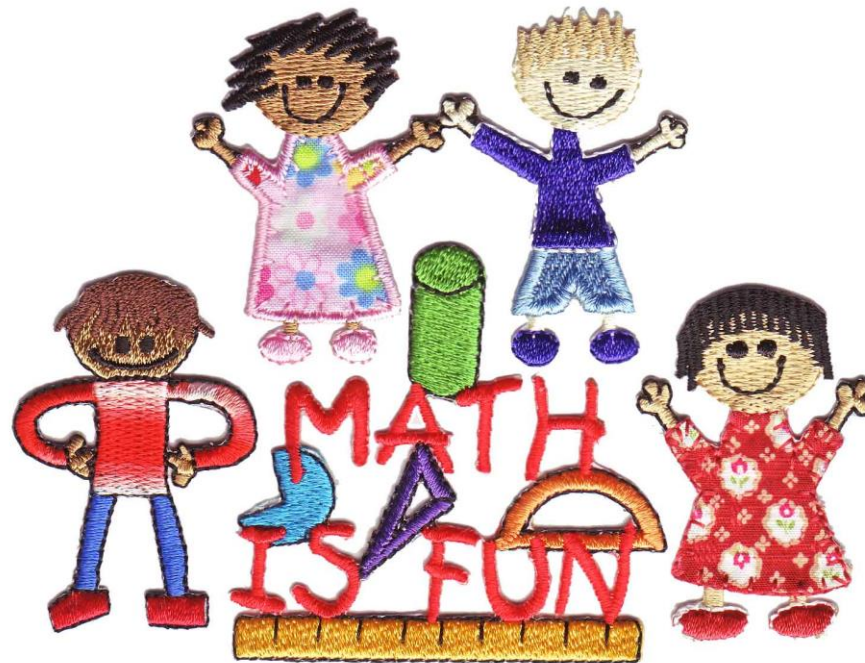

Feel free to do these activities more than once if you enjoy them. :-)



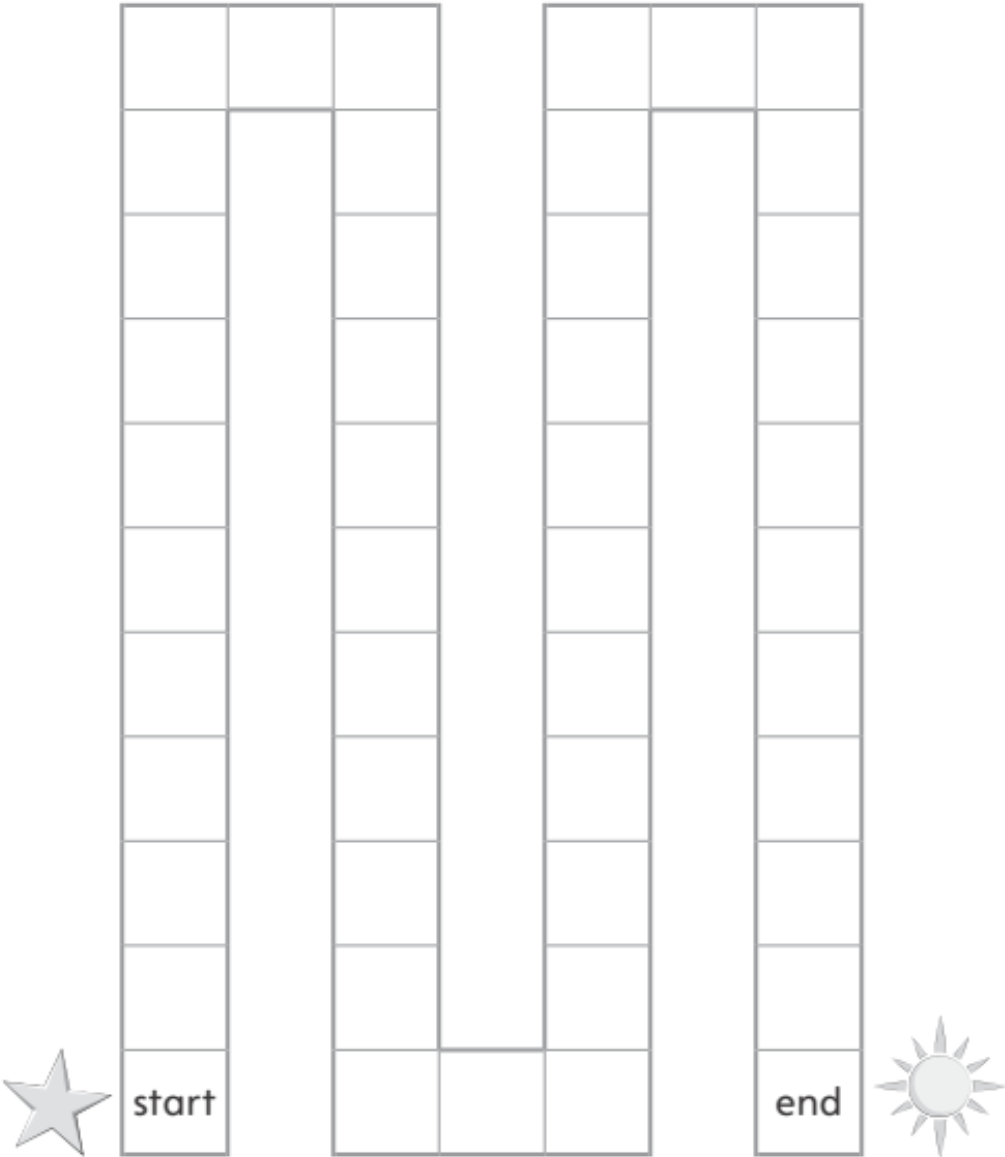
Future Grade 1 July Activities

Race to the Sun



Race to the Sun Directions and Materials

Deck of cards with face cards and cards 6-9 removed, Ace becomes #1

Place markers (same as number of players)

1. Decide whether you will add or subtract and then flip over two cards and complete the operation.
2. Move that number of spaces on the game board.
3. First marker to the end wins! Continue until all players reach the end.

Counting-on Game

Remove the face cards from a deck of playing cards (Ace becomes #1) and grab a dice.

1. The first player turns over a card and then rolls the dice.
2. The number on the dice indicates how far they “count on” from the card. (For example, a player turns over a three and rolls a four. They say, “Three: four, five, six, seven.”)
3. If the player gets it right, they keep the card, and the other player(s) get a turn.
