The JATC (www.nmjatc.org) accepts applications throughout the entire year. Applications will be accepted at the address above, on the days and times listed below. You may pick up an application at our office, request an application from our website, or telephone our office to have an application mailed to you. There is a non-refundable application fee of \$20.00, which needs to be in the form of a money order, cashier's check, or credit/debit card.

To meet minimum qualifications for apprenticeship, applicants must:

BE A MINIMUM OF 18 YEARS OF AGE.

PRESENT EVIDENCE THAT THEY POSSESS A VALID DRIVER'S LICENSE.

BE AT LEAST A HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATE, OR HAVE A GED, OR HAVE A TWO-YEAR ASSOCIATE DEGREE OR HIGHER.

SHOW EVIDENCE OF SUCCESSFUL COMPLETION OF: ONE FULL CREDIT OF HIGH SCHOOL ALGEBRA WITH A PASSING GRADE, OR ONE POST HIGH SCHOOL ALGEBRA COURSE WITH A PASSING GRADE, OR THE ELECTRICAL TRAINING ALLIANCE ONLINE TECH MATH.

PROVIDE AN OFFICIAL TRANSCRIPT FOR HIGH SCHOOL AND POST HIGH SCHOOL EDUCATION AND TRAINING. APPLICANTS MUST CONTACT THEIR SCHOOL TO HAVE THAT SCHOOL FAX OR MAIL TRANSCRIPTS DIRECTLY TO THE JATC. ALL GED RECORDS MUST BE SUBMITTED IF APPLICABLE.

PAY A NON-REFUNDABLE APPLICATION FEE OF \$20.00 (MONEY ORDER, CASHIER'S CHECK, OR CREDIT/DEBIT CARD ONLY)

SUBMIT A DD-214 TO VERIFY MILITARY TRAINING AND/OR EXPERIENCE IF THEY ARE A VETERAN AND WISH TO RECEIVE CONSIDERATION FOR SUCH TRAINING/EXPERIENCE.

AS PRESCRIBED BY THE JATC, HAVE A QUALIFYING SCORE ON THE ELECTRICAL TRADE'S APTITUDE TEST DEVELOPED AND VALIDATED BY THE AMERICAN INSTITUTES FOR RESEARCH.

PRIOR TO BEING REGISTERED, APPLICANTS SELECTED FROM THE POOL OF INTERVIEWED APPLICANTS WILL BE REQUIRED TO PROVIDE RESULTS OF A DRUG TEST.

The recruitment, selection, employment and training of apprentices during their apprenticeship, shall be without discrimination because of race, color, religion, national origin, sex or age – except that the applicant must be at least 18 years of age to apply. The JATC does not, and will not, discriminate against a qualified individual with a disability because of the disability of such individual. The sponsor will take affirmative action to provide equal opportunity in apprenticeship and will operate the apprenticeship program as required under applicable law and lawful regulations issued there under.

Applicants who meet all basic requirements will be interviewed by the JATC and will be selected in order of their final ranking.

