# **DISTRICT NEWS**

STMA continues to rank 325 out of 327 in per pupil revenue in the state. With no significant changes from the state in the funding formula, and no sustainable local revenue to offset this disparity, STMA must plan for next school year, prioritizing its students while managing the district's budget for the long-term. These decisions will impact all STMA students and families.


## So how did we get here?

Enrollment drives the funding formula. In the last three years, enrollment growth has stabilized and since 85% of our funding is from the state and is largely based on student enrollment, we are experiencing significant budget shortfalls. With this new reality, we must plan ahead.

To address budget shortfalls, the district is in the midst of making decisions that will impact students, staff, families, and the community for the foreseeable future. This spring, the district cut \$1,317,500 for next school year. These cuts are in addition to the \$6 million in budget cuts during the last

two budget cycles and the 78 staff reduced in the last 18 months.

After carefully reviewing staff recommendations and input from district stakeholders, the school board made difficult decisions to balance next year's budget.



## Budget shortfalls will result in:

- Increased class sizes
- Expanded walk zone
- Increased student activity fees
- Increased facility rental fees
- Increased high school parking fee
- Credit card user fee
- Deferred maintenance projects
- ▲ Paused staff professional development
- Increased open enrollment transportation fees

Future budget projections are bleak and without a sustainable and predictable source of local revenue deeper cuts are ahead. Recently, the school board formed an Operating Referendum Steering Team to explore the possibility of an operating levy in November 2022. This team will study enrollment and budget projections, examine options, and make a recommendation to the school board in June.

In the interim, we will continue to strongly advocate with state leaders for equitable funding for STMA students, staff, families, and taxpayers. We are hopeful that a portion of the state's \$9.25 billion surplus will be allocated to STMA. Please consider advocating for legislation that supports STMA. Budget reductions are difficult and we understand the impacts they have on our students, staff, families, and the community. Together, we will navigate our challenges by putting students first and with an abundance of transparency, creativity, and compassion. We remain committed to our vision of educating the whole child with excellence in academics, arts, activities, and athletics through the empowerment of a world-class staff. #knightspride
