Students must be enrolled in five (5) academic classes each semester; four (4) of the five (5) classes must be core courses from within the subjects of English, History, Math, Science, and World Language.

Advanced courses receive 1 bonus point when calculating weighted GPAs.

<u>Dunn Academic Graduation Requirements</u>

Dunn's academic graduation requirements are based on the commitment to our students' intellectual lives and their preparation for future academic challenges and life-long learning. Students must meet the departmental requirements and be enrolled in a <u>minimum of 5 academic classes each trimester</u>. Many Dunn students apply to the University of California system; every student who completes Dunn's minimum graduation requirements with grades of C- or higher will meet the UC subject area requirements. Students who aspire to attend highly selective colleges/universities should accept the highest level of academic challenge possible.

Dunn's graduation requirements provide a framework for learning by design and create flexibility for students to pursue courses that support their future goals.

To receive a Dunn diploma, students must complete their senior year at Dunn. The passing grades are A, B, and C. The failing grades are D and F. The UC system requires a C- or higher for classes used to determine admissibility.
