by the proper officials of the Kentucky Department of Education as required by law, and a Supplemental Contract of Lease and Rent shall have been entered into, under which the respective annual rental payments during the term of such additional bonds are increased by the amount of the annual interest and principal requirements of such additional bonds, and the interest payment dates for such additional bonds shall be June 1st and December 1st of each year, and the principal maturity dates shall be June 1st in any year when principal is scheduled to be paid.

Section 15. Receipts and Disbursements. So long as any Series 2017A Bonds are outstanding, the person holding the office of Treasurer of the Board of Education shall be and is hereby designated the person to act on the Corporation's behalf in handling receipts, disbursements and accounting in connection with the Series 2017A Bonds and the funds created by this Resolution with regard thereto, and the Treasurer of the Board of Education shall not be required to post any additional fiduciary bond unless the bond required to be posted by him or her by the Board of Education does not include his or her duties and responsibilities with regard to the Series 2017A Bonds. Upon evidence of the existence of such bond the Corporation shall accept the receipt of the Treasurer of the Board of Education for such Series 2017A Bond proceeds.

The Treasurer of the Board of Education shall keep proper books of records and accounts (separate from all other records and accounts), in which complete and correct entries shall be made of all transactions relating to the Series 2017A Bonds and the Projects, and shall furnish on written request of any holder of Series 2017A Bonds, within ninety days after the close of each fiscal year, complete financial statements of the Projects in reasonable detail covering such fiscal year.

Section 16. Series 2017A Bond Sale. It is hereby ordered that a Notice of Series 2017A Bond Sale be published in the newspapers required by law soliciting sealed, competitive bids for the purchase of the Series 2017A Bonds, the same to be received by a designated official of the Kentucky Department of Education or of the Kentucky School Facilities Construction Commission at his or her office in Frankfort, Kentucky, until a specified hour and day, as determined by the President, Treasurer, or Secretary (which time for receipt of bids may be rescheduled by the President or Treasurer, upon the advice of the Financial Advisor, to any date before or on December 31, 2018). The bids theretofore received shall be publicly opened and then considered by the Financial Advisor on the Corporation's behalf, and the best bid or bids, as the case may be, shall be determined by the Financial Advisor, with the approval of an officer of the Board of Education, on the Corporation's behalf. The Corporation reserves the right to increase the total amount of Series 2017A Bonds sold to the best bidder by an amount not exceeding \$3,365,000 (in \$5,000 denominations) or decrease the total amount of the Series 2017A Bonds sold to the best bidder by any amount, if the Corporation determines the total amount of the increase or decrease in the total amount of Series 2017A Bonds sold to be in the best interests of the Board of Education, by increasing or decreasing any of the stipulated principal maturities. The Corporation further reserves the right to adjust principal maturities of the Series 2017A Bonds without changing the total amount of Series 2017A Bonds sold. In the event of any such adjustment, no rebidding or recalculating of the bids submitted will be required or permitted. The price at which such adjusted amount of Series 2017A Bonds will be sold will be at the same price per \$1,000 of Series 2017A Bonds as the price bid per \$1,000 for the aggregate principal amount of Series 2017A Bonds stipulated in the successful bid.

Bidders shall have the option of specifying that all of the principal amount of Series 2017A Bonds maturing on any two or more consecutive dates set out in the schedule in Section 2 hereof may, in lieu of maturing on each of such dates, be Term Bonds scheduled to mature on the latest of such dates and be subject to mandatory sinking fund redemption at par in the manner described in Section 3 hereof on each of the dates and in the principal amounts as set out in said schedule (subject to adjustment as herein provided), except for the principal amount of Series 2017A Bonds scheduled to mature on the date of maturity of the Term Bonds, which shall mature on such date. Bidders may specify one or more of such Term Bonds.

The Notice of Series 2017A Bond Sale shall be published as required by law, not less than seven days and not more than twenty-one days in advance of the date stated therein for the opening and consideration of purchase bids, making reference to the Notice and Official Terms and Conditions of Series 2017A Bond Sale and the Preliminary Official Statement hereinafter described. In the Notice of Series 2017A Bond Sale and the Notice and Official Terms and

Conditions of Series 2017A Bond Sale hereinafter described, bidders shall be instructed, among other things, to offer a specified price in dollars and cents for the Series 2017A Bonds, to specify one or more interest rates of their own choosing in multiples of 1/8 or 1/20 of 1% and not more than one rate equal to or less than 5.5% to be stipulated for a single maturity, to offer a price in dollars and cents for the entire issue of Series 2017A Bonds and not to offer less than 99.0% nor greater than 110.0% of par value.

The Financial Advisor, which will not submit a bid or participate in a syndicate that submits a bid for the Series 2017A Bonds at the public sale thereof, is acting as financial advisor to the Corporation in connection with the issuance of the Series 2017A Bonds and will receive a fee, payable from Series 2017A Bond proceeds, for its services as Financial Advisor.

Upon the occasion of the receipt of bids, and after examination and recommendations by the Financial Advisor, the Financial Advisor, on behalf of and as agent of the Corporation, is hereby authorized to, and the Financial Advisor shall, establish the rates of interest on and the total amount and principal maturities and mandatory sinking fund installments, if any, of the Series 2017A Bonds by completion and execution of the acceptance on the Official Bid Form of the successful bidder or bidders, a copy of which document shall be filed in the official records of the Corporation and the Board of Education, provided that the net average interest rate on the Series 2017A Bonds shall not exceed 5.5% per annum.

If three or more bids for the Series 2017A Bonds are received as a result of the competitive sale, the successful purchaser will be required to certify on or before the issue date the reasonably expected initial offering price to the public as of the Sale Date for each Maturity of the Series 2017A Bonds which prices are the prices for each Maturity of the Series 2017A Bonds used by the successful purchaser in formulating its bid to purchase the Series 2017A Bonds.

If less than three bids for the Series 2017A Bonds are received as a result of the competitive sale, the successful purchaser, by submitting a bid pursuant to the published Notice of Sale, shall be deemed to have agreed in writing that the purchaser will certify on or before the issue date (and provide reasonable supporting documentation for such certification, such as a copy of the pricing wire or equivalent communication) for each Maturity of the Series 2017A Bonds (i) the first price at which at least 10% of each Maturity of the Series 2017A Bonds was sold to the Public, or (ii) that the purchaser will neither offer nor sell any of the Series 2017A Bonds of each Maturity to any person at a price that is higher than the initial offering price for such Maturity during the Holding Period for such Maturity.

Bids will not be subject to cancellation or withdrawal by the bidder in the event that three bids are not received and the Corporation determines to apply the hold-the-offering-price rule.

A Notice of Series 2017A Bond Sale having been prepared in advance by Stoll Keenon Ogden PLLC, Bond Counsel, and having been examined and found to conform to the above conditions, said document is hereby approved and shall be signed by the Corporation's President, Treasurer, or Secretary and its use in advertising the Series 2017A Bond sale is approved and authorized, subject to such modifications in accordance with the provisions and intent of this

Resolution as may be determined by the Financial Advisor and approved by the officer of the Corporation executing the document, and shall be executed by the Corporation's President, Treasurer, or Secretary and furnished to the interested bidders who request it.

A Notice and Official Terms and Conditions of Series 2017A Bond Sale having also been prepared in advance, in order to give a more complete description of the Series 2017A Bonds and specific instructions (including conditions not recited herein) calculated to bring about uniformity in the bidding, and containing the Official Bid Form, and the document having been examined by the Board of Directors, is hereby approved and authorized and shall be executed by the Corporation's President, Treasurer, or Secretary and furnished to interested bidders who may request it.

In addition to the foregoing, on the recommendation of the Financial Advisor bids may be taken or submitted electronically (provided all electronic proposals shall be deemed to incorporate in substance the provisions of the Official Bid Form). Any bid transmitted electronically shall be submitted through BIDCOMP/PARITY® and no other provider of electronic bidding services will be accepted. Bidders submitting an electronic proposal must fulfill any requirements of the bidding service provider over and above the requirements of the Corporation set forth in the Notice and Official Terms and Conditions of Series 2017A Bond Sale. Electronic bidding for the Series 2017A Bonds shall be made available to bidders solely as a courtesy by the Corporation. The Corporation shall assume no responsibility or liability for bids submitted through the electronic bidding service provider. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing disclaimers, the Corporation does not assume responsibility for any communications or negotiations between bidders and the electronic bidding service provider, or for any failure of the provider to accurately or timely submit any electronic proposal. Any electronic proposal shall be deemed to incorporate all of the provisions of the Official Bid Form and the Notice and Official Terms and Conditions of Series 2017A Bond Sale. Each bidder shall be solely responsible for making necessary arrangements to access the electronic bidding service provider for purposes of submitting such bidder's bid in a timely manner and in compliance with the Corporation's requirements. The Corporation shall have no duty or obligation to provide or assure such access to any bidder. The Corporation shall not be responsible for proper operation of, or have any liability for, any delays or interruptions of, or any damages caused by, the provider's service. The Corporation shall use the provider's service solely as a communication mechanism, and not as the Corporation's agent, to conduct the electronic bidding for the Series 2017A Bonds. If any provision in the Notice and Official Terms and Conditions of Series 2017A Bond Sale (herein approved) conflicts with information provided by the electronic bidding service provider, the Notice and Official Terms and Conditions of Series 2017A Bond Sale shall control.

In addition, in connection with the Series 2017A Bond sale the Corporation and the Board of Education have caused to be prepared a Preliminary Official Statement. The Preliminary Official Statement and the use thereof by the Corporation in offering and selling the Series 2017A Bonds, with such modifications in accordance with the provisions and intent of this Resolution as may be recommended by the Financial Advisor and approved by an officer of the Corporation, is hereby expressly approved, the Corporation, through certain of its officials and employees,

having reviewed the Preliminary Official Statement and having found the factual statements and the data therein to be accurate. The Preliminary Official Statement shall be supplemented following sale of the Series 2017A Bonds, and the Corporation's President is authorized to approve and sign such supplemented or final Official Statement on the Corporation's behalf, which is authorized for distribution in connection with the sale of the Series 2017A Bonds. The Preliminary Official Statement is in a form "deemed final" by the Corporation for purposes of SEC Rule 15c2-12(b)(1) but, as aforesaid, is subject to supplementation and completion following the sale of the Series 2017A Bonds. The Corporation's President, Treasurer, or Secretary is also hereby authorized and directed, on the recommendation of the Financial Advisor, to cause the Notice and Official Terms and Conditions of Series 2017A Bond Sale (including the Official Bid Form) and the Preliminary Official Statement to be posted on the Internet and through one or more nationally recognized municipal market information service providers. The electronic or physical distribution of the Notice and Official Terms and Conditions of Series 2017A Bond Sale (including the Official Bid Form) and the Preliminary Official Statement as herein provided is hereby ratified, authorized, and approved. If any provision in the Notice and Official Terms and Conditions of Series 2017A Bond Sale, herein approved, conflicts with information provided by an electronic information service provider, the Notice and Official Terms and Conditions of Series 2017A Bond Sale as herein approved shall control.

