Senior Conferences

Graduation Requirements

• A student must complete <u>*all*</u> twenty-six graduation requirements before the graduation ceremony in order to participate.

• Special note: if you have not <u>completed</u> Health before the start of the second semester, you will be enrolled in that class at Lafayette.

University of Kentucky

- Stats from UK's freshmen class, fall 2019:
 - Applicants: over 22,000
 - Enrolled: approx. 6,000
 - Average ACT composite was 25.9; mid 50% was 23-29
 - Average weighted GPA was 3.77; mid 50% was 3.41-4.14
- Be careful not to assume that UK admission is a guarantee.

Financial Aid

- Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) worksheets will be available in the guidance office in September. The FAFSA may be submitted online beginning October 1st.
- There is a FAFSA workshop, via Zoom, on Tuesday, September 28th, 6 p.m., with *The College Project*. Register at their website <u>www.thecollegeprojectky.com</u>.
- Some selective colleges use the Profile instead of the FAFSA. Profile forms are available at <u>https://cssprofile.collegeboard.org/</u>.

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Kentucky Educational Excellence Scholarship (KEES)

- Students must have a 2.5 unweighted GPA for a particular year to earn KEES money.
- The only classes that are given weighted credit <u>for KEES</u> are AP and Dual Credit courses (not Adv.).
- The student's highest ACT composite is used for KEES calculation.
- Students must earn at least 5 credits each year of high school to qualify for KEES money.
- You might not need to pass all classes to graduate, but you might need them all for KEES money.
- If you are planning to graduate at the end of first semester, at least 3 credits must be earned, but all credits for graduation must be earned by the end of the first semester.
- And, graduating a semester early means the five year "KEES Clock" starts the January after December graduation.

Kentucky Higher Education Assistance Authority

- Students should create an account at <u>www.khcaa.com</u> to get information on scholarships, access KEES account, etc.
- Go to "Sign In" at the top of the screen to sign in or create a free account.
- It's very important to complete this task as any errors in your KEES account can be rectified before you are a college student.
- Note: A social security number is necessary to receive KEES money.

ACT/SAT/KYOTE

- If you are going to college and have not met the benchmarks on ACT, it is very important that you retake it in October to meet application deadlines. Deadline for the October 22nd ACT is September 16th.
- Register online at <u>www.actstudent.org</u> for the ACT and <u>www.collegeboard.com</u> for the SAT.
- KYOTE practice test meeting is September 1st in the Media Center during school hours. Mr. Sims and Ms. Schoff will contact those who need to attend.
- The official KYOTE test is offered once in the fall and once in the spring to those who have not met state ACT benchmarks.
