About the Data



- Number of students that took the survey:
 - JES: 152 out of 171 (89%)
 - JMS: 226 out of 191 (118%) - one class accidentally took it twice
 - JHS: 197 out of 244 (81%)
- Percentages show the number of participants chose a 4 (agree) or a 5 (strongly agree) out of the total participants
- The data are direct screenshots of what we see. The data has NOT been altered or modified, other than adding the color coded boxes

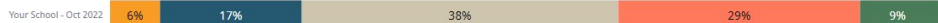

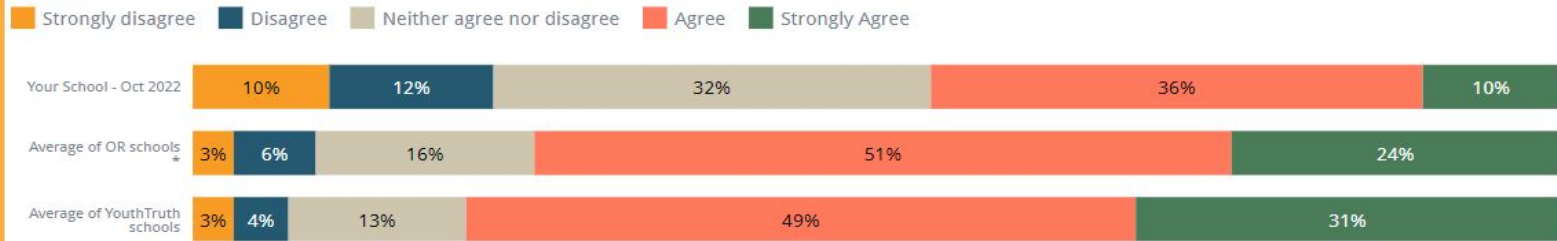

IN AN EMERGENCY TAKE ACTION

HOLD! In your room or area. Clear the halls.

STUDENTS
Clear the hallways and remain in room or area until the "Go Class" announcement.
Do business as usual.

SECURE! Get inside. Lock outside doors.

STUDENTS
Return to inside of building.
Do business as usual.

ADULTS
Bring everyone indoors.
Lock outside doors.
Access additional resources.
Account for students and adults.

LOCKDOWN! Locks, lights, out of sight.

STUDENTS
Get off the right.
Maintain silence.
Do not open the door.

ADULTS
Remain in room from hallway if possible.
Lock the classroom door.
Turn out the lights.
Move away from right.
Maintain silence.
Do not open the door.
Prepare to evacuate or defend.

EVACUATE! (A location may be specified)

STUDENTS
Remain silent or to be required to use the phone.
Follow instructions.

ADULTS
Remain silent or to be required to use the phone.
Notify if missing, extra or injured students or adults.

SHELTER! Hazard and safety strategy.

STUDENTS
Use appropriate safety strategy.
Follow instructions.

ADULTS
Use safety strategy.
Account for students and adults.
Notify if missing, extra or injured students or adults.

Hazard Safety Strategy
Tornado: Evacuate to shelter area.
Earthquake: Drop, cover and hold.
Fire: Get to high ground.

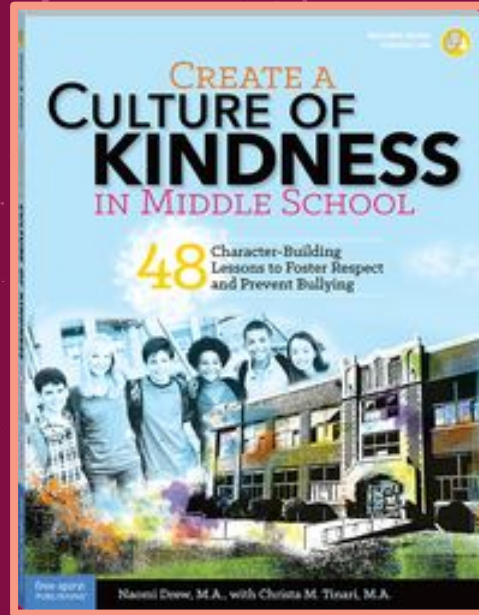
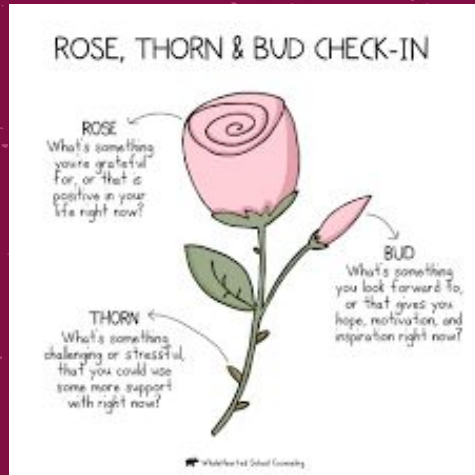