The Corporation's President and other officers, and each of them, together with the Financial Advisor, are further authorized to make such modifications to documents, including the provisions of this Resolution that are not in conflict with other provisions hereof and are necessary or desirable in connection with any rescheduling of the date of sale of the Series 2017A Bonds as provided in the first paragraph of this Section 16, and to enter into and to execute on the Corporation's behalf any and all certificates, opinions, instruments, and documents necessary or desirable, upon the advice of counsel, to effectuate the sale and issuance of the Series 2017A Bonds and the investment of the proceeds thereof.

If the Series 2017A Bonds are sold pursuant to this Section 16 during calendar year 2018, the Corporation may designate the Series 2017A Bonds as "Fayette County School District Finance Corporation School Building Refunding Revenue Bonds, Series 2018A" or a similar designation as may be appropriate given any other bonds of the Corporation that have been authorized or issued by the Corporation during calendar year 2018.

Section 17. Disposition Of Proceeds Of The Series 2017A Bonds; Advance Refunding And Redemption Of The Refunded Bonds. When the Series 2017A Bonds are sold and delivered, from the amount received from the purchaser there shall be paid, according to the written direction of the Corporation's President or Treasurer (which direction may include the establishment of a special, temporary trust account for the purpose), all expenses incident to the authorization, sale, and delivery of the Series 2017A Bonds, including the fee of the Financial Advisor, fees and expenses of counsel and the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar, rating service charges, refunding and redemption expenses, and the like.

The proceeds of the Bonds to be applied to the advance refunding of the Refunded Bonds shall be deposited with the Escrow Agent, in the Escrow Fund to be held, invested and paid out in accordance with an Escrow Agreement, which is hereby authorized and approved in such form as shall be approved and executed by the Corporation's President or Treasurer, for the purposes of (a) paying interest on the Refunded Bonds due on June 1, 2018, December 1, 2018, June 1, 2019, December 1, 2019, June 1, 2020, December 1, 2020 and June 1, 2021; (b) paying principal of the Refunded Bonds when due on June 1, 2018, June 1, 2019, June 1, 2020, and June 1, 2021; and (c) redeeming on June 1, 2021 all Refunded Bonds maturing on and after June 1, 2022 at 100% of par. Sums in the Escrow Fund shall be immediately invested in direct obligations of the United States Government, including without limitation SLGS, which shall be scheduled to mature and pay interest at such time and in such amounts as will accomplish the aforesaid payment and advance refunding objectives. The Escrow Agent may receive a reasonable fee for custodial and administrative services as Escrow Agent. The Corporation's President, Secretary, and Treasurer, and each of them, or any of their respective designees, are hereby authorized to act on the Corporation's behalf in obtaining commitments for the purchase of such United States obligations, including the filing of subscriptions for SLGS. The Corporation's President, the Secretary, or the Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to execute the Escrow Agreement on the Corporation's behalf in such form as she or he may approve, upon the advice of the Financial Advisor.

The balance of the Series 2017A Bond proceeds, if any, shall be deposited in the Sinking Fund.

The Corporation hereby authorizes and directs the Corporation's President, Secretary, or Treasurer to take any and all action necessary or desirable to cause and to carry out the call for redemption of the Refunded Bonds at a price of 100% of par value and to certify the defeasance of the pledge and lien securing the Refunded Bonds.

The Corporation acknowledges and approves the provisions of the Board of Education Resolution approving the Contract of Lease and Rent and taking related action.

Section 18. Unclaimed Moneys. If, after five years (a) from the date of the final maturity of the Series 2017A Bonds, or (b) from such date as all Series 2017A Bonds shall have been duly called for redemption and the amount necessary to pay the Series 2017A Bonds, together with all interest accrued thereon, shall have been deposited to the Sinking Fund, as provided in this Resolution, whichever date is the earlier, there shall remain in the possession of the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar unclaimed moneys deposited to the Sinking Fund for the payment of the Series 2017A Bonds, then and in that event all right, title, and interest of the respective Registered Holders for which said deposits were so made shall cease, determine, and become void, and the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar shall upon the written request of the Board of Education turn over all such unclaimed deposits or investments constituting the entire balance of the Sinking Fund to the Board of Education.

Section 19. Concurrence In Employment Agreements. The Board of Directors hereby concurs in the selection and designation of Financial Advisor, in connection with the issuance and sale of the Series 2017A Bonds, and further concurs in the selection and designation of Bond Counsel, the compensation of them to be paid solely from the proceeds of the Series 2017A Bonds. All actions previously taken by the officers and officials of the Corporation and the Board of Education with respect to such appointments are approved, ratified, and confirmed. The Financial Advisor shall be paid strictly in accordance with the limitations established in the fee schedule for services and expenses of financial advisors set forth in the regulations of the Kentucky Department of Education.

Section 20. Enforcement And Remedies. Any Registered Holder may either at law or in equity, by suit, action, mandamus, or other proceedings, enforce and compel performance by the Corporation and its officers and agents of all duties and obligations imposed or required by law or this Resolution in connection with the Projects, including the making and collecting of sufficient rents and the application thereof.

If there be any default in the payment of the principal of or interest on any of the Series 2017A Bonds then, upon the filing of suit by any holder of the Series 2017A Bonds, any court having jurisdiction of the action may appoint a receiver to administer the Projects on the Corporation's behalf with power to charge and collect rents sufficient to provide for the payment of the Series 2017A Bonds and to apply the income and revenues in conformity with this Resolution and the provisions of KRS Chapter 162.

Section 21. Tax Covenants And Representations. The Corporation further certifies and covenants to and for the benefit of the Bondholders that so long as any of the Series 2017A Bonds remain outstanding, moneys on deposit in any fund or account in connection with the Series 2017A Bonds, whether or not such moneys were derived from the proceeds of the sale of the Series 2017A Bonds or from any other sources, will not be invested or used in a manner which will cause the Series 2017A Bonds to be "arbitrage bonds" within the meaning of Code Sections 103(b)(2) and 148, as the same presently exist or may from time to time hereafter be amended, supplemented or revised. The Corporation's President, Treasurer, or Secretary, as the Corporation's officers charged with the responsibility for issuing the Series 2017A Bonds, and each of them, are authorized and directed, for and on the Corporation's behalf, to execute all papers, documents, certificates, and other instruments that may be required for evidencing compliance with federal tax rules, and any representations and certifications contained in such papers, documents, certificates, and other instruments so executed shall be deemed to constitute the Corporation's representations and certifications. For the benefit of the Bondholders and the reliance of Bond Counsel, the Corporation further represents, warrants, agrees, covenants and certifies as follows:

(a) Within the meaning of Code Section 141, and the Income Tax Regulations issued thereunder, over the term of the Series 2017A Bonds (i) less than 10% of the proceeds of the Series 2017A Bonds, if any, will be applied for any private business use, and the payment of the principal of or interest on less than 10% of the amount of the Series 2017A Bonds, if any, will

be secured directly or indirectly by any interest in property used for a private business use, or payments in respect of such property, or will be derived directly or indirectly from payment (whether or not to the Corporation or the Board of Education) in respect of such property; (ii) at least 90% of the proceeds of the Series 2017A Bonds will be applied for a governmental use of the Corporation or the Board of Education; (iii) any private business use of the Projects will be related to such governmental use of the Corporation and the Board of Education and will not be unrelated or disproportionate; and (iv) none of the proceeds of the Series 2017A Bonds will be used, directly or indirectly, to make or finance loans to private persons. It is reasonably expected that over the term of the Series 2017A Bonds (a) the Projects will be available for general public use, in that they will be reasonably available for use by natural persons not engaged in a trade or business on the same basis as any other person or entity, (b) no nongovernmental person will have any special legal entitlement to use the Projects and (c) there will be no direct or indirect payment made with respect to the Projects or the security of the Series 2017A Bonds by any persons or entities other than payment by the general public as described in clause (i) above.

- **(b)** All proceeds of the Series 2017A Bonds will be expended by a date within ninety days from their date of issuance.
- (c) The Series 2017A Bonds are not federally guaranteed within the meaning of Code Section 149(b).
- **(d)** The Corporation will comply with the information reporting requirements of Code Section 149(e).
- **(e)** It is reasonably expected that, during the term of the Series 2017A Bonds, the Projects will not be disposed of; provided, however, should there be any disposition of any personal property constituting a part of the Projects because it is no longer suitable for its governmental purpose, it is reasonably expected that the fair market value of such personal property will not exceed 25% of its cost.
- (f) The weighted average maturity of the Series 2017A Bonds does not exceed 120% of the remaining weighted average useful life of the facilities comprising the Projects.
- **(g)** There are no other bonds or obligations of the Corporation or the Board of Education which are sold or issued at substantially the same time as the Series 2017A Bonds are sold pursuant to a common plan of financing together with the Series 2017A Bonds, or are payable out of substantially the same source of funds (or will have substantially the same claim to be paid out of substantially the same source of funds) as the Series 2017A Bonds.
- **(h)** The Corporation will not use or permit the use of any of the funds provided by the Series 2017A Bonds in such a manner as to, or take or omit to take any action which would, impair the exclusion from gross income for federal income tax purposes of interest on the Series 2017A Bonds. The Corporation shall at all times do and perform all acts and things permitted by law and necessary or desirable in order to assure that interest paid by the Corporation on the

Series 2017A Bonds shall, for the purposes of federal income taxation, be excludable from gross income.

Section 22. Resolution Constitutes Contract. The provisions of this Resolution shall constitute a contract between the Corporation and the Bondholders, and after the issuance of any of the Series 2017A Bonds no material change in the provisions of this Resolution may be made except as herein provided, until all of the Series 2017A Bonds have been paid in full as to both principal and interest or funds sufficient therefor have been duly provided and deposited as set forth in Section 23 hereof.

The Corporation may specifically make any amendment or change herein (a) to evidence the initial designation and appointment or the succession of an institution as Paying Agent and Bond Registrar; (b) to cure any ambiguity or to cure, correct, or supplement any defective or inconsistent provisions contained herein or in any ordinance or other proceedings pertaining hereto; (c) to grant to or confer on the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar for the benefit of the holders of the Series 2017A Bonds any additional rights, remedies, powers, authority, or security which may lawfully be granted or conferred and which are not contrary to or inconsistent with this Resolution as theretofore in effect; (d) to permit the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar to comply with any obligations imposed on it by law; (e) to achieve compliance of this Resolution with any federal tax law, regulation, or ruling; (f) to maintain or improve any rating on the Series 2017A Bonds; or (g) for any other purpose not inconsistent with the terms of this Resolution which shall not impair the security of the Bondholders or otherwise materially adversely affect the rights of the Bondholders.

