

Not only from the effects of a two-year pandemic, but also from mental health issues that have been steadily rising over the past decade and are now at a crisis level. Rates of suicide, self-harm, depression, anxiety, and hopelessness in kids are higher than ever, and parents and school districts are desperate for solutions and specialized support for their struggling teens.

ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT

When Daniel Armistead sits among the faculty and staff at LOGOS graduation, and watches students accept their diplomas, many of them sharing their personal stories with the audience and offering their heartfelt thanks, he can't help but be filled with gratitude. "I get to work with these students on a daily basis and support them the way I was supported," he says.

Now working as an Adolescent Therapist at LOGOS for more than two years, Daniel says he owes a lot of what he is today to LOGOS. "Actually, I probably wouldn't have made it without them; LOGOS quite literally saved my life."

"Daniel was a typical kid until around age 15, and then he started experiencing behavioral issues," says his dad, Jim. "He had become defiant and difficult to relate to, lost interest in everything, and in his junior year, decided he just wasn't going to school anymore."

"I knew Daniel was depressed and despairing," says Mary, his mom. "And there were things along the journey that told me he's giving up, but I didn't know there was an actual plan."

The plan, says Daniel, was to end his life. "There was a point in time that I just didn't want to live anymore; things didn't seem like they were ever going to get better." Call it divine intervention or an innate will to live, but "something" stopped him from following through and he told his parents that he was ready to "try that school." "I really wasn't sure what was going on with me or what I needed, but my school didn't have the resources to help me and I didn't know how to help myself, so I had to trust somebody."

"Of course, we wanted Daniel to get an education, to graduate, but most importantly, my goals were that he would discover that he had a lot to live for and a lot of gifts that should be used for the good of others," his mom said. "LOGOS was able to show him that."

Daniel says that caring is part of the culture of LOGOS. "There wasn't a person at LOGOS that didn't care. I'd never been anywhere with so many people that showed interest in each person individually and was accepting of them," he says. He also learned what depression was and the tools "I didn't know I had" to deal with it. "LOGOS became the medication I needed because I gained perspective, appreciation for what I had, and a sense of purpose."







At that time, his main purpose was to return to his former school and graduate on time. "They were skeptical because I'd burned a lot of bridges there, but Head of School Kathy Fenger and my therapist, Brian, showed up at my meeting with the school – over an hour drive, mind you – to advocate for me," says Daniel. "They didn't dwell on the struggles but focused on the positive and the future."

Of course, Daniel had no idea at the time that the future would one day lead him back to LOGOS, but "something" was guiding him. Today, he sits "on the other side of the desk" with a unique perspective. "I've been there," he says, "and I can tell students from experience that it can get better if you want it to, that people really care. So, don't give up."


