



Our History

Created by the Idaho Legislature in 1997 and implemented in 1998, dual credit provides the option for students to earn college credits at a low cost by enrolling in college classes offered through a partnership between the high schools and Idaho's universities and colleges.

In 2012, LHS instituted a college rental textbook program that evolved into a free textbook rental program for college courses taught on our campus, saving our local families thousands of dollars every year.

Our dual credit program offers 47 transferable college credits within the classical high school experience for students in grades 11 and 12 with a 3.0 cumulative unweighted GPA.

Our mission is to give our graduates a debt-free head start on their college journey. In fact, over half of our students participate in Lakeland's dual credit program every year and graduate with a semester or more of college completed—debt free!