Section 23. Defeasance. If the Corporation shall pay or cause to be paid, or there shall otherwise be paid to the holders of all Series 2017A Bonds the total principal and interest due or to become due thereon, at the times and in the manner stipulated therein and in this Resolution, then the pledge of this Resolution, and all covenants, agreements and other obligations of the Corporation to the Bondholders, shall thereon cease, terminate and become void and be discharged and satisfied.

The Corporation reserves the right at any time to cause the pledge of the revenues of the Projects and the statutory mortgage lien securing the Series 2017A Bonds, or any portion thereof, to be defeased and released by paying an amount into the Sinking Fund or an escrow fund established for such purpose sufficient, when invested (or sufficient without such investment, as the case may be) in direct obligations of the United States Government, to assure the availability in such escrow fund of an adequate amount (a) to call for redemption and to redeem and retire such Series 2017A Bonds, including principal and interest on the next or any optional redemption date, including all costs and expenses in connection therewith, and to pay all principal and interest falling due on such Series 2017A Bonds to and on said date, or (b) to pay all principal and interest requirements on such Series 2017A Bonds as the same mature, without redemption in advance of maturity, the determination of whether to defease under (a) or (b) or both to be made by the Corporation. Such United States Government obligations shall have maturities that will assure there will be sufficient funds for such purposes. If such defeasance is to be accomplished

pursuant to subpart (a) above, the Corporation shall take all steps necessary to publish notice of the redemption of the Series 2017A Bonds or such portion thereof as herein provided. Upon the proper amount of United States Government obligations being placed in escrow and so pledged, the pledge of revenues securing the Series 2017A Bonds or such portion thereof shall be automatically fully defeased and released without any further action being necessary.

The immediately foregoing provisions are subject to the limitation that no such termination and release of the revenue pledge and the statutory mortgage lien shall be accomplished through the use of any funds or investments which, in the opinion of the Corporation's Bond Counsel, would adversely affect the exclusion of interest on any such Series 2017A Bonds from gross income for federal income tax purposes.

Section 24. Rebate Fund. There is hereby created with the Depository Bank a special account of the Corporation designated the Rebate Fund. Amounts from time to time held in the Rebate Fund, if any, shall be invested in any of the investment obligations described in Section 10 hereof (to the extent practicable), shall not be subject to the lien of this Resolution, shall not constitute a part of the trust estate held for the benefit of the holders of the Series 2017A Bonds and shall be dedicated to the United States of America to the extent of any obligation on the Corporation's part to rebate to the United States Cumulative Excess Earnings.

Within five days after the end of each Computation Period and within five days after the payment in full of all outstanding Series 2017A Bonds, the Corporation shall calculate the amount of Cumulative Excess Earnings as of the end of that Computation Period or the date of such payment, and shall also determine the amount then on deposit in the Rebate Fund. If the amount then on deposit in the Rebate Fund is in excess of the Cumulative Excess Earnings, the Corporation shall forthwith deposit that excess amount in the Sinking Fund. If the amount then on deposit in the Rebate Fund is less than the Cumulative Excess Earnings, the Corporation shall within five days deposit in the Rebate Fund an amount sufficient to cause the Rebate Fund to contain an amount equal to the Cumulative Excess Earnings. Within thirty days after the end of the fifth anniversary date of the issuance of the Series 2017A Bonds and every such fifth anniversary date thereafter, the Corporation shall pay to the United States in accordance with Code Section 148(f) from the moneys then on deposit in the Rebate Fund an amount equal to 90% (or such greater percentage not in excess of 100% as the Corporation may direct) of the Cumulative Excess Earnings as of the end of such fifth anniversary date. Within sixty days after the payment in full of all outstanding Series 2017A Bonds, the Corporation shall pay to the United States in accordance with Code Section 148(f) from the moneys then on deposit in the Rebate Fund an amount equal to 100% of the Cumulative Excess Earnings as of the date of such payment and any moneys remaining in the Rebate Fund following such payment shall be paid to the Sinking Fund.

Section 25. Severability. If any section, paragraph, clause, or provision of this Resolution shall be held to be invalid, the invalidity of such section, paragraph, clause, or provision shall not affect any of the remaining provisions of this Resolution.

Section 26. Repeal of Inconsistent Provisions. All resolutions or parts thereof in conflict with the provisions of this Resolution are, to the extent of any such conflict, hereby repealed.

Section 27. Holidays. If the date for making any payment or the last date for performance of any act or the exercising of any right, as provided in this Resolution, is not a business day for the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar, such payment may be made or act performed or right exercised on the next succeeding business day with the same force and effect as if done on the date stipulated in this Resolution and no interest shall accrue for the period after such stipulated date.

Section 28. When Resolution Effective. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption.

Section 29. Rules Of Construction. The singular form of any word used herein, including the terms defined in EXHIBIT A attached hereto, shall include the plural, and vice versa. The use herein of a word of any gender shall include correlative words of all genders. Unless otherwise specified, (a) the word "including" means "including without limitation"; (b) the word 'or" means "and/or"; (c) the word "any" means "any and all"; (d) the word "all" means "any and all"; (e) the word "each" means "each and every"; and (e) the word "every" means "each and every". Unless otherwise specified, references to articles, sections, subsections, and other subdivisions of this Resolution are to the designated articles, sections, subsections, and other subdivisions of this Resolution as originally executed. The words "hereof," "herein," "hereunder," and words of similar import refer to this Resolution as a whole. The captions or headings in this Resolution are for convenience only and in no way define, limit, or describe the scope or intent of any provisions, articles, sections, or subsections of this Resolution. All accounting terms not otherwise defined herein have the meanings assigned to them in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles. **EXHIBITS A** and **B** attached hereto are hereby incorporated by reference into this Resolution and constitute a part hereof.

Section 30. Captions. The captions and headings appearing in this Resolution, as well as the Table of Contents, are for convenience of reference only and in no way define, limit or describe the scope of any sections or provisions of this Resolution.

DEFINITIONS

In addition to the words and terms elsewhere defined in this Resolution, the following words and terms as used in this Resolution shall have the following meanings unless the context or use indicates another or different meaning or intent:

"Agreed Participation" has the meaning provided in the Participation Agreement.

"Book-Entry Form" means a form or system, as applicable, under which (i) the ownership of beneficial interests in Series 2017A Bonds and principal and interest payments thereon may be transferred only through a book entry and (ii) physical Series 2017A Bond certificates in fully registered form are registered only in the name of a Securities Depository or its nominee as Registered Holder, with the physical Series 2017A Bond certificates held in the custody of a Securities Depository.

"Board of Education" means Board of Education of Fayette County, Kentucky.

"Board of Education Resolution" means the Resolution adopted by the Board of Education on December 18, 2017 regarding the Series 2017A Bonds.

"Bond Counsel" means Stoll Keenon Ogden PLLC or any national recognized municipal bond counsel acceptable to the Corporation and the Board of Education.

"Bondholder" or "Holder of Series 2017A Bonds" refers to the Registered Holder of the Series 2017A Bonds.

"Code" means the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended from time to time, including, when appropriate, the statutory predecessor thereof, or any applicable corresponding provisions of any future laws of the United States of America relating to federal income taxation, and except as otherwise provided herein or required by the context hereof, includes interpretations thereof contained or set forth in the applicable Treasury Regulations, the applicable rulings of the Internal Revenue Service (including published Revenue Rulings and private letter rulings), and applicable court decisions).

"Commission" means the Kentucky School Facilities Construction Commission.

"Commonwealth" means Commonwealth of Kentucky.

"Computation Period" means, with respect to the Series 2017A Bonds, the period of time over which Excess Earnings are required to be computed under Code Section 148(f) and related Treasury Regulations.

"Contract of Lease and Rent" means the Contract of Lease and Rent to be entered into by and between the Corporation and the Board of Education in connection with the Series 2017A Bonds.

"Corporation" means Fayette County School District Finance Corporation, a Kentucky nonprofit corporation created pursuant to KRS 162.385, KRS 58.180, and KRS 273.161 through 273.390 and acting as the agency, instrumentality, and constituted authority of the Board of Education.

"Cumulative Excess Earnings" means the amount of all Excess Earnings earned from the date of original delivery of the Series 2017A Bonds through the end of the relevant computation date, less the amount of any Excess Earnings paid to the United States pursuant to Section 24 herein.

"Depository Bank" means such bank or banks as the Corporation's President, Treasurer, or Secretary may designate from time to time for the deposit of moneys in the funds and accounts described herein.

"Escrow Agent" means [The Bank of New York Mellon Trust Company, N.A.], [Dallas], [Texas].

"Escrow Agreement" means the Escrow Agreement to be entered into by and between the Corporation and the Escrow Agent related to the defeasance, redemption, payment, and discharge of the Refunded Bonds.

"Escrow Fund" means the fund to be created by the Corporation and the Escrow Agent for the deposit and investment of the proceeds of the Series 2017A Bonds to be used to defease, redeem, pay, and discharge the Refunded Bonds pursuant to the Escrow Agreement.

"Excess Earnings" means an amount equal to the sum of (i) plus (ii) where:

- (i) is the excess of:
 - (1) the aggregate amount earned on all nonpurpose investments in which gross proceeds of the Series 2017A Bonds are invested (other than investments attributable to an excess described in this clause (i)); over
 - (2) the amount which would have been earned if such nonpurpose investments (other than amounts attributable to an excess described in this cause (i)) were invested at a rate equal to the yield on the Series 2017A Bonds; and
- (ii) is any income attributable to the excess described in clause (i).

The sum of (i) plus (ii) shall be determined in accordance with Code Section 148(f). As used herein, the terms "gross proceeds," "nonpurpose investments" and "yield" have the meanings assigned to them for purposes of Code Section 148(f).

"Financial Advisor" means J.J.B. Hilliard, W.L. Lyons, LLC in its capacity as the financial advisor to the Corporation with respect to the issuance of the Series 2017A Bonds.

"Holding Period" means, with respect to a Maturity of the Series 2017A Bonds, the period starting on the Sale Date and ending on the earlier of (i) the close of the fifth business day after the Sale Date, or (ii) the date on which the successful purchaser has sold at least 10% of such Maturity to the Public at prices that are no higher than the initial offering price for such Maturity.

"KRS" means the Kentucky Revised Statues in effect as of the date of this Resolution.

"Maturity" means Series 2017A Bonds with the same credit and payment terms. Series 2017A Bonds with different maturity dates, or Series 2017A Bonds with the same maturity date but different stated interest rates, are treated as separate maturities.

