A unique and high-level service option for academically and intellectually gifted and talented students, this program offers:

- » Gifted and Talented endorsed teachers
- » Accelerated content and pace
- » Enriched learning environment
- » Differentiated content, process, and products
- » Opportunities for lateral explorations, research, and constructing connections
- » High-level critical and creative thinking
- » Project-based learning
- » Interaction with like-minded peers

ENTRANCE CRITERIA

Eligibility requires Gifted and Talented identifications in the areas of:

- » General Intellectual Ability
- » Language Arts
- » Mathematics

CURRENTLY ENROLLED FCPS students do not need to apply, as school-level committees review and recommend students from their schools for the program. Decisions are based on the interest, needs, and abilities of students and results of assessments, which lead to gifted identifications.

Families and students who are NOT CURRENTLY ENROLLED must apply during the district wide application window. Assessments will be coordinated individually with families during the month of November by the coordinator of Gifted and Talented Education.

Students are offered program placement based on their primary residence to Ashland Elementary, Meadowthorpe Elementary, Tates Creek Elementary, Tates Creek Middle, or Winburn Middle.

The VAPA (Visual and Performing Arts) Pathways at LTMS is where high interest in the Arts meets challenging academic preparation for High School. Students will be challenged academically through rigorous, high interest programming and pedagogy. LTMS provides 1:1 Chromebooks enabling 21st century learning for all students. The VAPA Pathways at LTMS includes enrichment and exploratory learning options in the arts, along with true arts integration into core academic areas of study. Our students will develop strong appreciation of the arts, experience performance opportunities; and develop critical thinking, collaboration, communication, creativity, technology, and researching skills to prepare them for High School. Visual and performing arts programming allows students to take courses tailored toward the development and expansion of the skills and knowledge necessary for growth in their area of talent and passion. LTMS aligns their accelerated core content courses to Kentucky High School Academic Standards, allowing LTMS students numerous opportunities to earn High School Credit during their Middle School experience.

This program is a continuation program for students from the Maxwell Elementary Dual Language Immersion Program. Spanish language skills and global perspectives continue to grow through the studying of academic content. Content varies per grade level and may include science; Spanish levels 1, 2, and 3; math; and social studies. BSMS's Spanish Immersion program is a certified International Spanish Academy.

ENTRANCE CRITERIA

Fifth grade students currently enrolled at Maxwell will indicate their intent for continuation during the winter scheduling process. Likewise, students at school-based immersion programs, Liberty and Cardinal Valley, wishing to enter the district Dual Language Immersion program for the following school year will indicate their intent during the winter scheduling process.



Any FCPS student from other schools/ programs wishing to enter the district Dual Language Immersion program for the following school year should apply using the district online application during the open window period in January. Entrance is determined by availability of space, demonstration of Spanish language proficiency at benchmark levels, and demonstration of similar language skills in English.

ENTRANCE CRITERIA The Academy of Information Technology is the longest established career academy at BSHS and district-wide, and is a NAF certified academy. This academy is for students who have an interest in Information Technology—the fastest growing employment opportunity in the nation. The courses offer a wide range of computer science skills with an emphasis on 21st century success skills. This learning environment will encourage students to become leaders through projects and work-based learning experiences in the classroom and through job shadowing, internships, guest speakers, field trips, and student-led community projects. There are three pathways offered in the IT Academy: computer programming, video and cinematography, and graphic design.

Student leadership organizations include Technology Student Association (TSA) and Student Technology Leadership Program (STLP). This academy also has an established dual credit partnership with BCTC and Northern Kentucky University to provide the opportunity to earn up to 12 credits in a university Informatics program.

DESCRIPTION



The IB Programme is an internationally recognized college preparatory program. Our students develop significant critical thinking skills, research skills, and analytical writing skills. IB students also complete four years of a world language along with college level English, Math, History, Biology and/or Chemistry courses. The pre-diploma program offered to freshmen and sophomores is designed to prepare our students to move forward into the IB Diploma Programme for juniors and seniors. IB teachers are trained and moderated by the IB organization and IB students are taught to international standards. IB Diploma Candidates complete a research paper guided by their interests known as the Extended Essay. They also submit a portfolio reflecting on creative, active, and service experiences (CAS) through extracurriculars. Students can earn college credit through their IB course scores.

The IB Diploma Programme at Tates Creek is one of only four high school IB Programmes in the state and is the only IB Diploma Programme in Fayette County.

DESCRIPTION



ENTRANCE CRITERIA

The Project Lead the Way (PLTW) Biomedical Sciences Magnet Program is a four-year program designed to challenge and engage students interested in pursuing a career in the science field, which includes but is not limited to: medicine, nursing, biomedical science, biology, biochemistry. PLTW is a nationwide curriculum that provides a transformational educational experience through hands-on learning. It empowers students to develop in-demand knowledge and skills needed to thrive in the 21st century. Success in the Biomedical Sciences Magnet Program will require ability, interest, commitment, and maturity. Coursework moves at a faster pace and is more challenging than traditional high school courses; thus, Biomedical Sciences students will be working at the college level during all four program years.

