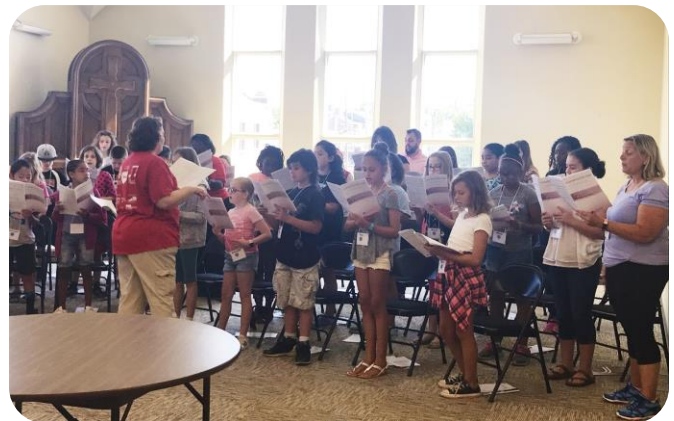

 - Case Staffing (team only)
 - Service Team Meetings (youth and family)
