MAY 28, 2019
HELD AT EJH CONFERENCE ROOM**

- I. **Call to order:** Mr. Hoskins called the meeting to order at 5:35 PM.
- II. **Reading of Mission Statement:** The council read the mission statement.
- III. **Agenda Approval:** Mrs. Duncan motioned to approve. Mr. White seconded. Unanimous decision.
- IV. **Previous Meeting's Minutes:** Mrs. Palle motioned to approve the minutes. Mr. White seconded. Unanimous decision.
- V. **Public Address:** No one wished to address the council.
- VI. **Good News Report:**
 - a. Eden Anderson, Abigail Bartlett, Julia Burns, Jessica Burr, Eva Gonzval, Riley Hooks, Isaac Orr, Katie Picklesimer, Annalise Pietrowski, Ashley Powell, Ava Settles, and Tripp Walker represented EJH at the KMEA District 7 Honors Orchestra.
 - b. Avery Caldwell, Mason Goodpaster, and Landon Menifee finished first in the East Kentucky Region of the 2019 Stock Market Game competition, and finished 12th in the state.
 - c. Derrick Anderson, Alan Ford, and LeAnn Hall were named Teachers Who Made a Difference by the University of Kentucky, after nominations from students.
 - d. Girls' lacrosse finished second in the district tournament. Boys' lacrosse finished third in the district tournament.
 - e. Both boys' and girls' track finished second in the district on May 17. Individual district champions were:
 - 100-meter hurdles: Jhaylen Braxton Davis, 14.95 seconds (school record)
 - 100-meter dash: Anayia Davis, 13.24 seconds
 - 100-meter dash: Jon Horton, 11.74 seconds
 - Savannah Daugherty, 27.31 seconds (school record)
 - High jump: Tyleik Maxwell, 5' 4"
 - Girls 4x100 meter relay: Zariyha Clifford, Anayia Drake, SaNiya Jackson, Cumaury Walker, 52.45 (ranked first in the state)
 - Girls 4x200 meter relay: Zariyha Clifford, Savannah Daugherty, Janna Whaley, Ainsley Wilson, 1:52.15 (ranked first in the state)
 - Boys 4x100 meter relay: Jacob Childress, Jon Horton, Andrew Hoten, Davaun Gidron, 46.06 (ranked first in the state, school record)
 - Boy 4x200 meter relay: Jacob Childress, Jon Horton, Andrew Hoten, Davaun Gidron, 1:37.5 (ranked first in the state, school record)

On May 20, the girls' sixth grade team won the district championship, while the boys' team finished second. Individual district champions were:

On May 25, the boys won the KCCTA state track and field championship! The team 61 overall points in the event, edging out Owensboro Middle School. The following placed in the top three in their respective events:

- 2019 KCCTA state 200 meter dash runner up- Jon Horton
- 2019 KCCTA state hurdles third place: Davaun Gidron
- 2019 KCCTA long jump third place: Tyleik Maxwell
- 2019 KCCTA high jump third place: Tyleik Maxwell

VIII. Principal Report:

- a. Mr. Sherrard reviewed the monthly discipline report for April.

- d. Two paraeducator positions are still vacant due to a lack of candidates. Interviews will resume after the school year ends.

X. Student Learning:

- a. The district will purchase the Amplify curriculum for science for the 2019-2020 school year. Several EJM teachers piloted the curriculum and recommended it for adoption to the district. Council must choose to adopt it before the district can purchase it. Ms. Nall motioned to approve the adoption. Mrs. Snodgrass seconded. Unanimous decision.
