

Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA®) Completing & submitting the FAFSA is free and easier than ever. It gives you access to the largest source of financial aid to pay for college or career school. Many states and colleges use your FAFSA information to determine your eligibility for state and school aid, and some private financial aid providers may use your FAFSA information to determine whether you qualify for their aid.
