Pair of MG Seniors Participate in National JAG Competition in Florida

Months of preparation and hard work paid off for MG Senior Ashleah Levings who brought home a 2nd place victory in the category of Prepared Public Speaking at the National Career Development Conference in Orlando in April.

Levings and fellow MG Senior Kyndra Irwin headed to the Jobs for America's Graduates (JAG) National Competition in Orlando April 20-22. They were two of just 24 Ohio and 3,000 overall competitors. While there, the pair not only competed, but also participated in educational workshops; went to a college/career expo; listened to motivational speakers; saw a hypnotist and got to spend a day at Universal Studios.

On Thursday, they each presented their speeches. Their topic? "How has Jobs for America's Graduates (JAG) supported you in looking towards and preparing for the future?"

Under the local direction of JOG Job Specialist Gerry Hartman, Irwin and Levings prepared for this trip. After placing 1st and 2nd at the JOG District Competition.

"If you get the opportunity to be in JOG, do it," said

Levings. "It brings so many opportunities to kids. It's one of the few things we can do to academically challenges ourselves outside of the classroom."

Both Levings and Irwin plan to attend Kent State this fall where they will both be in the Honors program. Irwin will study Visual



Communication Design with hopes of becoming a Graphic Designer while Levings works towards a degree in Psychology to become a research psychologist.

The pair wish to thank their teachers, especially Mrs. Hartman and Ms. Pfeiffer for their support and all those who supported them financially and otherwise in getting them to Florida.



Curriculum & Development News

As we celebrate the end of the school year it is time to reflect on all the accomplishments of our staff and students and recognize their hard work. While nobody loves standardized testing, it is one way we measure academic achievement. We give 20 different Ohio State Tests each spring: 6 End Of Course (EOC) exams at the High School (Algebra 1, Geometry, Biology, ELA II, American History & Government), 6 grade level Math & English tests for grades 3-8, and 2 Science exams in 5th & 8th grade.

This year when the results arrived there was a lot to cheer about. The state refers to passing the test in terms of proficiency. The scores are rated 1-5, and scoring 3 or above is considered proficient. We had proficiency rates above the state average on 13 out of the 20 tests. We also improved our performance over last year's scores on 13 out of 20 tests, and for 15 of the 20 tests more than half our students scored proficient or better. We had 5 tests where students improved the proficiency rate by more than 20% over last year! It is clear we are recovering from the learning loss experienced during COVID closures and closing gaps.

The High School EOC exams also play an important role in Graduation. Students must show competency with their scores on Algebra 1 and ELA II, and can earn seals with their Biology and Social Studies Exams. 133 students met competency on at least one of the two required exams and 63 earned at least 1 seal. Individual student result reports will be mailed by our guidance counselors to each student during the summer.



MGMS 7th Graders Launch Catapults

The 7th grade Science students participated in the annual catapult launch project. The project is assigned to align with their medieval unit in Social Studies. The students must construct a catapult to launch a marshmallow under specific constraints.

The students participate in an initial launch and the top catapults then compete in a second day of competition to determine the winner. The following students advanced to the finals this year: Bailey Bault, Memphis Clapper, Zane Grandstaff, Dakota Kipp, Marshall Hand, Brycen Gabriel, Aiden Keller, Rigley Coniglio, Grayson Smith, and Shelby Hursey.

Zane Grandstaff (pictured right) ultimately took home the catapult champion title with a launch of 79.7 ft. His name will be displayed on the famous green jacket. Thank you to the students and their families for their continued support of this project. This was the 14th year of the catapult competition.

CBI Students Earn Ohio Means Jobs Seals



The MGMS Environmental Club wrapped up another successful year! We continue to raise awareness about issues impacting ecosystems and are taking on some beautification projects within the district.

In February, students repurposed recycled paper into handmade valentines with embedded seeds (so that they will grow when planted). Proceeds from the sale of these valentines were donated to the "Save Our Monarchs", an organization dedicated to the conservation of the Monarch Butterfly, which was added to the endangered species list in 2022.

March and April were spent germinating seeds for the purpose of converting the green space in the back of the school into a perennial pollinator garden (to attract monarchs and other pollinators). Students and staff were able to enjoy some Spring color along the side of the middle school, when the bulbs planted by club members last Fall started to bloom. We were able to transplant some of our seed starts into the green space behind the building in May and were fortunate to receive a donation of mulch from the village to aid us in this endeavor. The club intends to continue its efforts in the green space to make further improvements next year.


