



 I'm not anti-college or four year degree, I'm pro finding what you are good at, what you are interested in, what you value and turning that into a career because I feel that will make life more fulfilling and enjoying that process and not rushing it.

Career Options & Dual Credit, ACT, SAT & ASVAB

- There are also many other types of career options, like military, apprenticeships or working within a 16 month frame before going to school, or moving up in a company. These are really good options and can lead to developing a craft with skills and it is viable.
- Military Entrance Exam is ASVAB, that is usually held in November..
- SAT & ACT held in various times during the year, and you can register at anytime in the year before certain deadlines.
- Students can always look into taking Dual Credit Classes at WMHS or off-site. I always recommend students taking the Accuplacer for scores for certain classes. DC classes are offered through UNM & CNM

- There are many professions where you can make a living just getting a two year degree (Skilled Trades, Nurse, Other various health sciences)
- There are many professions where you can make a living where either a four year degree or even 6-7 year degree with a masters is required (Educator, Engineer, Doctor, Business)

- How early you apply to school (Most you can apply through a school website or <u>Common App</u>):
 - -The earlier the better! Regardless of Test Scores which COVID Impacted (Test Optional). However ALL Juniors are going to take the SAT April 2023 at School!
- GPA for both admissions and scholarship purposes: Once you get admitted they will look to see what institutional scholarship you qualify for based off GPA and how to redeem the scholarship.
- For Example: If I qualify for the bridge with a 3.2 GPA for UNM I will get \$1000 of tuition, and the following spring if I get a 2.5 GPA in my five classes, I will get the lottery at \$3444 off every semester there, after as long as I maintain a 2.5 GPA.
- We don't know about Opportunity Scholarship Updates just yet from legislation.

Financial Aid & Outside Scholarships & FAFSA



Everything you will need to find for Financial Aid & Scholarships is located on the Financial Aid & Scholarships Page on the College & Career Site:

- For Outside Scholarships always consider: Deadlines, Conditions, Heritage Requirement, GPA, if it needs an essay or test requirement and what the amount is. Usually anything outside is additional. There are also various Drawings with APS Foundation Varsity Drawing, College Board Opportunity Scholarships as well as Scholarship Engines on the website. I can help make sense of everything.
- FAFSA opens October 1, 2023 for current Juniors. This is done Senior Year to see if a student qualifies for a federal pell grant. This can range from \$0-\$6495, depending on household income.
- A student and a parent do an <u>FSA ID</u> to verify info and log in to <u>FAFSA Application</u>
