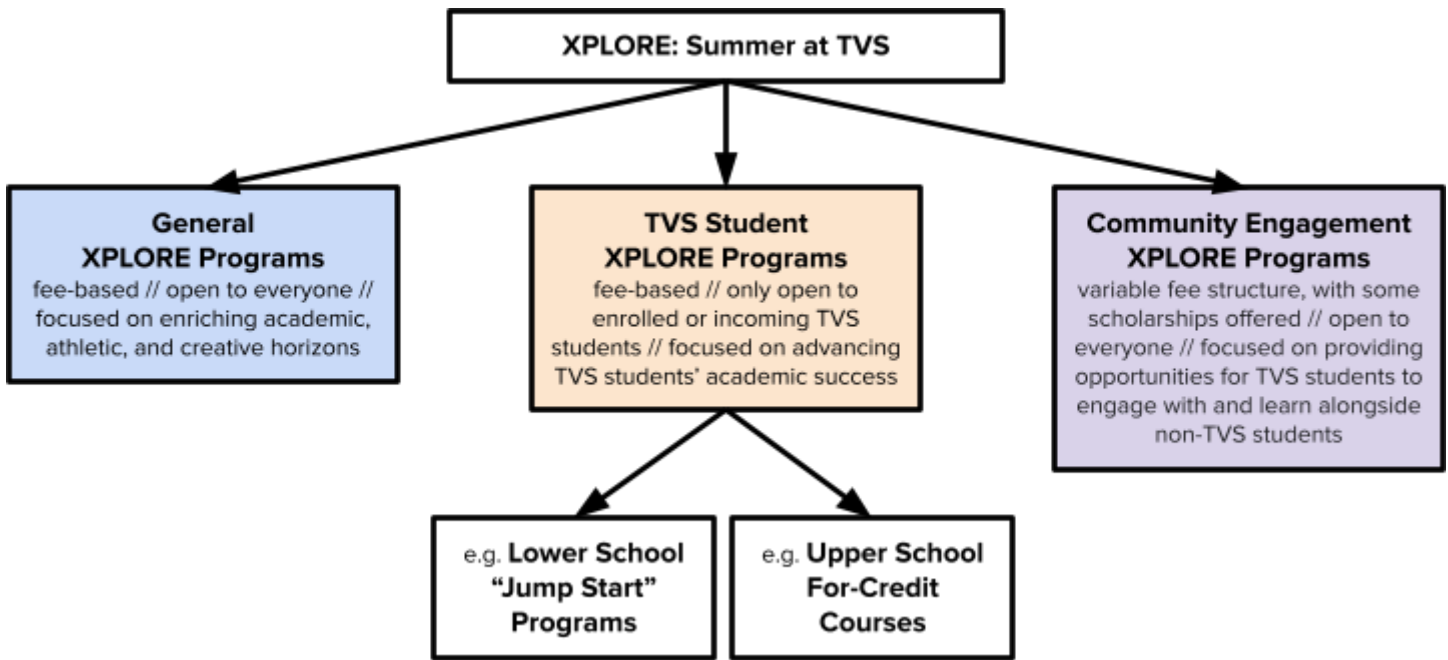
Similarly, we strive to create an environment in which all campers are **psychologically** safe. To do this we have:

- ❖ trained XPLORE administrators in Youth Mental Health First Aid.
- ❖ endeavored to organize our programming in such a way where no camper ever feels “lost,” i.e. where all campers know where to go and whom to trust.

– General Summer 2023 Logistics –

- Most camps will run for one week, for a half-day.
 - The morning session is **9am-12pm**, and the afternoon session is **12:30-3:30pm**.
 - *Certain camps - denoted in this Catalog - will follow nontraditional scheduling.*
 - There will be a supervised 30-minute “Lunch Bunch” at 12-12:30 p.m. each day, for campers attending both morning and afternoon camps. **Families must provide lunch for their camper(s)**, as we do not provide dining service over the Summer.
 - There will be a supervised “**Before Care**” at **8-9am** each day, for families who need to drop off earlier than the morning session start time.
 - There will be a supervised “**After Care**” at **3:30-5pm each day**, for families who need to pick up later than the afternoon session end time.

Simulations place a group of students in the shoes of diplomats, challenging them to think and speak about global issues from the perspective of another country's ambassador. To do this, we'll utilize MyDiplomat, a free educational resource that will connect students with world issues at the forefront of UN policy debate. MyDiplomat is a fun, interactive way to learn about the UN while practicing important skills such as decision making, effective communication and critical thinking. Students wishing to participate will need to bring either an iPad or Laptop computer to access the MyDiplomat platform.

In this online language study, emphasis will be placed on spoken and written personal expression. Literature selections will lead to in-depth discussions about Hispanic history and culture. This class requires a minimum of three students and all participants must have completed Spanish III. Plan for three online class sessions each week (45-60 minutes / session) with a significant amount of asynchronous work. Specific class times TBD by instructor once enrollment is complete.

(Note: This is an 8-week course, June 14 - August 9, with non-traditional timing, as described above.)

(Enrollment Cap: 17 TVS rising 11th graders, **with priority given to students seeking to enroll in AP Spanish Language and Culture** in 11th grade)



– Summer 2023 “Fine Print” –

- We will use the Auxiliary Programs Registration Site for program registration, billing, and en mass family communications.
- It is required for each family to have a profile in our system and current / valid credit card information loaded onto the site, so that any new charges and refunds may automatically be processed.

- All campers must be 4 years of age or older by the start of the Summer season (May 29, 2023).
 - An exception will be made for **admitted** incoming TVS PreKindergarten students. *Per Admissions policy, TVS PreKindergarten students must turn 4 years old by June 30, 2023. Thus, it is permissible for a 3-year-old to attend appropriate camps in the month of June, as long as they have been **admitted** to TVS PreKindergarten for the 2023-2024 school year.*
 - Our camps are designed for rising PreKindergarten through rising Twelfth Grade children.
- Regardless of age, it is **absolutely essential** that ALL campers are able to **use the restroom independently** for the duration of their participation in XPLORE: Summer at TVS programming.
 - This independence must include basic functions, proper toilet-flushing, and hand-washing skills.
 - Whereas we will certainly respect the dignity of all campers and their families, any camper that is found not to be independent in the restroom will be unregistered from remaining camps for the Summer.
- Additionally, it is **essential** that ALL campers **know their first and last name**. Whereas we wouldn't expect campers to keep track of name tags, we use camper names frequently throughout each day, e.g. roster matching at carpool, identification of Lunch Bunch and After Care groups, and any medical needs.
