



**NCAA Acknowledgement & Parent/Student Statement of Understanding:**

If your student is thinking about participating in collegiate athletics it is required that they register with the NCAA Eligibility Center at [www.eligibilitycenter.org](http://www.eligibilitycenter.org). The Eligibility Center determines a student’s initial eligibility in collegiate athletics. The Eligibility Center will use a combination of high school transcripts and standardized test scores to determine whether or not a student-athlete will be eligible. They will also determine a student’s amateurism eligibility based on a set of questions the student must answer. In order for student’s to be eligible for competition they must be certified by the Eligibility Center. [Review the approved high school courses for NCAA on the Eligibility Center website by entering the school’s code 320023](#). Only the NCAA approved courses will be calculated into the required GPA. Students and guardians are responsible for achieving and protecting their eligibility.
