

2018 Outstanding Alumni Award Daniel (Dan) Moul

Dan is a **1977** New Oxford High School graduate and a lifelong resident of Adams County. Dan studied finance at York College. In 2006, Dan became “The Honorable” Dan Moul upon his election to represent the citizens of the 91st Legislative District in the Pennsylvania House of Representatives.

A strong advocate for government reform, Das has consistently fought for meaningful tax reform and measures to protect the safety and welfare of children.

He serves as vice chairman of the House Children and Youth Committee on which he worked to pass a package of child protection legislation stemming from the Sandusky child sex abuse case and measures to strengthen Pennsylvania’s child support laws.

Dan is a charter member of “People Who Care Inc.”, a non-profit charitable organization in Adams County dedicated to helping people in their time of need. In 2017, the Pennsylvania Partnerships for Children honored him with its Champion for Children award in recognition of his support for child protection. He was the sponsor of Act 104 of 2008, which gives Pennsylvania the ability to extradite so-called deadbeat parents, who move out-of-state to avoid paying child support, back to Pennsylvania for prosecution. His legislation also increased the penalties for willful non-payment of court-ordered support.

In the 2015-16 Legislative session, Dan was named vice chairman of the House Game and Fish Committee, and he will continue to serve on the Agriculture and rural Affairs and Tourism and Recreation Development committees. He also serves on the Interstate Commission on the Potomac River Basin.

Prior to being elected to the House, Dan spent 20 years as owner operator of his own real estate management and renovation business. Before that he worked in the sales division of Hanover-based Utz Quality Foods.

Dan’s hobby is flying! He is a licensed pilot of thirty-one years, with an Instrument Flight Rule (IFR) Certification to fly high performance, complex aircraft.

Dan and his wife Lori live in Conewago Township, Adams County. They have two adult children and one grandchild.