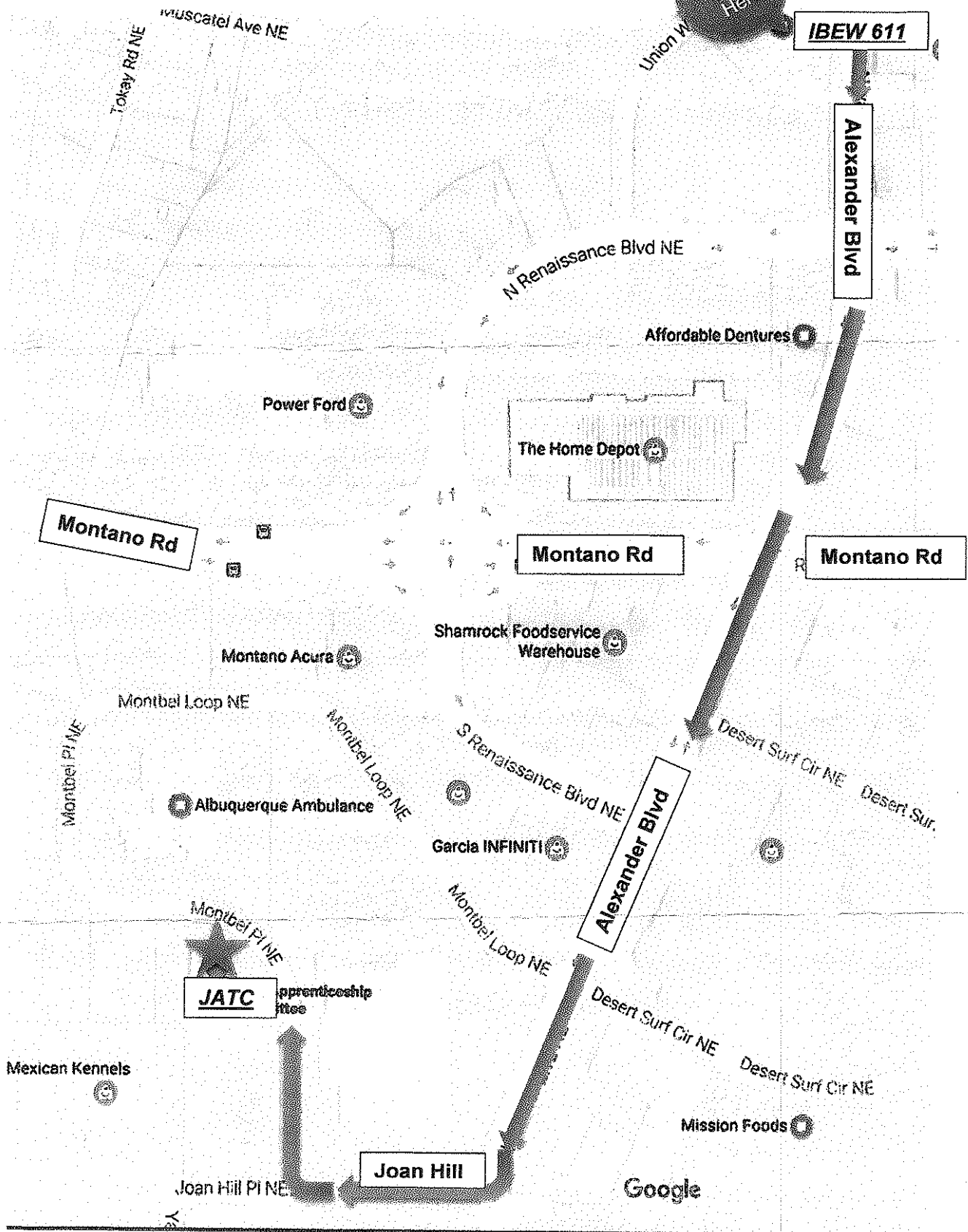

- SUBMIT A DD-214 TO VERIFY MILITARY TRAINING.
- SHOW EVIDENCE OF: ONE FULL YEAR OF HIGH SCHOOL ALGEBRA 1 WITH A GRADE OF C OR BETTER.
- AS PRESCRIBED BY THE JATC, HAVE A QUALIFYING SCORE ON THE ELECTRICAL TRADE'S APTITUDE TEST DEVELOPED BY THE AMERICAN INSTITUTE FOR RESEARCH:
- HAVE A VALID DRIVERS LICENSE
- PRIOR TO BEING REGISTERED, APPLICANTS SELECTED FROM THE POOL OF INTERVIEWED APPLICANTS WILL BE REQUIRED TO PROVIDE RESULTS OF A DRUG TEST.

Job Description:

An apprentice lineman works under the supervision of journeyman lineman and assists many essential tasks on power distribution systems:

Construction (de-energized distribution systems)

- Placement of footings
- Assembly and erection of metal towers.
- Framing and erection of wood poles.
- Installation of anchors, guys, insulators and conductors.
- Assembly and erection of steel and wood substation.
- Installation and connection of busses, grounds, switches, circuit breakers, transformers, regulator, and other related equipment.
- Installation and splicing of underground cable and related equipment.

Maintenance (energized distribution systems)

- Pole and conductor replacement.
- Changing insulators and cross-arms.
- Changing and installing the transformers, capacitors, regulators, switches and other distribution devices.
- Rubber glove work on energized primary circuits.
- Hot stick work on distribution and sub-transmission voltages. (2,400 to 34,500 volt range)

Requirements:

1. A) Complete the online application start page and remit application fee for each area you're applying to (\$30.00/area)
B) Complete online portions of application and work history (CDL and medical card to be uploaded online) and mail official sealed high school transcripts or GED to the office.
Opened transcripts/GED scores will not be accepted even if official. *Please note you are responsible for attending interviews in each area you apply to and for transporting yourself to and from each interview.*
2. Be a minimum of 18 years of age.
3. If you are a veteran and wish to receive consideration for such training/experience, a copy of your military discharge (DD214) must be submitted.
4. Provide any other documentation or information such as letters of recommendation, personal merit reference, achievement awards, etc. that you would like the AJATC to consider.
5. Prior to being indentured, applicants selected from the pool of interviewed applicants will be required to provide results of a physical examination and drug test as determined by the AJATC.

6. *Birth certificate, social security card, driving record are NOT required and will not be kept on file as part of your submission. **Southwestern Line Constructors is not responsible for returning items submitted.
***Application fees are for processing, and are non-refundable.

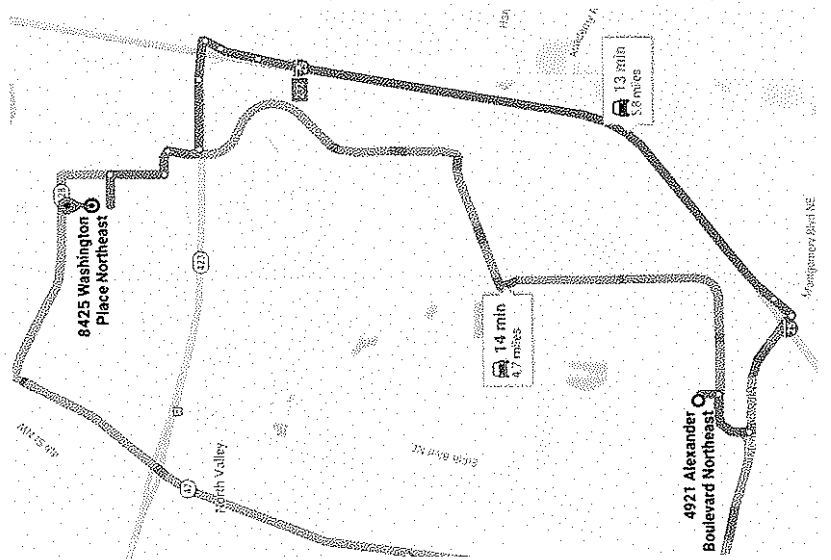