"Official Statement" means the final Official Statement of the Corporation setting forth relevant information concerning the Series 2017A Bonds, the Corporation, and the Board of Education.

"Participant" means a member of, or a participant in, a Securities Depository.

"Participation Agreement" means the Participation Agreement to be entered into by and between the Commission and the Board of Education with respect to the payment of debt service for the Series 2017A Bonds.

"Paying Agent and Bond Registrar" means the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar for the Series 2017A Bonds selected by the Corporation's President, which shall be designated and appointed pursuant to a supplemental resolution of the Board of Education.

"Preliminary Official Statement" means the Preliminary Official Statement of the Corporation setting forth relevant information concerning the Series 2017A Bonds, the Corporation, and the Board of Education.

"Projects" means the facilities of the Corporation financed with the a portion of the proceeds of the Series 2011A Bonds, being the reconstruction, renovation, improvement, and equipping of the Clays Mill, Mary Todd, Millcreek, Cardinal Valley, and Breckinridge Elementary Schools in the Fayette County School District, including buildings, additions, structures, fixtures, equipment, furnishings, appurtenances, improvements, and the sites thereof.

"Public" means any person (including an individual, trust, estate, partnership, association, company, or corporation) other than an Underwriter or a related party to an Underwriter. The term "related party" for purposes of this certificate generally means any two or more persons who have greater than 50% common ownership, directly or indirectly.

"Rebate Fund" means the "Fayette County School Building Finance Corporation School Building Refunding Revenue Bonds, Series 2017A Rebate Fund" established by the Corporation with the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar pursuant to Section 24 of this Resolution.

"**Record Date**" means the fifteenth day of the month before a June 1st or December 1st interest payment date for the Series 2017A Bonds.

"**Refunded Bonds**" means the Series 2011A Bonds maturing June 1, 2022 through (and including) June 1, 2031, and having an aggregate principal amount of \$31,035,000.

"**Registered Holder**" means each person in whose name a Series 2017A Bond is registered pursuant to Section 2(b) hereof.

"Resolution" means this Bond Resolution authorizing the sale, issuance, and delivery of the Series 2017A Bonds.

"Sale Date" means the first day on which there is a binding contract in writing for the sale of a Maturity of the Series 2017A Bonds.

"Securities Depository" means any securities depository that is a "clearing corporation" within the meaning of the New York Uniform Commercial Code and a "clearing agency" registered pursuant to the provisions of Section 17A of the Securities Exchange Act, operating and maintaining, with its Participants or otherwise, a Book-Entry System to record ownership of beneficial interests in bonds and bond service charges, and to effect transfers of bonds in Book-Entry Form, and means, initially, The Depository Trust Company (a limited purpose trust company), New York, New York.

"Securities Depository Nominee" means any nominee of a Securities Depository and shall initially mean Cede & Co., New York, New York, as nominee of The Depository Trust Company.

"Securities Exchange Act" means the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, which is codified at 15 U.S.C. § 78a *et seq*.

"Series 2011A Bonds" means the Fayette County School District Finance Corporation School Building Revenue Bonds, Series 2011A, issued on June 14, 2011 in an original aggregate principal amount of \$52,175,000.

"Series 2017A Bonds" means Fayette County School District Finance Corporation School Building Refunding Revenue Bonds, Series 2017A to be issued by the Corporation pursuant to this Resolution in an aggregate principal amount of \$33,690,000 (subject to adjustment as provided herein).

"Sinking Fund" means the "Fayette County School District Finance Corporation School Building Refunding Revenue Bond and Interest Redemption Fund, Series 2017A" established by the Corporation with the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar pursuant to Section 10 of this Resolution.

"SLGS" means book-entry obligations of the United States Treasury-State and Local Government Series.

"**Term Bonds**" has the meaning set forth in Section 3(a) hereof.

"Treasury Department" means the United States Department of the Treasury.

"Treasury Regulations" means regulations of the Treasury Department, including applicable final or temporary regulations and also including regulations issued pursuant to the statutory predecessor of the Code.

"Underwriter" means (i) any person that agrees pursuant to a written contract with the Corporation (or with the lead underwriter to form an underwriting syndicate) to participate in the initial sale of the Series 2017A Bonds to the Public, and (ii) any person that agrees pursuant to a written contract directly or indirectly with a person described in clause (i) of this definition to participate in the initial sale of the Series 2017A Bonds to the Public (including a member of a selling group or a party to a retail distribution agreement participating in the initial sale of the Series 2017A Bonds to the Public).

This Series 2017A Bond is one of a duly authorized issue of Bonds of the Corporation designated "Fayette County School District Finance Corporation School Building Refunding Revenue Bonds, Series 2017A" (the "Series 2017A Bonds"), issued in the original principal amount of \$_______, authorized and issued by the Corporation pursuant to a Resolution duly adopted by its Board of Directors (the "Bond Resolution") for the purpose of providing funds to refund certain of the Corporation's School Building Revenue Bonds, Series 2011A (the "Refunded Bonds"), and to pay related costs, and this Series 2017A Bond has been issued under and in full compliance with the Constitution and statutes of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, including among others Sections 162.120 through 162.300 and 162.385 of the Kentucky Revised Statutes.

Reference is made to the Bond Resolution for the provisions with respect to the nature and extent of the security, the rights, duties, and obligations of the Corporation and the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar and the holders of the Series 2017A Bonds, the terms upon which the Series 2017A Bonds are issued and the terms and conditions upon which the Series 2017A Bonds will be deemed to be paid at or before their scheduled maturity or redemption upon the making of provision for the payment thereof in the manner set forth in the Bond Resolution.

*The Series 2017A Bonds maturing on June 1, 20__, are subject to mandatory sinking fund redemption in part, at the selection of the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar by lot, from moneys in the special fund identified hereinafter on each June 1st, beginning June 1, 20__, at the principal amount thereof plus accrued interest to the redemption date, according to the following schedule of mandatory sinking fund installments:

The Series 2017A Bonds maturing on and after June 1, 2028, are subject to redemption by the Corporation, at its option, before maturity on and after June 1, 2027, in whole or in part at any time or times in any order of maturity (less than all of a single maturity to be selected by lot by the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar) at the redemption price of 100% of the principal amount thereof plus accrued interest to the redemption date. At least thirty days but no more than sixty days before the redemption date of any Series 2017A Bonds, the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar shall cause a notice of redemption to be mailed postage prepaid by first class mail to all registered holders of Series 2017A Bonds to be redeemed in whole or in part at their registered addresses.

Failure to mail any notice or any defect therein in respect of any such Series 2017A Bond shall not affect the validity of the redemption of any other Series 2017A Bond. Such redemption notice shall set forth in detail the redemption provisions.

This Series 2017A Bond and the issue of which it forms a part are payable from and secured by a pledge of the revenues to be derived from leasing certain school building properties (the "Projects"), which revenues are provided to be sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on this Series 2017A Bond and the issue of which it forms a part as and when the same become due and payable and which shall be set aside as a special fund for that purpose created by the Bond Resolution and identified as the "School Building Refunding Revenue Bond and Interest Redemption Fund, Series 2017A"; provided, however, that such revenues are subject to the prior and superior pledge securing certain Series 2011A Bonds which are to be fully paid on June 1, 2021. This Series 2017A Bond and the issue of which it forms a part do not constitute an indebtedness of the Corporation within the meaning of any constitutional or statutory provisions or limitations. This Series 2017A Bond is issued under and pursuant to the Constitution and statutory laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky and its construction will be governed thereby.

This Series 2017A Bond shall be transferable only upon the presentation and surrender hereof at the designated office of the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar, duly endorsed for transfer or accompanied by an assignment duly executed by the Registered Holder or his authorized representative. The Paying Agent and Bond Registrar shall not be required to transfer or exchange this Series 2017A Bond (a) during any period beginning five days before the selection by the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar of Series 2017A Bonds to be redeemed before maturity and ending on the date of mailing of notice of any such redemption or (b) if this Series 2017A Bond has been selected or called for redemption in whole or in part.

Series 2017A Bonds shall be exchangeable upon the presentation and surrender thereof at the designated office of the Paying Agent and Bond Registrar for a Series 2017A Bond or Series 2017A Bonds of the same maturity, and in the denomination of \$5,000 or any integral multiple thereof, in an aggregate principal amount or amounts equal to the unpaid principal amount of the Series 2017A Bond or Series 2017A Bonds presented for exchange. Superintendent Manny Caulk reviewed the structures the district has adopted to provide differentiated supports for schools -- including staffing, professional learning and funding -- to ensure student success.

In 2015, the district established the "partnership zone" and focused additional support to the schools in the Bryan Station High School feeder pattern. In 2017, the district identified "empowerment zone" schools and added instructional support specialists and additional professional learning for four elementary schools. At the high school level, the district has implemented The Academies of Lexington model to transform education, and will soon be looking at a middle school redesign to make changes at that level.

Discussion:

Schuronda Morton and Michael Dailey provided details on the request for proposal process. The district will accept proposals from outside firms or consultants to conduct a comprehensive review of the two schools and make concrete recommendations to "improve and sustain student growth and achievement" The review will look at student demographics, mobility patterns, disaggregated data from multiple assessments, curriculum implementation, and instructional practice. The review will also examine MTSS implementation, strategic allocation of resources, as well as student participation in-school and extracurricular. Additionally, the district would like the audit team to conduct surveys and interviews of students, staff, families, and focus groups with community members to gather input on reimagining the school.

Background/Rationale: The construction of a new high school to be located on 65 acres at 2000 Winchester Road (formerly 1970 Winchester Road) is listed as priority 1a.5 on FCPS's 2013 District Facility Plan. Tate Hill Jacobs Architects produced final Construction Documents for bidding describing the construction of a new building totaling approximately 285,790 SF to serve 1,800 students. The 21st Century high school program was developed during a series of Building Committee meetings attended by FCPS instructional and administrative leadership, and refined in small group meetings where teachers provided direction related to collaborative teaching and project-based subject matter. The program is consistent with recent new high school projects across the nation and provides new building space that functions and supports current FCPS enrollment growth. Bids were received on May 7, 2015 and construction began in June, 2015. The Office of Facility Design & Construction, the design consultants and the local building code officials have reviewed the progress of the work. Changes to the original plans and specifications have been necessary in order to satisfy the requirements described below. Approval of these changes allows the work to be completed. The description and cost of these items are summarized as follows:

Further, no one may serve on the Equity Council Committee who has a conflict of interest as defined by KRS Chapter 45A. Background/Rationale: At the December 4, 2017 Planning Meeting of the Fayette County Board of Education, Darryl Thompson, Equity Officer and David Cozart, Equity Council Chair, shared an overview of the action/decisions of the Equity Council Committee (ECC) to comprehensively amend the ECC Bylaws with changes effective January 1, 2018.