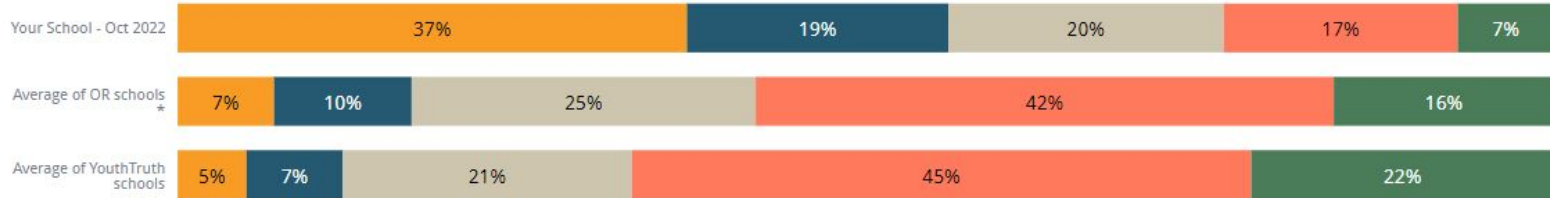

Do business as usual

ADULTS

Close and lock the door
Account for students and adults
Do business as usual



SECURE! Get inside. Lock outside doors.

STUDENTS

Return to inside of building
Do business as usual

ADULTS

Bring everyone indoors
Lock outside doors
Increase situational awareness
Account for students and adults
Do business as usual



LOCKDOWN! Locks, lights, out of sight.

STUDENTS

Move away from sight
Maintain silence
Do not open the door

ADULTS

Recover students from hallway if possible
Lock the classroom door
Turn out the lights
Move away from sight
Maintain silence
Do not open the door
Prepare to evade or defend



EVACUATE! (A location may be specified)

STUDENTS

Leave stuff behind if required to
If possible, bring your phone
Follow instructions

ADULTS

Lead students to Evacuation location
Account for students and adults
Notify if missing, extra or injured students or adults



SHELTER! Hazard and safety strategy.

STUDENTS

Use appropriate safety strategy for the hazard

Hazard
Seal the room
Earthquake
Drop, cover and hold
Tsunami
Get to high ground

MEAN.

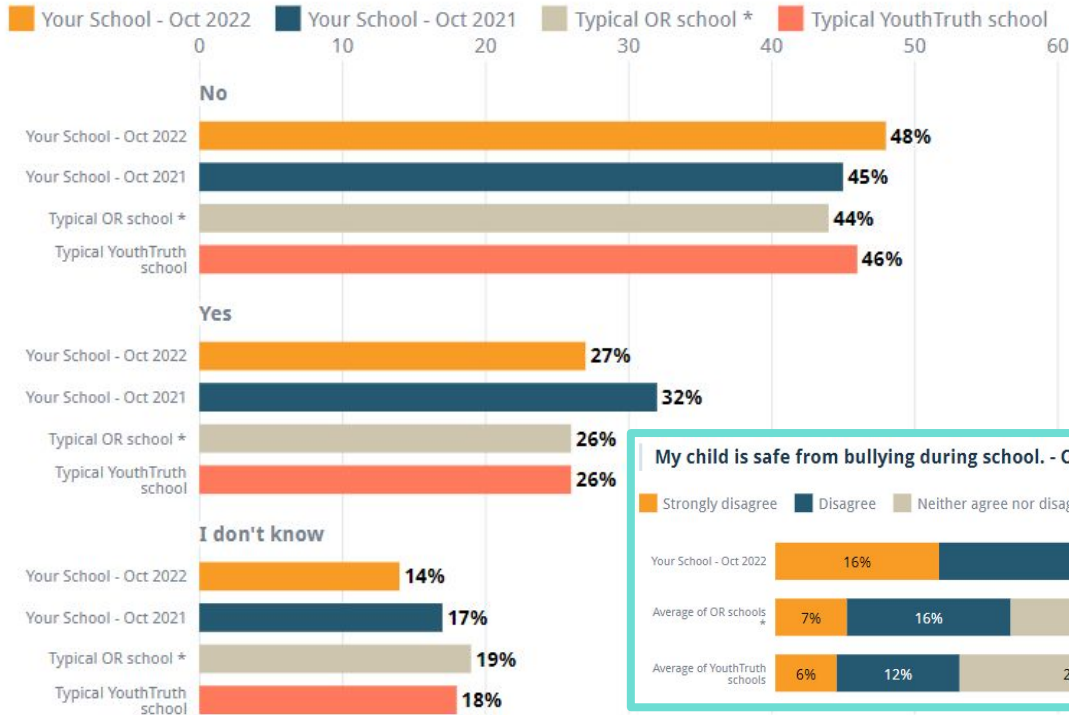
When someone says or does something *intentionally* hurtful and they *keep doing it*—even when you tell them to stop or show them that you're upset—that's
BULLYING.

