
Overview Aeries Mobile Portal App

The Aeries Mobile Portal is a mobile app for Parents and Students to use to access Grade, Attendance, Contact, Demographic, and Aeries Communications information in a concise, mobile-friendly format. Parents, guardians, and students can use their preexisting Parent/Student accounts to gain access to their data. For those parents or students who do not already have accounts, the Aeries Mobile Portal will guide them through the account creation process.

The Aeries Mobile Portal honors the same Aeries security and portal options that affect the information available to the parents and students when they access the Student Portal on a browser.

The Aeries Mobile Portal Apps are available for both iOS and Android phones. For a basic overview that can be shared with parents, guardians, and students, please visit http://mkt.aeries.com/products-mobile-portal

There are several steps that the school district must complete in order for the parents or students to access their data through the Aeries Mobile Portal. These steps will be completed by Aeries Support for the hosted districts, but the non-hosted districts will need to complete these steps. Features - Class summary

Now you can celebrate that A+ as soon as the assignment is graded in Aeries! Clear, detailed and beautiful gradebook assignment readouts are always at your fingertips in Aeries Mobile Portal.

Main screen


When you view the Class Summary screen, you'll see a list of the student's classes. This list mirrors what you would see in the "Class summary" section of Aeries Web.

If available, a letter grade will be displayed on the right-hand side for each class, for a quick at-a-glance look at how the student is performing across all classes in the summary.

Grade color meaning




Cells that contain a letter grade like A - F will be shown color-coordinated. A+'s are bright emerald green, As and Bs will show on the greener side of the spectrum, and grades like Cs, Ds and Fs will show in a darker red color. This helps to provide you with additional at-a-glance understanding of student progress, without having to deeply analyze the class summary.



In the event that your course has a grade that isn't A through F or is some other unique grade mark (like AA or PR) the cell will simply show as blue.

Course assignment categories

Tap on any course shown in the class summary list to drill down to assignment categories for that course. Viewing assignments broken down by assignment category is useful for gauging specific areas of improvement or success for a particular student - e.g., perhaps they are under-performing when it comes to homework assignments, but generally excel in other areas.



Course assignment


Tap on any assignment category - or scroll down to and tap "Overall" to view all assignments together - to drill down to the assignment list for that category. For assignments that have already been graded, the assignment score will show.

While viewing a course's assignments, tap on the class name again to return to the main list of classes.

Assignment details

Tap on any assignment listed in the course assignments drilldown to open the **Assignment Details** screen. Here, you'll see information like:

- **Type** the type of the assignment
- **Description** any assignment description provided
- **Score** if graded, the assignment's score
- **Gradebook** the Aeries gradebook that the assignment comes from
- **Date assigned** the date it was assigned
- **Due date** the date the assignment must be submitted
- **Date completed** the date the assignment was marked completed in Aeries
- **Grading completed** the date when the assignment was graded
- **Comment** the comment entered into Aeries, if any



Features - Attendance

Parents and guardians get a birds-eye view of any absences or tardies on their student's record, helping them stay informed and maximize student success.

Main screen

When you view the Attendance screen, you'll see a running list of any and all absence records on file for the student, going as far back as the beginning of the year.


The date will be shown in the left-hand column and you'll either see an all-day description/code (if the absence is an all-day absence) or you'll see a period breakdown showing you when exactly the absence took place.

Attendance details - period attendance

Tap on a period-based absence record to open the absence details window. This will give you the full description of the absence.

All-day absence note

For all-day absence records, there is no drill-down details window because there is no additional information to display.



Features - Contacts

The Contacts screen offers a view displaying the student's contact information, so you can ensure it's correct.

Main screen

On the main list of contacts, you'll see all the people listed as the selected student's contacts. Underneath the contact's name, their relationship to the currently-selected student is shown (if available).


The date will be shown in the left-hand column and you'll either see an all-day description/code (if the absence is an all-day absence) or you'll see a period breakdown showing you when exactly the absence took place.