Particularly, Article IV(A). Membership/Composition that drew great attention due to its focus on the future composition of the ECC that recommended language that, "The role of the ECC is to monitor the work of Fayette County Public Schools and access policies and practices established by the Fayette County Board of Education. Therefore, it is not prudent for a majority of the ECC to be employees and/or staff members of FCPS (at all levels of administration and teaching/support staff). With this, there shall be no more than three (3) voting members of the ECC who are employed by FCPS in any manner. This shall prevent a majority vote from FCPS staff alone for any instance in which the ECC has a quorum."

After detailed dialogue, the Board of Education in a 4-1 majority vote charged the District's legal counsel (Shelley Chatefield) to add additional language to the bylaws (item #C, previously proposed language rejected by the ECC as optional language) that precluded active employees of FCPS and/or their spouses from serving on the Equity Council Committee as sitting voting members.

The first read for action/decision on the comprehensive ECC Bylaw edits will take place at the public meeting of the Board on Monday, December 18, and the subsequent second read for action/decision will take place on Monday, January 8, 2018.

ECC BYLAWS

ARTICLE I. MISSION AND THEORY OF ACTION

The mission of the Equity Council Committee is to monitor and analyze equity issues, advise the Fayette County Board of Education and advocate success for ALL students

Theory of Action

If we advocate for equity, diversity, and inclusion for all children and staff, then the measured outcome of success will be equality for ALLII.

ARTICLE II. PURPOSE

The Equity Council Committee (ECC) will review, monitor, and assess policies, practices, and programs, as they relate to equity, in the Fayette County Public Schools. The ECC shall make recommendations to the Fayette County Board of Education regarding:

- policies, practices, and programs, consistent with federal, state and local laws that will enhance student success and assure that all students meet the equity goals established by the Fayette County Board of Education
- provide recommendations through an equity lens regarding learning culture and environment; standards, curriculum, and assessments that are culturally relevant and inclusive to the learning needs of all students and staff
- recommend strategies for removing barriers that may inhibit any student from learning or any teacher from teaching.

We accept this responsibility and commit to full collaboration with the Fayette County Board of Education and the community in accomplishing the equity goals as stated in the District Comprehensive Plan, the Blueprint for Student Success: Achieving Educational Equity and Excellence for All, and the District Strategic Plan.

ARTICLE III. GUIDING PRINCIPLES

The ECC fully supports the district's effort and commitment to provide the means for every child to reach his or her maximum potential and to ensure that every child succeeds.

ARTICLE IV. MEMBERSHIP

A. COMPOSITION

This committee shall reflect diversity. Membership shall comprise both elected community-based and appointed community-based representatives for fostering multi-cultural, ethnic, and professional diversity. Community-based Constituent groups are to strive for diversity in their appointment and election processes.

The ECC shall consist of eleven (11) community-based members. Five of the eleven community-based members are to be appointed by each respective district member of the Fayette County Board of Education; the remaining six (6) community-based members are to be elected by a majority of the ECC (for this purpose, a quorum shall be defined as at least six (6) members of the ECC) of the ECC. All

community—based members, whether elected or appointed, shall have expressed an interest and a commitment to serve, and have a proven history for making a contribution to human rights and equal opportunities, and/or educational equity. (*See Footnotes)

A community-based member should be one who has demonstrated a commitment or contribution to human rights, equal opportunities, and/or educational equity. Upon request, the District Liaison to the ECC will make the list available to the ECC and Fayette County Board of Education when it is necessary to fill a vacancy on the ECC. The District Liaison to the ECC shall also maintain an updated list of current community-based members with sufficient information to allow the Fayette County Board of Education and the ECC to assess areas of need on the Council. The District Liaison to the ECC shall solicit new applicants for appointment and election on an on-going basis.

No actively employed Fayette County Public Schools (FCPS) employee(s), FCPS paraprofessional(s), FCPS substitute(s), or FCPS employee(s) currently on Board-approved leave, nor the relative of any such employee(s) listed above shall serve as a voting member of the Equity Council Committee. Further, no one may serve on the Equity Council Committee who has a conflict of interest as defined by KRS Chapter 45A. The term "relative," as used herein, is defined by FCPS Policies 03.11 and 03.21 and includes "father, mother, brother, sister, spouse, son, daughter, aunt, uncle, son-in-law, and daughter-in-law (including subcategories of in-law, half and step relatives)."

This provision does not apply to any collaborative work of the ECC via ECC subcommittees. (See "ECC Committee Policy")

Optional Composition Language Being Considered:

- a. Leave the by-laws as they are (with no restrictions of FCPS on the ECC). Please note that there is currently no language contained within the original bylaw draft that include FCPS employees, i.e. principals (administrators), teachers, other certified staff, classified staff, nor district staff.
- b.a. The role of the ECC is to monitor the work of Fayette County Public Schools and access policies and practices established by the Fayette County Board fo Education. Therefore, it is not prudent for a majority of the ECC to be employees and/or staff members of FCPS (at all levels of administration and teaching/support staff). With this, there shall be no more than three (3) voting members of the ECC who are employed by FCPS in any manner. This shall prevent a majority vote from FCPS staff alone for any instance in which the ECC has a quorum.
- c. No FCPS employees would be allowed to be on the ECC as voting members; however, in an effort to create capacity for monitoring and assessing equity issues across the district, all stakeholder constituency groups may actively participate in the collaborate work off the ECC via the ECC subcommittees (See EC "Committee Policy").

B. REQUIREMENTS, SOURCE OF APPOINTMENTS FOR MEMBERSHIP

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* The revisions of Article IV. Membership: A. Composition occurred through executive order of the Fayette County Board of Education at its February 27, 2017 Public meeting by a Majority 5-0 vote due to a consistent failure of a quorum of the ECC members to attend both regular and special called meetings. (see attached Executive Summary of the Fayette County Board of Education)

Appointments of Equity Council Committee Community-Based Members:

- Each respective district member of the Fayette County Board of Education shall appoint one
 member to the ECC by the regular meeting in December of even numbered years, or within 30
 days as a vacancy occurs. Appointments shall be made in consideration of the existing diversity of
 the community and the diversity makeup of the ECC. Members shall be permitted to serve their
 complete terms of office even if the Fayette County Board of Education member who appointed
 them leaves office.
- 2. Membership is not transferable, and resignations shall be by written notice to the chairperson. The chairperson shall have the vice-chair facilitate the meeting(s) in her/his absence at all meetings.

Election of Equity Council Committee Community-Based Members

- 1. ECC Community-Based Members shall be elected by the sitting members of the ECC.
- Within the 1st week of October of each odd numbered year, the Office of Equity, School Support, and Community Engagement shall arrange for an advertisement to appear in the Lexington's the largest circular/newspaper, on the FCPS website/homepage, and periodically on the FCPS public educational television channel, along with other social media outlets as deemed appropriate as a community outreach initiative:
 - The advertisement shall fully describe the application process, Including, but not limited
 to -a description of the ECC, aAs a standing committee to the Fayette County Board of
 Education.
 - Funds shall be sufficiently budgeted annually by the District Liaison to the ECC and supported by the Superintendent to support this initiative.
 - Elections shall take place at the regular meeting in NovemberDecember of each odd numbered year.
 - The District Liaison to the ECC shall maintain an independent on-going list of individuals and organizations who have expressed an interest in an individual member serving on the ECC.
 - The ECC Chair, at the regular meeting in November of each odd numbered year, shall announce to the ECC and to the community, the date in December that membership elections shall be held.
- At the October meeting, mMembers of the ECC will be afforded an opportunity to nominate an
 individual from an organization and/or an individual who have acknowledged an interest to serve
 on the ECC at this same meeting. —The ECC Chair or designee will contact nominated
 organizations and/or individuals.

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C. Terms of Office

- 1. Terms of each community-based member shall be two (2) year re-electable terms. However, the entire committee should not change completely every six (6) or four (4) years. Therefore, any community-based member may be re-elected (or re-appointed) provided they continue to be eligible to represent the constituency/community.
- 2. Community-based mMembers can serve three (3)two (2) three year or two-year terms for a maximum total of six (6) four or (4) consecutive years. Once a member has reached this limit, they are required a minimum consecutive two-year service break before seeking re-election.

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ARTICLE V. COMMUNITY-BASED MEMBERSHIP SELECTION/ELECTION PROCESS

- Individuals nominated from organizations or individuals nominated from the community atlarge, including sitting members of the ECC seeking reelection must fully complete an _application___and attach a resume, and additional information about oneself and/or its organization.
- An applicant should clearly articulate how his/her participation as a future sitting
 member will advance and support equity, diversity, and inclusion in the Fayette County Public
 Schools.
- 3. The application, resume, and additional supporting documents shall not exceed a total of five (5) pages. All completed applications must be received in the Office of Equity, School Support, and Community Engagement no later than the close of business (5:30 —PM, EST), the last business day of the —month of October. Incomplete or late applications will not be considered or presented to the —ECC.

Voting Process

- a. The District Liaison to the ECC will report to the ECC at its regular meeting in November the names and complete applications of all applicants.
- b. At the regular meeting in December of odd numbered years, the Office of Equity, School Support, and Community Engagement shall prepare a list of applicants for the election of six (6) newly elected ECC members:

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- All sitting ECC members shall nominate an applicant for consideration during the timeline ——established in Article IV., (B).
- ii. All sitting ECC members seeking reelection shall follow the guidelines as detailed in Article IV., (B). Therefore, nominations from the floor are strictly prohibited.
- iii. Once a nomination is seconded, the voting members shall vote in favor or opposition to the approval of the nominated applicant to be a member of the ECC.
- iv. This vote shall be a roll call vote.
- v. All sitting members shall vote.
- vi. The ECC Secretary shall record the results of the roll call vote for each nominated applicant.
- vii. After the number of open positions have been filled through election via nomination from the pool of applicants, the election shall end.
- viii. The results of the election shall become a part of the minutes.
- ix. If the ECC Secretary is an applicant, the ECC Chair shall appoint a designee to record the results of the roll call votes.
- x. If sitting ECC members are also applicants, they may vote for themselves if they are a nominated applicant. Recusal of voting for oneself is not mandated.

In the event of a tie vote on the nomination of an applicant, the nomination fails for a lack of majority.

- i. Eligible sitting ECC members (See Article IV.) seeking reappointment or election must complete the process per Article V.
- ii. The ECC Secretary shall record the results during this meeting.

D. REMOVAL OF MEMBERS

A member of the ECC may be removed from the ECC for cause, after an opportunity for hearing before the Fayette County Board of Education, by a vote of three members of the Fayette County Board of Education. The ECC may, by majority vote, remove a member who has three absences within a calendar year.

