

BASIC INSTRUCTIONAL PROGRAM

In each school maintained by the district, the curriculum shall be as provided by the Board of Education. Subjects within the curriculum shall be taught as provided for by the Board.

The contribution of racial, cultural, religious, and minority groups to all aspects of our history as a people and a nation shall be included in the total school curricula in grades kindergarten through 12, and a special course emphasizing the same may be offered in the high school.

Students are encouraged to plan for postsecondary opportunities during their secondary school years. Prior to a student's enrollment in ninth grade courses, the district will inform parents/guardians which high school courses meet CCHE (Colorado Commission on Higher Education) requirements for admission to institutions of higher education in Colorado.
