Grading System: Students are ranked numerically and grade point average, (GPA) are figured on a 4-point system (shown below) based on coursework completed in grades 9-12. GPA is weighted based on AP or Honors courses. Any course designated AP or Honors is awarded an additional .025 per semester.

Graduation Requirements: Students earn one half credit for each class completed at the end of the semester grading period. Students do not earn credit for failing grades (F), withdraw fail (WF), incomplete (I) or no credit (N). Students must earn a minimum of 25 credits to graduate, required credits include; 4 credits English, 3.5 Social Studies, 4 Math, 3 Science, 1 PE, .5 Health, 1 Practical/Fine Arts, 9 Electives, 1 Dual Credit/Advanced Placement/Honors/Distance Education.

Test Scores: The 2020-2021 figures have not been released yet. West Mesa- ACT- School Wide-16.5 District Wide-19.3; National- 20.6 SAT- School Wide- 990 District Wide- 1060; National- 1051

Post Secondary Plans: Upon graduation from the 2019-2020 School Year, 25.4%% of WM graduates continue their education at a 4-year school, 37.5% attend a 2-year post secondary school, 9.3% enter military service and 27.8% enter the workforce or are undecided.

Academic Letters/Honor Roll: Strive for excellence in academics and earn an academic letter for the current year by maintaining a 3.5 GPA or better for two consecutive semesters including the last semester of the previous school year. All students who receive a 3.5 or above (first honors) or 3.0 to 3.4 (second honors) will receive academic recognition each year.

Bilingual Seal Recognition and Honor Seal:

Criteria includes the following:

- 4 credits of Spanish courses (minimum GPA 2.0)
- 4 credits of English or ELD courses (minimum GPA 2.0)
- 4 core content credits taught in English (minimum GPA 2.0)
- 4 core content credits taught in Spanish (minimum GPA 2.0)
- GPA of 2.5 for Recognition or 3.5 for Honors

Portfolio Requirements:

Oral presentation, assessing use of both languages

Written reflections with work samples, assessing use of both languages

Cultural proficiency component

Panel of community/staff members, with a minimum of 3 members

Community Panel:

Evaluators must be proficient bilinguals and shouldn't be the students' teachers or recent graduates of school.

Schools should communicate with one another to avoid scheduling portfolio presentations on the same day.

Language Assessment:

Students must achieve a minimum score of 28 points total, in the oral and written categories combined, in order to earn the Seal, 50% of the written portfolio must be written in English and 50% of the portfolio must be in Spanish, 50% of the oral presentation must be written in English and 50% of the oral presentation must be in Spanish.
