

## Biographical Sketches of Endowed Scholarship Donors

#### 1. Francis Don LaBonte Student Athlete Scholarship

A teacher and coach at Amanda and Amanda-Clearcreek High Schools in the 1950's and 1960's, Mr. LaBonte was a graduate of Murray State University and devoted 39 years to education. Don LaBonte, a 1962 graduate, established the scholarship honoring his father. Don graduated from Kent State University majoring in Geology. He is retired from employment by the U. S. Army and lives in Fayetteville, Georgia.

#### 2. Golda and Helen Hedges and Esther Hedges Strickland Scholarship

The three sisters devoted 111 years to education. Golda, a 1926 graduate, taught 14 years in Amanda High School and taught Latin 24 years in Lancaster High School. Helen, a 1925 graduate, taught 40 years, with 36 of those years in South Elementary School in Lancaster. Both graduated from Otterbein College. Esther Strickland, a 1936 graduate, has established four scholarships, two in this name and two in hers alone. She was a Miami University graduate. Esther taught and served as a principal in several Columbus high schools. All three sisters received their Masters degrees from The Ohio State University. Mrs. Strickland died in March of 2005. She left funds from her trust to the Endowment Fund and an additional amount with the Fairfield County Foundation with the earnings to come to the Alumni Endowment Fund each year. Her first scholarship is now a four-year renewable.

#### 3. Wallace Barr Family Scholarship

The primary donors are the late Dr. Wallace Barr, Class of 1939, and his wife, Doris. Wally received his B. Sc. and Ph.D. from The Ohio State University. Doris is a graduate of Oberlin College. Wally taught for 12 years in the Indian Lake and Wapakoneta City Schools prior to joining the faculty at OSU. He served in the Department of Agricultural Economics for 31 years. Doris taught mathematics in Wapakoneta and Columbus schools. Their children include William, a plant propagationist in Texas with degrees from OSU and the University of Minnesota. Leslie Warnock is a retired teacher from the Lakota Schools near Cincinnati, and a graduate of Miami University and OSU. Dean is now a retired CPA in Minneapolis with degrees from OSU and the University of Wisconsin-Madison.

#### 4. Hiatt-Reber Health Science Scholarship

Dr. Wayne Hiatt funded the scholarship in memory of his father, John Russell Hiatt, and mother, Edna Reber Hiatt, and their families who settled in Amanda Township in the early 1800's.

#### 5. Dr. N. Wayne Hiatt Memorial Scholarship

The funding for this scholarship was by Wayne's family, friends, and colleagues. Wayne was a 1941 graduate of Amanda H. S. He attended The Ohio State University for two years, then served in the U. S. Army during World War II. He returned to OSU to complete his undergraduate studies. He received his D. D. S. in '51 and Masters of Science in '62. He practiced dentistry from 1951 to 1998 in Grove City. He taught at The Ohio State University College of Dentistry for 35 years. His first wife, Alberta Ream Hiatt '42, died in 1985. His widow, Jean Curie Hiatt, resides in Powell, Ohio.

#### 6. Wendell and Edie Christy Scholarship

Wendell was a 1941 graduate. His education at The Ohio State University was interrupted by World War II. Upon discharge from the armed service, Wendell entered the banking business at the Clearcreek Valley Bank in Amanda. He was vice-president of the bank at his retirement. He died in 2003. Edie was from the Findlay area and graduated from Vanlue High School. She attended Bowling Green State University. Edie died in 2017. Wendell was one of the original members of the A-C Endowment Board of Trustees..

#### 7. Elizabeth Adler Memorial Scholarship

Mrs. Adler was an AHS 1912 graduate and taught in the Amanda elementary schools for many years. The donors were: 1) Dr. James Adler, a 1935 graduate and physician in North Canton, Ohio. His undergraduate and medical degrees were from The Ohio State University. 2) Robert Adler, a 1937 graduate, was in the construction business in Pennsylvania. 3) William Adler, a 1945 graduate, majored in Biology at Capital University. He was in the pharmaceutical business and lives in Cloverdale, California.

#### 8. Everett and Marie Kerns Memorial Scholarship

The Kerns Scholarship was funded through Everett's estate. He was a 1920 graduate. Everett's collegiate career included graduation from Capital University and an engineering degree from Carnegie Institute of Technology located in Pittsburgh. Marie was raised in the Shreveport, Louisiana area and taught school prior to her marriage. Everett worked for Standard Oil of Ohio. The Kerns lived in the Cleveland area and retired to the Amanda area. The Kerns were major contributors to Capital University where the worship center is named for them.

