

Pre-AP World Literature (GIS)

Leonardtown High School

Our high school Pre-AP courses are specifically designed to meet the needs of students reading and writing above grade level. This includes reading and analyzing complex above-grade-level texts (both in class and independently), engaging in advanced research and writing activities, and learning and applying higher-level literary terminology, vocabulary, and analysis. SMCPS accelerated courses will provide students with strategies and tools they need to engage in advanced, high-level learning to develop the skills, habits of mind, and concepts necessary to succeed in advanced placement courses and achieve college readiness.

Each nine-week instructional unit will be anchored by two assigned extended texts and one self-selected, independent reading choice related to the unit theme, all of which students will be expected to "actively" read (i.e. take notes, underline, ask questions, etc.). With the exception of the self-selected independent reading, students will have access to these texts within the classroom; however, students are encouraged to have their own copies of the required texts next year, which will allow them to practice text annotation, read and re-read the texts outside of class, and reference them on culminating writing assessments. Many of these titles are available electronically.

Summer activities to prepare for your Pre-AP experience:

Start reading and annotating (connections, conclusions, questions) your self-selected independent reading book for Unit One, which will be due at the end of the second week of school.

Read additional books; several recommended lists are posted on the SMCPS Summer Reading Website.

Parents: review copies of the planned required texts for next year.
