

JUST FOR SENIORS!



WEBSITE: Did you know there's a page on the <u>EHS Counseling website</u> that's <u>Just for Seniors</u>? Here you'll find info on FAFSA/college financial aid, scholarships, how to send transcripts to colleges through <u>Parchment</u>, and more. Don't miss the many other Counseling website pages re: <u>college info</u>, <u>career resources</u> and opportunities such as <u>apprenticeships</u> and <u>training in the trades!</u>

SCHOLARSHIPS: The Albuquerque Community Foundation is the source of many college scholarships for NM students. Their online application is now open and deadlines are April 6, with some exceptions. Seniors: create an account, then do a brief questionnaire to see which scholarships you might qualify to apply for. The Manuel Lujan Scholarship, worth \$2,000 over 4 years, will be awarded to one EHS student who will attend a NM college or university. The \$800 Bryan Cline Scholarship is also guaranteed to one EHS Varsity Soccer female player and to one male player. There are many other scholarships listed on the EHS Counseling website, and APS scholarship spreadsheet, and you can also sign up for a scholarship search engine (listed on this page). Lastly, check with the college of your choice to make sure you've been awarded the best possible scholarships you qualify for!

NEW EHS SCHOLARSHIP: The \$1,000 Louis Ducharme Kindness Award will be given to one Eldorado senior each year. This award was established by Louis' family to honor his spirit of kindness. EHS staff will nominate students for this honor and the recipient will be announced @ May 15 Honors Assembly!


FREE COLLEGE IN NEW MEXICO: If you decide to stay in NM for college — whether at a 2-year school like CNM or at a traditional 4-year college or university — you are entitled to the new Opportunity Scholarship. This covers all tuition and fees for up to 8 semesters of college, IF you attend school full-time and keep up a 2.5 GPA. You will also qualify for the Lottery Scholarship starting the second semester, which covers "a portion of tuition and fees" (amount decided each year by NM Legislature and communicated by colleges) for up to 7 semesters, IF you attend school full-time and keep up a 2.5 GPA. There is no application for the Opportunity or Lottery Scholarships; your NM institution of higher learning will automatically award you the money IF you meet the requirements! Some combination of Opportunity & Lottery funds will make it so that your tuition and fees are covered; this money does NOT go toward room & board (housing and meal plans) or other expenses. That's where any additional scholarships and FAFSA you may qualify for funds kick in. Questions? Contact the financial aid department of the NM college or university of your choice.

FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) is an <u>online application</u> for potential federal government financial aid (read here about possible <u>grants</u>, <u>loans</u>, <u>work study jobs and scholarships</u> available through FAFSA). There is free, expert, VIRTUAL FAFSA help available every Monday afternoon from 3 - 6 PM. If you're stuck while trying to fill out the FAFSA and have questions, you can call the FAFSA helpline at 1-800-4-FED-AID or log onto to <u>FAFSA Money Mondays</u>!

DUE DATE: Feb. 10, 2023: Optimist Oratorical (Speech) Contest. \$2,500 (if you win at the local level and then at District level). Open to all students younger than age 19 as of Oct. 1, 2022. **Speech topic: "Discovering the Optimism within Me".** To apply: fill out <u>application</u> (can pick up paper copy from Ms. Velhagen), and email or drop off application along with proof that you are under 19 (must be copy of passport or birth certificate) to Ms. Velhagen at: velhagen@aps.edu by **Feb. 10, 2023**. You will present your speech in the EHS Lecture Hall on: date & exact time to be announced (sometime in Feb. or March 2023). Read the detailed instructions on the application form very carefully. **ELDORADO STUDENTS HAVE WON \$2,500!**

DUE DATE: Feb. 10, 2023: Optimist Club Essay Contest. \$2,500 (if you win at the local level and then at District level). Open to all students younger than age 19 as of Oct. 1, 2022.
