Course: Middle School Orchestra Grade Level: 5 Content Area: Music Frequency: Full-Year Course

#### **Big Ideas**

- 1. Students will gain an understanding of the string orchestra instruments—violin, viola, cello, and bass.
- 2. Students will learn and demonstrate correct body, left, and right-hand playing posture.
- 3. Students can identify the clef for their instrument and develop note reading skills.
- 4. Steady beat and rhythmic identification are developed and demonstrated.
- 5. Beginning dynamics are taught and exploration for dynamic demonstration is introduced.

#### **Essential Questions**

- 6. What is the role in the 5<sup>th</sup> grade orchestra?
- 7. Can correct body, left, and right-hand posture be demonstrated?
- 8. Can all the notes in first position be read and demonstrated?
- 9. Can steady beat and baseline rhythms by read and demonstrated?
- 10. Can baseline dynamics be identified and demonstrated?