E. FILLING VACANCIES

 If a member of the ECC resigns or is removed from office, that vacancy shall be replaced by appointment within two (2) months 30 days from the time of the vacancy or a special election shall

- take place by the ECC within two (2) months of the vacancy from the applicant²s_{_} list maintained in the Office of Equity, School Support, and Community Engagement
- If no applications are available to choose from, then the ECC shall accept nominations during the two (2) month period. The ECC Chair shall submit an individual name from the nominations received to the ECC for a Special Election.

ARTICLE VI. OFFICERS

A. <u>EQUITY COUNCIL COMMITTEE OFFICERS</u>

- 1. Officers shall include Chair, Vice Chair, and Secretary.
 - a. At the final meeting in December (regular or special called), the District Liaison to the ECC shall announce that elections will be held at the first meeting in January (either regular or special called) to elect the three ECC Officers.
 - b. Written nominations for officers may be submitted to the Office of Equity, School Support, and Community Engagement no later than three (3) weeks prior to the regular meeting in January.
 - c. ECC members who have been nominated and have acknowledged their willingness to serve shall prepare a brief biographical sketch of no more than 500 words to be submitted to the District Liaison to the ECC no later than twoone-(21) weeks prior to the January meeting. These biographical sketches shall be distributed by the Office of Equity, School Support, and Community Engagement to all ECC members at least one-two (12) weeks prior to the January meeting to allow all members sufficient time for review.
 - d. The District Liaison to the ECC shall announce the nominees who have accepted their nomination at the start of the first meeting in January. Additional nominations for each officer position may be made from the floor at this time. After nominations are closed, the Office of Equity, School Support, and Community Engagement shall prepare a <u>list of nomineesseparate</u> secret ballot f for each officer position, that list the nominees.
 - e. At the January (regular or special called) meeting, the voting members of the ECC shall elect officers. This process shall follow the voting <u>guidelinesguideless</u> detailed in Article V. For each position, a voting member may make a nomination for an ECC voting member to serve as an officer. Once the nomination receives a second, the ECC voting members shall take a roll call vote from the ECC Secretary in favor or opposition of the nomination. This shall continue until an individual receives a majority vote in support of the nomination.
 - The position of ECC Chair will serve a one-year term, and shall be the first officer position elected.

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The revisions of Article IV. Membership: A. Composition occurred through executive order of the Fayette County Board of Education at its

February 27, 2017 Public meeting by a Majority 5-0 vote due to a consistent failure of a quorum of the ECC members to attend both regular and special called meetings. (see attached Executive Summary of the Fayette County Board of Education)

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The Superintendent's office shall provide the ECC with additional secretarial assistance through
——the Office of Equity, School Support, and Community Engagement. This person shall be _
responsible for the publication of ECC minutes and provide other clerical supportive duties as
requested by the Chair, directed by the District Liaison to the ECC, and as contained in these
——bylaws.

B. EQUITY COUNCIL COMMITTEE CHAIR

Duties of the Chair include: Conducting ECC meetings; attending regular, special called, and planning meetings of the Fayette County Board of Education; compiling and distributing the agenda for ECC meetings; approving the meeting minutes prior to distribution; stating for the record the result of actions/decisions taken by the ECC; coordinating standing committees and ad hoc committees; providing responses to citizens during the communication and public participation, production and participation in drafting and presenting an Annual Report of the Equity Outcomes and carrying out any additional responsibilities as stated in these bylaws.

C. EQUITY COUNCIL COMMITTEE VICE CHAIR

Duties of the Vice Chair shall include: Presiding over ECC meetings in the absence of the Chair, calling a special meeting of the ECC in the event a Chair vacancy occurs, and carrying out any additional responsibilities as stated in these bylaws.

D. <u>EQUITY COUNCIL COMMITTEE SECRETARY</u>

Duties of the ECC Secretary shall include: coordinating with the District Liaison to the ECC to call the monthly roll and review minutes of all ECC meetings, count votes as may be necessary during ECC elections, serving as parliamentarian during ECC meetings and carrying out any additional responsibilities as stated in these bylaws.

E. EQUITY COUNCIL COMMITTEE MEMBERS

Duties of Council members include: Knowing and adhering to the mission, belief statements, and purposes of the ECC; attending all ECC meetings, regular, committee and special; encouraging and requesting opinions from their constituencies; supporting, promoting, and communicating ECC decisions and seeking information independently and as needed about issues brought before the ECC; and bringing that information to the ECC. Members should notify the Equity Chair and the District Liaison to the ECC in advance if they are unable to attend.

ARTICLE VII. SCHEDULE OF MEETINGS

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A. REGULAR MEETINGS

- 1. The regular monthly meeting date, time, and location of the ECC shall be determined at the first annual meeting of a quorum of the body. (The first Tuesday of each month, 6:00 PM EST, Conference Room C, It's About Kids Support Services, 701 East Main Street, Lexington, Kentucky 40502 is the recommended date, time, and location of each public meeting).
- 2. All standing and/or ad hoc ECC committees are subject to Open Meetings laws. Meetings shall be held in a publicly accessible location, with appropriate notification of meeting date and time. In the event a special meeting (not set on an annual calendar) is called, not only must the notifications take place, but a set agenda must be publicized where no business other than what is on that agenda may be discussed. Notification process for Special Meetings is explained in Article VII.B.1.
- 3. The District Liaison to the ECC shall provide local news media with the ECC's regular meeting schedule for the year in January and provide notification of the ECC's meeting time and agenda at least one week in advance of each regular meeting.
- The ECC shall comply with all provisions of the Open Meetings and Open Records laws (KRS Chapter 61).

*Public Comment:

Members of the public may address the ECC during the period set aside by the ECC without submitting an item for the agenda. No action shall be taken during this portion of the meeting on issues raised by employees or the public unless deemed an emergency by the ECC.

Please note: Speakers will not be allowed to make any disparaging or critical remarks about individuals or employees of the District. Critical comments or complaints are processed through the District's complaint procedures, which afford the individuals to whom comments, or complaints are directed, the opportunity for response and due process.

a. There is one opportunity for the public to address the ECC:

At the beginning of the meeting, members, of the public who have signed up prior to the meeting are invited to address the ECC on any topic of District-related concern. It is important to know that this is not intended to be a time where issues will be debated. The ECC will take the public's input into consideration and properly redirect the input via the District Liaison to the ECC.

Each speaker will be allowed a maximum of 3 minutes.

B. SPECIAL MEETINGS

- 1. If the ECC needs to meet between regular meetings, or if the regular meeting is rescheduled, the ECC Chair or a majority of the ECC members may call a special meeting. The following steps must be completed by the ECC Chair when a special meeting is called:
 - a. Written Notice: The ECC Chair shall prepare and sign a written notice that states the date, time, and place of the special meeting and the agenda for each meeting. Only the items on the agenda may be discussed.
 - b. Delivery of Notice: The Chair, in collaboration with the District Liaison to the ECC, shall arrange for the notice to be delivered and received to each ECC member at least 48 hours prior to the time of the meeting, and to any media organization that has requested notice of ECC meetings at least 24 hours prior to the time of the meeting. The delivery can be by hand, FAX machine, Email, or mail.

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The ECC shall comply with all provisions of the Open Meetings and Open Records laws (KRS Chapter 61).

ARTICLE VIII. CONDUCT OF MEETINGS

QUORUM

A quorum of the ECC shall be a majority (more than one-half) of the ECC members. No ECC business shall be conducted unless a quorum of ECC members is present as detailed in Article VII, Section B (1).

В. ATTENDANCE AT MEETINGS

All ECC meetings are open to the public and all interested persons can attend, except for those portions that are conducted in closed session.

D. **AGENDA**

- 1. Anyone may submit items for inclusion on the agenda to the Chair, in writing, no later than five working days prior to a meeting. The Chair shall not accept items related to pending litigation with the Fayette County Board of Education, or individual personnel matters.
- 2. The Chair, in consultation with the Superintendent, FCPS Board of Education Chair, and the District Liaison to the ECC, shall prepare a preliminary agenda for each regular ECC meeting, including items submitted in writing for inclusion by the public, staff, other ECC members and other items he or she believes should be on the agenda. The Chair may declare an item received as not within ECC authority. The District Liaison to the ECC shall provide members with a copy of the preliminary agenda at least one week prior to the meeting.
 - 3. Each agenda may include but not be limited to the following items:
 - A. Setting of the final agenda for the current meeting.
 - B. Review and approval of previous meeting minutes.
 - C. An opportunity during the meeting for persons to address the ECC.
 - D. Full Acknowledgement and Review of Standards of Practice Agreement

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(Attachment S).

- E. Committee Reports/Updates.
- F. Other items submitted.
- 4. Setting of the agenda shall be conducted prior to each regular ECC meeting by the Superintendent, FCPS Board of Education Chair, ECC Chair, and the ECC Liaison at a standing meeting the last Tuesday of the month preceding the monthly ECC regular meeting.

Ε. DISCUSSION OF AGENDA ITEMS

- 1. The ECC shall discuss each agenda item before a decision is made. Each ECC member shall be given an opportunity to express his or her opinion on the item. If, an item under discussion is inappropriate for some legal reason, the Chair shall immediately motion for the item to be tabled. Once the motion receivesd a second, the motion is not debatable and receives an immediate vote.
- 2. Other persons attending the meeting may be recognized by the Chair and may address the ECC as the Chair calls upon them to speak. If a significant number of persons wish to contribute to the discussion on a particular item, the Chair may set limits on the amount of time each person shallto speak.
- 3. Any agenda item may be referred to a standing or ad hoc committee for further study as deemed necessary by the Council.

ARTICLE IX. MINUTES AND OTHER COUNCIL RECORDS

A. MINUTES KEPT AND APPROVED

- 1. Minutes shall be kept and maintained in the Office of Equity, School Support, School Community and Community & Government Support OfficeEngagement for each meeting of the ECC.
- 2. The minutes shall reflect an accurate record of actions and votes taken at an ECC meeting. Minutes shall show the words of the motion and the majority vote or unanimous support.
- 3. If the action taken was the recommendation of a policy, the entire text of the policy shall be attached to the copy of the minutes.
- 4. The minutes of the ECC shall not be official until they are reviewed and approved by the ECC.
- 5. A preliminary copy of the minutes for all ECC meetings will be provided to the members five days in advance of the next meeting.

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- The Equity Liaison will forward an official copy of the minutes to the Superintendent and Fayette County Board of Education.
- Draft minutes shall be constructed by the District Liaison to the ECC and provided to the ECC Chair for initial review. Once the minutes are reviewed, they will be forwarded to members for approval at the next meeting.
- B. EQUITY COUNCIL COMMITTEE RECORDS AVAILABLE FOR PUBLIC INSPECTION COUNCIL COMMITTEE RECORDS AVAILABLE FOR PUBLIC INSPECTION

The following are official documents that must be kept on file for public inspection in the Superintendent's office: ECC Bylaws, ECC Policy, minutes, committee minutes, the District Comprehensive Improvement Plan, District Scorecard, Archived ECC Annual Scorecards, ECC and committee membership lists.

