

Southern Fulton High School Graduation Project for Class of 2024

Project Description: The Southern Fulton Graduation Project designed to encourage citizenship and promote community awareness. Southern Fulton has created a partnership with Mellott Company in order to promote the values of : Safety, Integrity, Commitment, Respect, and Excellence. One or more of these values MUST be evident in the final presentation of the senior project.

Project Guidelines:

1. A representative from Mellott Company, along with the high school principal, will introduce and present information regarding the senior project during the 11th grade year.
2. Projects must be completed by the spring of your senior year to be considered for a Mellott Company Scholarship.
3. Projects must be presented during the designated time as scheduled by the high school principal. Projects will be presented in the auditorium with the principal and a Mellott Company representative.
4. During the course of the senior year, representatives from Mellott Company will present information on the five values in order to define each value and explain how they will apply to the scholarship decision.
5. **Mellott Company will grant 5-\$2,000 awards based on the evidence of the Values (Safety, Integrity, Commitment, Respect, Excellence). This is subject to change.**
6. Projects should be completed individually if students are interested in qualifying for Mellott Company scholarships.
7. Projects must include
 - a. Tangible product, presentation or performance.
 - b. Log or journal with the entries of all project activities.
 - c. Oral presentation of at least 5 minutes.
8. The parent/guardian will sign their child's project proposal before the School Counselor or the Principal.
9. Project logs must show progression and development of project and document at least thirty hours of work.
10. To receive a credit for this project, you must turn in a one-page paper detailing the project, a time log including the supervising adult's signature, and a photo story of the project.

GUIDELINES

Log Sheet Guidelines:

1. May be handwritten or typed.
2. Entries must show progression and development of the project.
3. At least 30 hours of work must be documented and totaled with research time not to exceed 25% of the time.

Tangible Product Guidelines:

1. The product itself can be a piece of artwork, handcrafted item, piece of furniture or computer program.
2. Visual documentation can be in the form of charts, photographs, a scrapbook, or a videotape.