Rising 9th grade applicants must meet the following qualifications:

- » Resident of Fayette County
- » Currently in the 8th grade
- » Has completed or currently enrolled in Algebra 1 with an A or B, with exceptions for those students whose middle school does not offer Algebra 1 (In these cases, students must have an A or B in their current math class.)
- » Maintains a B or higher in their current science class(es)
- » Complete the online application

Students must demonstrate being on grade level via MAP Math and MAP Reading scores. (MAP Math: 222+. MAP Reading: 212+.)

Students are accepted through a lottery process.

DESCRIPTION



This program is one of FCPS's highest levels of service for academically and intellectually gifted and talented students. The Liberal Arts Academy serves as the continuation program for students in the gifted accelerated program at Tates Creek and Winburn middle schools while also admitting qualified students new to the gifted program.

The academy challenges its students in all disciplines with required academy and AP courses that are specifically designed or adapted for the academy's GT students. The program of studies is designed to stimulate and extend student learning in all core areas plus world language. All students also have the opportunity to earn the AP Capstone Diploma as part of the required course of studies. The AP Capstone courses equip students with the academic writing and independent research skills sought after by colleges. Seniors will complete the AP Capstone research study in an academic area of their choosing. Students graduate with a diverse range of academic skills preparing them to move successfully on to any academic major in college.

ENTRANCE CRITERIA

Entrance is determined through an application process, academic benchmarks, and nationally normed test scores in reading, math, and cognitive development.

For 8th grade students in the gifted accelerated program at Winburn and Tates Creek middle schools, no application is required. Gifted accelerated program students receive an "intent to continue" form via email in the spring.

Applications for rising 9th and 10th grade students are made through the district online application. Applications for rising 11th and 12th grade students will not be accepted.

DESCRIPTION



MSTC is a four-year program designed to challenge and engage students who are intellectually gifted in the areas of math and science. As such, MSTC courses are faster paced and more challenging than traditional high school courses. In addition, MSTC students have the opportunity to take STEM classes not usually offered in high school.

MSTC students are required to complete a Capstone Research Project in official university laboratories over the course of their junior and senior years.

MSTC seniors present their research at science fairs and national conferences, and are often published in professional journals. MSTC students are also required to take an additional early-morning class all four years.

Each year, MSTC seniors are awarded in excess of \$13 million in college scholarships and are accepted to the most prestigious schools in the country. Roughly half of MSTC seniors are named National Merit finalists, have an average ACT score of 34, and complete an average of 12 AP courses over their four years in the program. The MSTC program is nationally recognized.

ENTRANCE CRITERIA

Entrance to MSTC is determined through an application process, admissions test, and nationally normed test scores in science and math. Applications for any rising 9th or 10th grade student are made through the district online application. Applications for rising 11th and 12th grade students will not be accepted.

DESCRIPTION



This is FCPS's highest level of service for gifted and talented students formally identified in the creative and performing arts. Emphasizing the arts while providing a solid academic foundation, this performing arts school offers advanced and college-preparatory classes in 10 arts areas: Art, Ballet, Band, Contemporary Dance, Theatre, Technical Theatre, Literary Arts, Piano, Strings, and Voice.

SCAPA Lafayette provides students the opportunity to further develop and enhance their artistic abilities in a setting that emphasizes the arts while providing an outstanding academic foundation in a comprehensive high school setting. Students who attend SCAPA Lafayette take two classes per year in their arts area in addition to their academic courses. The full range of extra-curricular and athletic activities available at Lafayette are open to SCAPA students. Students can also explore other arts disciplines through elective courses. Together, Lafayette and SCAPA have a dynamic and positive culture that is inclusive and supportive of student artists.

ENTRANCE CRITERIA

Entrance is determined by an audition process in one of the arts areas. Additional documentation including a recommendation and student questionnaire is required. Because of the size of Lafayette High School, SCAPA Lafayette typically has more capacity than is available at SCAPA in elementary and middle school levels.



This is a continuation program for students in the Bryan Station Middle School Dual Language Immersion Program. Students in the International Spanish Academy at Bryan Station High School experience a rigorous program with multiple AP courses offered in Spanish such as literature and language, as well as other Spanish courses such as biology, chemistry, Spanish IV and V, Freshman Seminar, and Dual Credit Spanish.

ENTRANCE CRITERIA

Eighth grade students currently enrolled in the district middle school Dual Language Immersion program will indicate their intent for continuation during the winter scheduling process.

Any rising 9th grade FCPS student (currently not in Immersion) wishing to enter the Dual Language Immersion program for the following school year will apply using the district online application during the open window period January.

Entrance is determined by availability of space, demonstration of Spanish language proficiency at benchmark levels, and demonstration of similar language skills in English.

Locust Trace AgriScience Center offers students worldclass agricultural education in Agricultural Engineering, Animal Science (including Agribusiness - Equine Studies, Food Science and Processing, and Pre-Veterinary Studies), Environmental Science and Natural Resources, and Plant Science. 