C. REQUESTS FOR COUNCIL RECORDS

- 1. Requests for Council records must be made in writing to the official custodian of records (Superintendent's Office) for FCPS. Requests must include specific documents and dates.
- 2. Requested ECC records shall be provided in accordance with the Open Records Law.
- 3. The Superintendent's office shall make or provide copies of requested documents, consistent with the provisions of KRS 61.870, et. seq.

ARTICLE X. REQUESTS FOR PROPOSALS

The ECC may deem it necessary after data-led research and development from time to time to recommend to the Fayette County Board of Education the need to secure services of an outside contractor to accomplish tasks consistent with the mission and purpose of the ECC. Any such Requests for Proposal shall be developed in concert with and have the approval of the Fayette County Board of Education and shall be consistent with the provisions of the Model Procurement Code, KRS Chapter 45A.

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ARTICLE XI. ANNUAL REPORTING

The ECC shall produce and present to the Fayette County Board of Education, in a joint retreat/meeting, an annual outcomes/activity, and accomplishments to equity-related matters from equity of the past year.

ARTICLE XII. COMMITTEES

A. USE OF COMMITTEES

Committees (Subcommittees) will be used to support and to accomplish tasks of the ECC.

B. COMMITTEES POLICY

The ECC will adopt a committee policy to facilitate the participation and capacity building of interested stakeholders. As required by the Kentucky Open Meetings Act, the policy will include the number of committees, their jurisdiction, their composition, and the process for membership selection. (See Attachment C)

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XIII. DECISION-MAKING

A. QUORUM

A majority (more than half) of the members will constitute a quorum. A quorum must be present for the ECC to meet and to take action.

B. CONSENSUS

1. The ECC will operate by consensus decision-making using the following procedures:

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- a. Only decisions that have an immediate deadline or will have very limited impact on the transformation of recommended district policies and practices will be made without a committee recommendation.
- b. All ECC members who choose to do so will be given a chance for input on issues requiring a consensus decision.
- c. If ECC inputs and discussions reveal significant concerns or ambiguities related to disparity issues, the ECC's normal practice will be to give or return the issue to a subcommittee for further research and development. Exceptions may be made for urgent timelines or pressing concerns.
- 2. After ECC input and discussion, any member may make a motion to accept a proposal. If the proposal being considered is in writing, the motion may be made verbally. If the proposal has not been presented in writing or the member making the motion wants to propose one or more amendments, he or she will write down the motion, read it to the council, and hand the written motion to the secretary for inclusion in the minutes.
- 3. The chair will then ask if there is further discussion.
- 4. When that discussion is complete, the chair will test for consensus by asking if there is consensus for approval of the motion. Any member who is not willing to support the motion is obligated to say so at this time. Members who support the motion will indicate by word or another verbal or visual acknowledgement that they believe there is now a consensus.
- 5. If no member states unwillingness to support, the ECC Chair will direct the Secretary to record that consensus has been reached and the motion has passed.

C. CONSENSUS FAILURE

- ECC voting will be done only when the council must have a decision, consensus has failed, and the following condition exists:
 - a. When the council has failed to reach consensus at a second meeting for that purpose.
- 2. At the first meeting where an issue is discussed, if the chair tests for consensus but consensus is not reached, the ECC may postpone further consideration until the next meeting or continue to discuss the issue. After testing for consensus on a proposal three times in one meeting, the chair may direct that the proposal be taken up again at the next meeting, unless one of the conditions for voting applies.

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- 3. If the council takes up an issue at a second meeting and is still unable to reach consensus, the council will consider alternative steps, including but not limited to:
 - a. Asking a committee to bring the ECC a new proposal on the issue.
 - b. Doing nothing and dropping the issue.
 - c. Voting.

D. BYLAWS AMENDMENT

The ECC may amend these bylaws as needed. These bylaws may be amended after a first and second reading at two consecutive meetings by majority vote of the Fayette County Board of Education or through Executive Order of the Fayette County Board of Education as deemed necessary by majority vote at any public meeting.

All motions to amend the bylaws of the ECC will be submitted in writing. No decision on a motion to amend the bylaws will be made until after the topic has been on the agenda for two meetings and has had two readings.

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Equity Council Committee "Committee Policy"

(Attachment C)

A. PURPOSE

- 1. Standing and ad hoc committees are established to gain input from all stakeholders.
- Standing and ad hoc committees shall serve as an Equity Council Committee (ECC)
 resource for gathering data and information and making recommendations to the
 ECC and the Fayette County Board of Education.

Standing committee composition and membership selection

All members of the ECC will serve on at least one standing committee. Each standing committee will seek capacity and representation to include additional community, school, and district subject matter experts (SMEs) to support the work of the committee. Committees will also make every effort to include at least one parent and to provide reasonable representation of the ethnic diversity of our community.

B. APPOINTMENT OF COMMITTEES

- 2. Standing committees can be created or dissolved by the Chair with consent from a majority of the ECC, as needed.

C. STANDING COMMITTEES

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Standing committees for the ECC shall align with the goals and objectives

established by the Fayette County Board of Education, the Comprehensive District

Improvement Plan (CDIP), and the priority focus areas of the District Strategic Plan

which currently are:

- Excellent Student Opportunities: Provide every student in every grade with rigorous curriculum, strong instruction, and aligned assessments in core subjects.
- Excellent Staff: Recruit, retain, equip, and develop every employee to serve students at high levels.
- Excellent Schools: Set and uphold high expectations for every student in every school.
- Excellent Supports: Provide efficient and effective central supports to every school.
- Excellent Relationships: Foster collaborative family, community, and industry partnerships.

D. MEETINGS

- Each committee shall choose the time, place, agenda, and schedule for their meetings. This will be provided to the District Liaison to the ECC two weeks in advance to comply with the Open Meetings laws (KRS Chapter 61).
- Committees must comply with all provisions of the Open Meetings and Open Records laws (KRS Chapter 61).

E. MEMBERSHIP & APPOINTMENT OF CHAIR

- Each committee shall consist of representatives from the ECC.
 Community and staff members may be added at the discretion of the ECC
 Chair to assist with particular issues that may arise. Once the committee takes
 action on the issue, the extra member's service will discontinue. The Chair
 — may ask additional community or staff members to serve again at his/her
 discretion.
- The Chair of the ECC shall appoint a Chair for each standing and ad hoc committee.

F. DECISION MAKING

Committee decisions shall be made by consensus. In the event that consensus is not possible, a majority of the committee may decide that an issue shall be decided by majority vote.

G. DUTIES/RESPONSIBILITIES

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1.	Committees shall carry out tasks assigned to them by the ECC.
2.	Committees may decide to bring issues of concern or interest to the ECC.
3.	Committees may research issues, gather district-wide input, or prepare drafts of ECC recommendations.
4.	Committee chairs or their designees will report at each regular ECC
5.	Committee chairs shall provide the District Liaison to the ECC with written

Committee chairs shall provide the District Liaison to the ECC with written minutes of their meetings no later than 10 days after the meeting occurred.

- Disaggregate annual testing data analysis every fall and report to the Equity Council and Board of Education.
- Recommend District priority needs to the Board of Education based on test analysis data.
- Recommend other changes, ideas, and strategies to assigned policies based on annual needs assessments, data gathering, and research into best practice.
- Additional roles/charges as assigned by the Board of Education and Equity Council.
- 4. School Culture & Student, Family, and Community Engagement Committee (Excellent Relationships)
 - Additional roles/charges as assigned by the Board of Education and ECC.
- 5. Equitable Facilities and Resources: Minority Business Enterprise/Women Business Enterprise Committee (Excellent Schools)
 - Additional roles/charges as assigned by the Board of Education and ECC.

Beginning in March, the following steps will be taken to recruit members for next year's committees:

- The ECC Chair (or designee) will invite all other stakeholders, in writing to sign_-up for committees via the ECC wwwebsite (or attachment to report card, letter home to parents, etc.).
- Current committee chairs (or their designees) will describe their committees' work at an ECC Meeting.
- 3. ECC and committee members will individually and actively seek out parents and other interested community members who are representative of the diversity of our community and encourage their active participation on Eequity Ceouncil committees.

April

- 1. The ECC Chair (or designee) will place committee sign-up sheets in a designated place that is convenient to the public and parents. These sign_up sheets will include the name of each committee, the name of the current chair and a brief description of each committee's jurisdiction as outlined in the first section of this policy. Parents and community members may also sign-up by written letter.
- 2. The ECC will appoint committee members using the sign-up sheets as a basis. The council may need to assign some people to committees that are not their first choice to give each committee adequate and balanced membership.
- 3. The ECC Chair will notify committee members of their appointments.
- 4. At that meeting, all committees will:
 - Elect a chair. They will also elect or appoint a secretary who will take minutes for this
 first meeting and all subsequent meetings and a vice-chair who will take over in the
 absence of the chair.
 - Receive information from the ECC Chair about the ECC timeline for regular committee reports.
 - Set up a meeting schedule for the rest of the year.
 - Read and discuss this policy and ask the Chair of the ECC any questions regarding their role and duties.
 - If necessary, discuss the active recruitment of parents and community members to serve
 on their committee.
 - Discuss ongoing and any new charges from the ECC and develop a plan of action that includes a timeline.
 - · Discuss the Open Meetings Law.

AD HOC COMMITEES

As needed, the ECC may also approve ad hoc committees for the following tasks:

- 1. Analyze Ongoing District and School Improvement Disparities and Inequities.
- 2. Address other needs as identified by the council. For these ad hoc committees, the Equity Council will identify the specific topic to be addressed in a written charge.

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The ECC will invite persons to serve on the ad hoc committee and will also designate a committee member to convene the committee for its first meeting.

Ad hoc committees automatically dissolve at the completion of the assigned task.

Operating rules for all committees

All committees established by the ECC are public agencies subject to Kentucky's Open Meetings Law. To comply with that law, each committee will:

- 1. Establish a regular meeting schedule at its first meeting of each calendar year and make that schedule available to the public by posting it in a place convenient to the public.
- 2. Hold meetings that are not on the regular schedule only after following these special meeting procedures:
- a. The committee chair or a majority of members decide the date, time, place, and agenda.
- b. Those who make the decision to have the meeting put the date, time, place, and agenda in a written notice, which they will post in a place convenient to the public at least 24 hours before the meeting.
- c. Notice of a special meeting will be hand-delivered, faxed, e-mailed*, or sent by US mail to all members of the committee early enough so that they will receive it 24 hours before the meeting. The telephone cannot be used to deliver these notices.
- d. If any media organization has asked for notice of special meetings, those calling the meeting will hand-deliver, fax, e-mail*, or send by US mail copies of the written notice to the agency requesting the notice so that they will receive it 24 hours before the meeting. The telephone cannot be used to deliver these notices.