Contact details

Tap on a contact to see important information, like:

- Name the full name of the contact
- Work phone the contact's work phone number
- **Mobile phone** the contact's mobile phone number

• Address - the address on file for the contact



Features - Demographics

The Demographics screen offers a view displaying the student's demographic information, so you can ensure it's correct.

Main screen

On the Demographics screen, you'll be able to view the currently-selected student's basic profile information and some demographic information.

The screen outputs the information on file for the currently-selected student, drawing from Aeries' Student Demographics data.

Demographic information

On the Demographics screen, find data like:

- Name the full name of the student
- **School name** the name of the school the student attends
- **Permanent ID** the permanent ID of the student
- **Grade** the grade the current student is in (e.g. 4th grade)
- Age the age of the student in years
- **Birth date** the date of birth of the student
- **Teacher** the name of the student's teacher
- Address the residence (and mailing, if different) address of the student

Features - Aeries Communications

Aeries Communications note:

This section only applies to districts using Aeries' premium Communications service. If you are not a Communications customer, users in your district will not see the Communications list item on the main app navigation.

Now in the palm of your hand, the platform that facilitates simple and easy communication across classrooms, schools and districts. If your district has Aeries Communications enabled, you can access it directly through the Mobile Portal app!

Main screen


Opening Aeries Communications in the Mobile Portal app is a very similar experience to opening it in your smartphone's web browser from the Aeries Web portal. Communications has always been a great mobile-optimized experience, so the app strives to extend that experience to the app.

No login should be necessary when accessing Aeries Communications, as you'll be signed in using SSO (single sign-on) based on the credentials you used to log into the app.


Features - 'What if' grade calculator

With the 'what-if' grade calculator feature, parents and students can virtually adjust scores on pre-existing or future assignments and can even create new assignments teachers have not yet added to the gradebook. This makes it easier than ever to ask "what if?" and experiment with scenarios and outcomes, mapping out your final grade might be in advance.

Enabling 'what-if' mode

To use the feature, first navigate into the **Class Summary** section, and tap on a class. Notice the pencil icon that shows in the top right-hand corner - tap it to enable 'what if' mode. As a result, a blue banner should show towards the top of the screen, letting you know that 'what-if' mode is enabled.

Tap the "?" icon in the blue banner for more information about 'what-if' mode.



Virtually editing assignment scores


In a **Class summary** class, select an assignment category to view assignments (or tap "**Overall**" at the bottom to view all). With 'what-if' mode enabled, tapping an assignment brings up the 'what-if' menu.




Tap "**Edit**" to begin virtually editing the score of the assignment. If the assignment has a max value, the editor will appear as a slider. If not, it will appear as an input field you can edit manually by inputting a numeric score.

As you change the value, either by the slider or numeric input field, it will automatically update the grade fixed to the top of the screen.

Edited assignments show a blue pencil icon to denote that they have been virtually edited.




Assignments that cannot be virtually edited are shown with a red line through the pencil icon.



Virtually dropping an assignment


When you tap an assignment while in 'what-if' mode, you'll also see an option to 'drop' the assignment. This enables you to virtually remove a particular assignment, making it as though it was never entered into the gradebook. This is useful for experimenting hypothetical scenarios where a particular assignment never happened, and how that would affect your grade in a particular class.

Dropped assignments have a red trash can icon to denote the fact that they have been virtually dropped. They can be recovered by tapping on the assignment and tapping "**Recover**".



Adding a new virtual assignment

At the top of the list of assignments, a dashed box labeled "**Add 'what-if' assignment**" can be tapped to add a new virtual assignment.



NOTE: Dropping a virtual 'what-if' assignment that you created is permanent and you cannot recover it, unlike a like a real assignment that has been virtually dropped.

Features - Report Cards

The Report Card section offers a way to view your student's report cards on file.

Main screen

On the main list of report cards, you'll see all the report cards on file for the selected student. On each report card in the list, it shows which school its from, the year, grade, term, and date of report. Below that, it offers buttons to download the report card in any languages that it has been made available.

The report card itself is in the form of a PDF you can download to your mobile device. Once it's downloaded, you can email it or otherwise share it to yourself to view on a desktop computer.
