APRIL 30, 2019

- I. **Call to order:** Mr. Hoskins called the meeting to order at 5:30 PM.
- II. **Reading of Mission Statement:** The council read the mission statement.
- III. **Agenda Approval:** Ms. Nall motioned to approve the agenda. Mrs. Sruthi seconded. Unanimous decision.
- IV. **Previous Meeting's Minutes:** Mr. White motioned to approve the minutes. Mrs. Snodgrass seconded. Unanimous decision.
- V. **Public Address:** No one wished to address the council.
- VI. **Good News Report:**
  - a. STLP placed second in the district for News Showcase and third in Robotics showcase at the STEM fair on March 23.
  - b. 220 seventh graders applied for 100 WEB leader positions for the 2019-2020 school year. A list of WEB leaders can be found in the April 8 parent newsletter on the website.
  - c. 8th grader Kiera Fehr placed second overall in the state in the KY-SEF state science fair on March 30. In addition she placed first in the engineering mechanics division.
  - d. Boys' and girls' track won the Bryan Station Invitational on April 8, and the Henry Clay invitational on April 12. Aniya Drake broke the school record in the 100-meter dash.
  - e. Girls lacrosse defeated Woodford Co. 16-2 on April 20, Henry Clay JV 23-6 on April 14, and Sayre 11-7 on April 23.
  - f. The following students scored proficient or above on the STAMP test for high school Spanish placement: Zachary Butler, Evan Covert, Trey Davis, Lilly Hartman, Carson Johnson, Ella Miller, Hillary Thompson, Tylon Webb, and Janna Whaley.
  - g. FFA placed in several events at the UK Field Day on April 18, being one of two middle schools to compete. A complete list of events and placement can be found in the April 29 parent newsletter.
  - h.   - i. The sixth annual Pantherthon raised a school record of \$16,779.52 for UK Dance Blue. These funds will be used for pediatric cancer research.
