Krum ISD Accountability

House Bill 5 (HB 5) of the 83rd Texas Legislature Regular Session added Section 39.0545 to the Texas Education Code (TEC). TEC § 39.0545 requires that each school district assign ratings of Exemplary, Recognized, Acceptable, Unacceptable or Not Applicable for the district and for each campus on both overall performance and each of nine factors related to community and student engagement. The nine factors are:

- fine arts
- wellness and physical education
- community and parental involvement
- 21st Century Workforce Development programs
- second language acquisition programs
- digital learning environment
- dropout prevention strategies
- educational programs for gifted and talented students
- compliance with statutory reporting requirements.

How are those ratings for overall performance calculated?

A 27 closed question survey is sent out to parents and community members in the spring semester of each year that covers each of the components in the statute. The results for each area tabulated per campus and given a rating as follows:

Each question can be responded to as yes, no, or n/a.

The district rating is taken from the total campus ratings. KISD is rated based on 5 campuses. Each campus has the capacity to earn 81 points for a maximum total of 405 points.
