Consider the following in your reflection:

- What does "I post, therefore I am" mean to you?
- How does social media play a role in your life as a student? As a citizen?
- What are the benefits to posting and sharing?
- What are the challenges social media presents?

Be prepared to discuss the film in class as we redefine *genre* and acknowledge that social media is currently a salient *genre*.