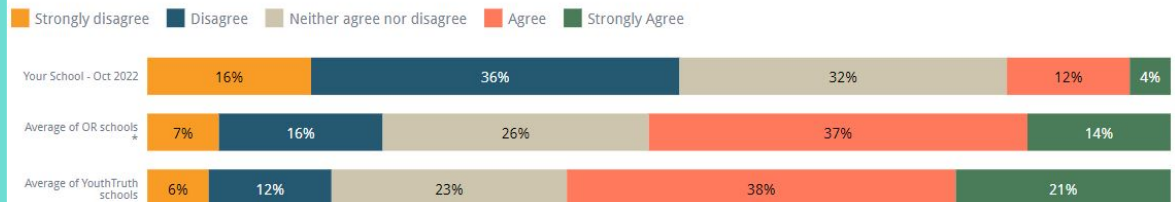

CONFLICT	RUDE	MEAN	BULLYING
Occasional	Occasional	Once or Twice	Is REPEATED
Not planned; in the heat of the moment	Spontaneous; unintentional	Intentional	Is planned and done on purpose
All parties are upset	Can cause hurt feelings; upset	Can hurt others deeply	The target of the bullying is upset
All parties want to work things out	Based in thoughtlessness, poor manners or narcissism	Based in anger; impulsive cruelty	The bully is trying to gain control over the target
All parties will accept responsibility	Rude person accepts responsibility	Behavior often regretted;	The bully blames the target
An effort is made by all parties to solve the problem			The target wants to stop the bully's behavior; the bully does not
Can be resolved through mediation	Social skill building could be of benefit	Needs to be addressed/ should NOT be ignored	CANNOT be resolved through mediation

