2019 - 2020 Expense Summary


Approx. \$3.2M was spent on Measure Z projects across Corte Madera and Ormondale

During fiscal year 2019-2020, \$2,115,206 was spent at Corte Madera primarily on planning, design and permitting for new construction, completing the restroom renovations, roofing upgrades, misc. repairs and renovation, and the new field house. At Ormondale \$842,966, was spent primarily on planning, design and permitting for new construction, roofing upgrades, HVAC replacement and general site improvement. Additionally, \$195,963 was spent primarily on program salaries, benefits and contracted services. The breakdown by project and campus is noted in the table below:

Measure Z Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee is pleased to present our 2nd annual report in this new format, detailing bond spending and project information for the 2019-2020 fiscal year.

This fiscal year was a productive one. We saw the completion of several projects including restroom renovations at Corte Madera, HVAC Replacements at both Ormondale and Corte Madera, and the demolition of the Corte Madera Field House. Work also continued on the planning and approval process for several new construction projects that are scheduled to start next year.

Our committee works closely with district staff and we would like to thank them for all their hard work that goes on every day to ensure that Measure Z Bond funds are spent in accordance with the ballot measure. Once again, the outside auditing firm Eide Bailly has certified that our district is in full compliance with Measure Z requirements that Bond proceeds be only spent for purposes set forth in the ballot measure and that no bond proceeds were used for teacher or administrator salaries or other non-Measure Z operating expenses.

We look forward to the next twelve months as we will see the new building projects go out for bid in early 2021 and the district expects construction to begin on these projects by mid-2021. Both our campuses will take on a new look and feel as they are transformed into 21st century learning environments. We anticipate a very busy year and our committee pledges to remain focused on our bond spending oversight responsibilities.

Overall project status

\$10.0M of general obligation bonds issued to date against the voter authorization of \$49.5M.

Since being authorized in November of 2018, \$3,563,376 has been spent on Measure Z projects of which \$2,307,024 has been spent on the Corte Madera campus and \$944,412 has been spent at Ormondale with the remaining \$311,940 dollars expended on general program management costs related to salaries, benefits and contracted services in support of the project.

What is Measure Z

\$49.5M bond measure to repair and upgrade Portola Valley Schools

Measure Z makes available \$49.5 million to repair and upgrade Corte Madera and Ormondale schools to support a 21st-century learning environment. The funds will be used to:

- Replace leaking roofs, plumbing and electrical systems
- Upgrade aging classrooms, labs and technology infrastructure to support academic instruction in math, science, reading, writing and the arts
- Upgrade outdated fire alarms, classrooms, facilities and security systems to improve school security and meet current safety codes
- Update educational facilities to keep pace with 21st century teaching and learning







Role of the Citizens' Oversight Committee

Inform public of the expenditure of bond revenues

The Portola Valley School District Board of Education established the Citizens' Oversight Committee to monitor expenditures of Measure Z to ensure that expenditures comply with the bond authorization approved by voters in Portola Valley. The seven volunteer members are appointed and serve a maximum of three two-year terms.

The committee is required to issue one report annually and meets up to six times per year. Each member is appointed at large or represents a segment of the community: senior citizens, parents, businesses, or taxpayers. We are honored and privileged to present to our community this 2019-2020 annual report as required by the Measure Z ballot measure.