*To receive e-mail notification, a written request must be on file at the school. This amendment to the Open Meetings Law was passed in the 2008 General Assembly and effective beginning in mid-July 2008.

- 3. Take minutes of the actions and decisions made by the committee at every meeting.
- 4. Review the minutes of each meeting at the next meeting and, after making any needed corrections, approve those minutes.
- 5. Make committee minutes for each meeting available to the council and to any interested party after final approval.
- 6. Ensure that the ECC Chair receives an official copy to be kept with ECC records as required by Kentucky's Archive rules.

- FCPS agrees to pay TTPD a total of \$34,450 for all services rendered inclusive of all travel and related costs. TTPD agrees to invoice FCPS 9 times, after completion of each set of dates as noted above.

RESOLUTION OF BOARD OF EDUCATION OF FAYETTE COUNTY, KENTUCKY, RELATING TO THE ISSUANCE OF FAYETTE COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT FINANCE CORPORATION SCHOOL BUILDING REFUNDING REVENUE BONDS, SERIES 2017A

WHEREAS, the Fayette County School District Finance Corporation (the "Corporation") previously issued its Fayette County School District Finance Corporation School Building Revenue Bonds, Series 2011A, dated June 14, 2011, in an original principal amount of \$52,175,000 (the "Series 2011A Bonds"), on behalf of the Board of Education of Fayette County, Kentucky (the "Board of Education"), for the purposes of financing the reconstruction, renovation, improvement, and equipping of the Clays Mill, Mary Todd, Millcreek, Cardinal Valley, and Breckinridge Elementary Schools in the Fayette County School District, including buildings, additions, structures, fixtures, equipment, furnishings, appurtenances, improvements, and the sites thereof (collectively, the "Projects"); and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education previously caused title to the Projects, including their sites, to be conveyed to the Corporation in connection with the issuance of the Series 2011A Bonds by the Corporation; and

WHEREAS, the Kentucky School Facilities Construction Commission (the "Commission") entered into a Participation Agreement with the Board of Education with regard to the financing of the Projects in connection with the issuance of the Series 2011A Bonds; and

WHEREAS, in order to advance refund the Series 2011A Bonds maturing on June 1, 2022 through June 1, 2031, in the outstanding principal amount of \$31,035,000 (collectively, the "Refunded Bonds"), and to pay related costs, it has been determined to be necessary to direct the Corporation to issue its School Building Refunding Revenue Bonds, Series 2017A, in the aggregate principal amount of \$33,690,000, subject to change as hereinafter provided (the "Series 2017A Bonds"), all pursuant to and as permitted by Sections 162.120 through 162.300 and 162.385 of the Kentucky Revised Statutes ("KRS"); and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education will take any and all action necessary or desirable to cause the Corporation to call for redemption of the Refunded Bonds on June 1, 2021 at 100% of the face value thereof plus accrued interest thereon; and

WHEREAS, the continued use and occupancy of the Projects by the Board of Education is necessary to provide adequate educational facilities and to promote the general welfare of the school children in the Fayette County School District, and the annual revenues of the Board of Education are sufficient to permit payment from such revenues of the annual rentals for the use and occupancy of the facilities as hereinafter provided to be leased and rented.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF FAYETTE COUNTY, KENTUCKY, AS FOLLOWS:

- <u>Section 1.</u> The facts and statements contained in the foregoing preamble of this Resolution, including the terms defined therein, are hereby affirmed and incorporated as a part of this Resolution.
- <u>Section 2.</u> It is hereby found and declared to be necessary, advantageous and in the public interest that the Board of Education direct the Corporation to undertake the advance refunding of the Refunded Bonds in order to address the reduction in the interest subsidy and thereby effect debt service savings and to lease the Projects to the Board of Education for the Board's use and occupancy. The sites of the Projects are described in the Contract of Lease and Rent herein approved.
- <u>Section 3.</u> The Board of Education hereby directs that the Corporation ratify, approve, and accept the appointment of J.J.B. Hilliard, W.L. Lyons, LLC, as financial advisor, in accordance with the agreement previously made by the Board of Education, and Stoll Keenon Ogden PLLC, as bond counsel, to be paid from the proceeds of the Series 2017A Bonds when the same are received and not from any other funds or resources of the Corporation or the Board of Education (unless necessary to supplement such bond proceeds). All actions previously taken by Board of Education officials with respect to such appointments are approved, ratified, and confirmed.
- Section 4. Each of the Chairperson and the Vice Chairperson of the Board of Education is hereby authorized and directed to execute for and on behalf of the Board of Education a Participation Agreement with the Commission in substantially the form submitted herewith (and as adopted as a part hereof), with such changes as the authorized officer of the Board of Education may approve on behalf of the Board of Education, as evidenced by his or her execution of the final instrument. The Board hereby irrevocably pledges and assigns to the Corporation the agreed participation of the Commission allocable to the Series 2017A Bonds under the Participation Agreement for the benefit of the holders of the Series 2017A Bonds.
- <u>Section 5.</u> Each of the Chairperson and the Vice Chairperson is hereby authorized and directed to execute for and on behalf of the Board of Education a Contract of Lease and Rent with the Corporation in substantially the form submitted herewith (and adopted as a part hereof), with such changes as the authorized officer of the Board of Education may approve on behalf of the Board of Education, as evidenced by his or her execution of the final instrument.
- Section 6. The Secretary has filed a copy of this Resolution and the form of a proposed Resolution of the Corporation's Board of Directors with the Secretary of the Corporation with the direction that they be acted upon at the meeting of the Corporation's Board of Directors held on this date, and such action is approved and affirmed and the same shall constitute a direction and notice on behalf of the Board of Education that the Corporation, acting by and through its Board of Directors, take all action necessary and appropriate: (a) for the issuance, sale, and delivery of School Building Refunding Revenue Bonds, Series 2017A, to be dated as of such date as may be set by the President, Treasurer, or Secretary of the Corporation, in the aggregate

principal amount of \$33,690,000 (subject to any adjustment provided for in the proposed Resolution); (b) for application of the proceeds of sale of the Series 2017A Bonds in accordance with the provisions of the Resolution of the Board of Directors of the Corporation authorizing the Series 2017A Bonds (the "Bond Resolution") for the purposes of advance refunding the Refunded Bonds and paying expenses in connection with the issuance of the Series 2017A Bonds, including the fees and expenses of the financial advisor, bond counsel, and other advisors incurred in connection with the issuance of the Series 2017A Bonds or the interpretation or enforcement of any document or obligation associated therewith; and (c) for executing and delivering on behalf of the Corporation the proposed Contract of Lease and Rent as herein approved.

Section 7. When the Series 2017A Bonds have been sold, the Chairperson, Vice Chairperson, Treasurer, Secretary, and other appropriate officers of the Board of Education, and each of them, are authorized to take such actions as may be necessary or desirable to carry out the issuance of the Series 2017A Bonds and the advance refunding of the Refunded Bonds. The Board of Education specifically authorizes its officers to take any and all action necessary or desirable to cause the Corporation to carry out the call for redemption of the Refunded Bonds on June 1, 2021. The Board of Education specifically authorizes its officers to take such actions under the terms of the representations, warranties, and covenants contained in the Contract of Lease and Rent, hereinabove approved, as may be required to comply with the provisions of the United States Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, in respect of the exclusion from gross income for federal income tax purposes of interest on the Series 2017A Bonds, and the applicable rules of the Securities and Exchange Commission.

Section 8. It is acknowledged that in connection with the sale of the Series 2017A Bonds a Preliminary Official Statement and a final Official Statement (collectively, the "Official Statement") of the Corporation, as issuer of the Series 2017A Bonds, and the Board of Education will be distributed. The Official Statement and the use thereof in offering and selling the Series 2017A Bonds is hereby approved and the Chairperson or Secretary may execute the same on behalf of the Board of Education. The Preliminary Official Statement is hereby declared to be in a form "deemed final" for purposes of SEC Rule 15c2-12(b)(1), but is subject to amendment, revision, and completion in the final Official Statement.

Section 9. The Board of Education hereby covenants and agrees that it will, before the issuance of the Series 2017A Bonds, execute and deliver a Continuing Disclosure Certificate, as described in the Official Statement, and further will comply with and carry out all of the provisions of the Continuing Disclosure Certificate. However, any failure of the Board of Education to comply with the Continuing Disclosure Certificate shall not be considered an event of default hereunder or under the Contract of Lease and Rent herein approved. Any Bondholder may take such actions as may be necessary and appropriate to obtain specific performance by court order to cause the Board of Education to comply with its obligations under the Continuing Disclosure Certificate.

Section 10. The Treasurer is authorized to establish and transfer each year to the "School Building Fund" in accordance with KRS 160.476 sufficient general fund

moneys to meet the debt service requirement on the Series 2017A Bonds in each year the Contract of Lease and Rent is in effect. Sufficient funds for each year means the difference between the total of all debt service requirements and the sum of the Board of Education's SEEK capital outlay (80%), five cent equivalent tax and the FSPK equalization (if any) for that year.

Section 11. This Resolution shall take effect from and after its passage.

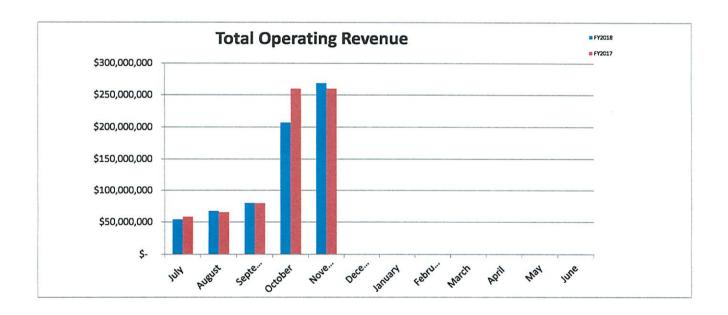

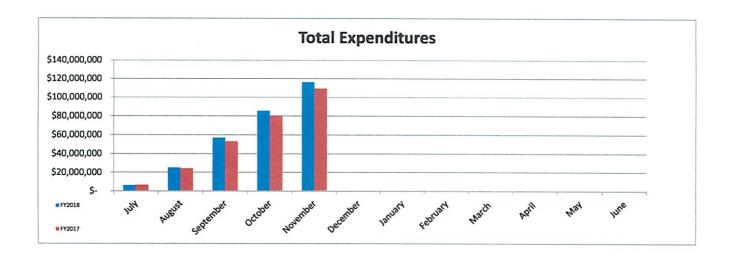