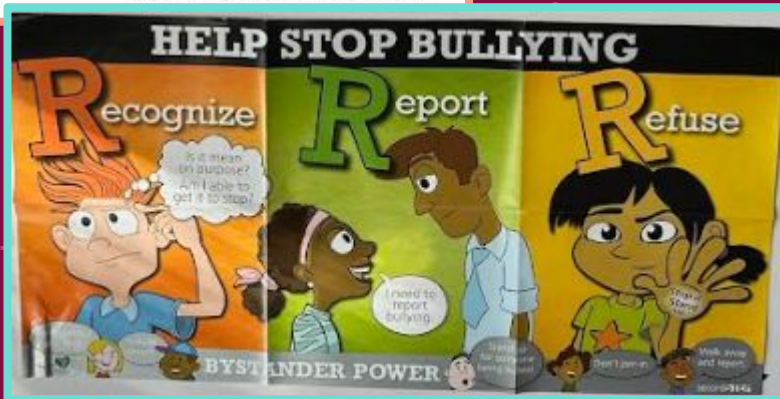

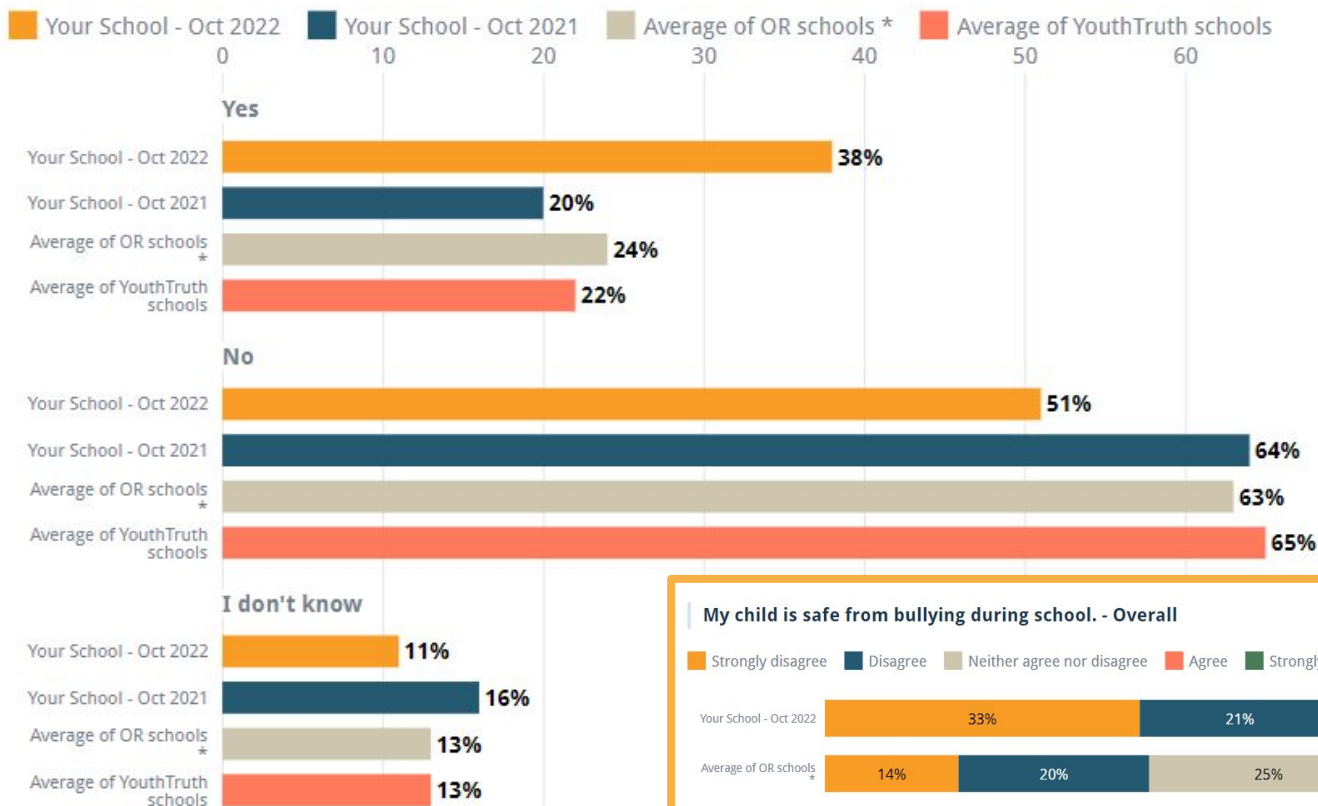

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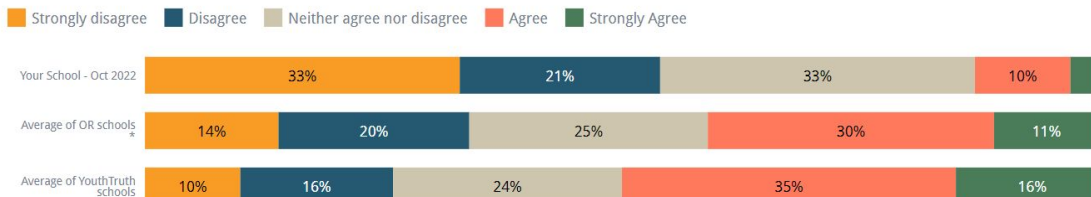

