

**Question: How does the score reporting work for ACT and SAT? If I take the test more than once, can I report to colleges only scores from a certain date? What about certain sections?**

**FOR ACT:**

When you register for the test, you can opt for your scores be sent to: yourself at home; your high school; and up to 4 colleges. This is at no additional cost (beyond what you pay for the test). After you take the test, you have until the following Thursday to cancel your scores if you don't feel you did well or to ONLY have the scores sent to yourself (and your HS, if you want), but not to colleges. You can also order your score reports to colleges sent AFTER you take the exam, at the cost of \$10 each. If you take the ACT more than once, you CAN control which test date's scores are sent to colleges if you have them sent directly from ACT. ACT sends ALL sub-scores from the date you request, however., For example, if you like your math score from the April test and your science score from the June test, ACT will not allow you to pick and choose sections from different test dates and you will likely need to send either the April, June or both dates to the school of your choice. **FOR SAT:**

Four SAT score reports are included free with your registration. Sending scores with your registration is the fastest way to send scores to colleges and scholarship programs. Many colleges view the receipt of your scores early as a demonstration of your interest. SAT Program recommends that students send all of their scores if they are unsure of which scores to send. You can make updates to your score recipients for up to nine days after your test date. To make updates, log in to My SAT. If you choose to send more than four or to send scores outside the registration time period, you will be charged \$10 per score sent. Score Choice: gives you the option to choose which scores (by test date for the SAT and by individual test for SAT Subject Tests) you send to colleges in accordance with an institution's stated score-use practice. If you decide not to use Score Choice, all of your scores will be sent to your recipients. Students should still feel comfortable sending all scores, since most colleges consider a student's best score. See [sat.collegeboard.com](http://sat.collegeboard.com) for more information.

**FOR THE EHS REGISTRAR:**

When you apply to college, you will need submit a written request form to our Registrar, Ms. Ellis in order to send your official transcript to the college(s) of your choice. If you request it, she can also include your ACT and/or SAT scores on the transcript, but only if you included to have had them sent to your high school on the test date. If you specifically request it, Ms. Ellis can send your test scores only from a particular date; if you do not provide her with detailed instructions, she will include scores from all test scores submitted to EHS. The first four official transcripts are free and there is a \$1.00 fee for each official transcript after four.

**NOTE For Student-Athletes:**

The NCAA Clearinghouse requires that ACT and/or SAT scores be sent directly from the testing company, as opposed to from the EHS Registrar's office on your official transcript.