My child is safe from bullying during school. - Overall



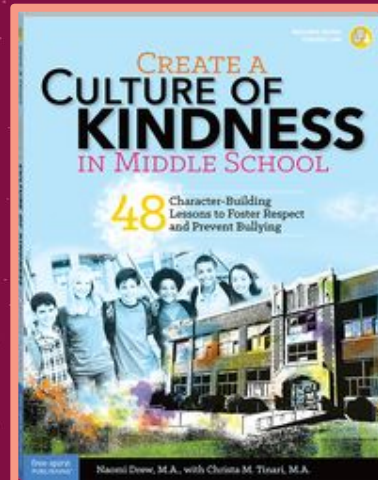

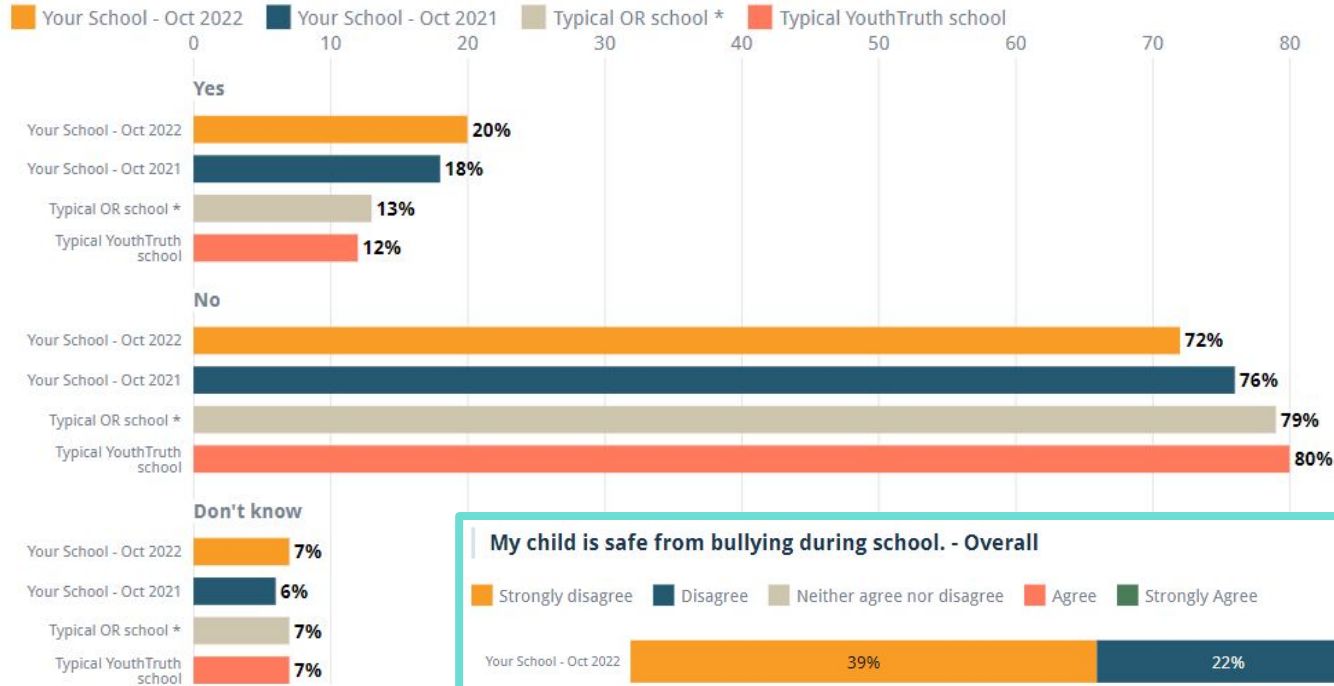

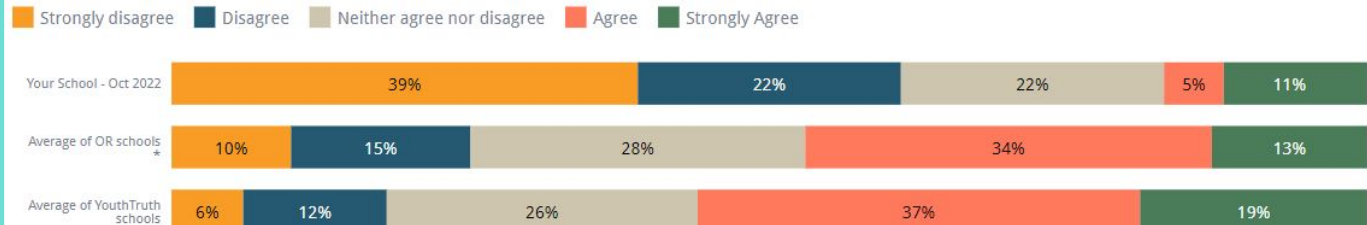