#### 9. Johns Family Scholarship

The primary donors include Stanton, Class of 1927, and his wife Jennie. The couple founded Mid-West Fabricating Company headquartered in Amanda. The Johns had two sons: David and Larry, both of whom passed in 1998. David Johns graduated from Amanda-Clearcreek in 1957 and attended Ohio State studying engineering. He immediately joined the company and ended up as CEO living in Lancaster with his wife Julie. Julie Johns is also a major contributor to the Johns Scholarship. David and Julie had three children. Jennifer (Friel) graduated from the University of Denver and is acting President of Mid-West living in Lancaster. David Johns Jr. lives in North Carolina. Amanda (Perez) graduated from Emory University and currently lives in Los Angeles. Larry Johns attended Amanda schools for most of his educational career but moved to California and graduated from Downey High while Stanton was establishing the company's West Bent Bolt Division in southern California in the early 1960's. He was with Mid-West and then branched out into other business ventures. Larry's son Gregory graduated from the University of Southern California and now lives in Beverly Hills, CA with his wife Erica. He is an expert in digital strategies for Kia and Hyundai automotive companies.

#### 10. Robert and Betty Masters Scholarship

Bob and Betty both graduated from Amanda High School in 1942. Betty attended Miami University and graduated from The Ohio State University majoring in home economics education. Bob graduated from the University of Cincinnati with a degree in engineering. He was employed by the U. S. Postal Service in Washington, D. C. Bob and Betty had retired in Wake Forest, North Carolina; both are now deceased.

#### 11. Harriet Adler Memorial Scholarship

A 1932 graduate, Harriet received her undergraduate degree from Capital University and Masters in Social Services from Western Reserve University. Her career was devoted to providing welfare services to the elderly and youth. Deborah Adler (niece of Harriet) and her former husband Dennis Morton funded the scholarship. Deborah is a graduate of Montclair State College with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Business Administration/ Accounting, and Dennis is a graduate of California State University with a degree in Chemistry.

#### 12. Beatrice Lane Marshall Memorial Scholarship

Richard F. Marshall '36 established the Beatrice Lane Marshall Memorial Scholarship to honor his wife of 28 years. Richard lived near Clearport during his school years. He was a veteran of World War II. Richard retired from the U. S. Postal Service after 30 years of employment.

#### 13. Hampshire Family Scholarship

Funded by Helen Hampshire Heintz '33 and her husband, Dr. William Heintz, DDS, in recognition of the family of John Jeston and Bertha Heinlein Hampshire, including children. Floyd, Don, Robert, Lucile Hampshire Korstange '32, and Helen Hampshire Heintz '33. John, "Jess" to his friends, was a Southern Ohio farmer and worked for the Ohio Highway Department for most of his working life, retiring to Florida in the mid 1950's. The five children grew up in and around Amanda and all lived most of their lives in Ohio. Dr. Heinz, Professor Emeritus, College of Dentistry at Ohio Sate University, was known worldwide for perfecting the modern mouth guard and promoting NCAA rules for its use in collegiate athletics. Himself, an accomplished track athlete at OSU, Dr. Heintz served as an assistant track coach and interpreter for Jesse Owens, the multiple gold medal winner at the 1936 Berlin Olympics. Helen and Bill traveled extensively worldwide and were sponsors of the International Students Association at OSU. Helen owned and operated the Snow House Antique Shop in Worthington, Ohio, and was instrumental in the redevelopment of German Village in South Columbus. She and Bill supported numerous philanthropic organizations and the Columbus Zoo. Contributions to the Zoo included restoration of the Band Organ for the Carousel and a bronze tiger for the Amur tiger exhibit.

#### 14. The Class of 1945 Scholarship

The Class of 1945 graduated 31 young men and women. Each of them went into the world to make their way as farmers, business persons, nurses, truck drivers, contractors, sales persons, industrial workers, ministers, surveyors, homemakers, and teachers, in the service of our country, and in ways we do not know about. As a group, they have contributed much to family life and their communities. The establishment of this Endowed Scholarship has been done with grateful appreciation for our high school education at Amanda High School.

#### 15. Dr. and Mrs. James Adler Memorial Scholarship

James was a 1935 graduate of Amanda High School. He went on to graduate from The Ohio State University School of Medicine. He and his wife, Mary Jane, had six children. They lived in the Canton, Ohio and Hilton Head, South Carolina areas where he practiced medicine. The donor for this scholarship is William Adler of California, brother of James.

#### 16. Donald & Mary Anne Weibel Scholarship

Donald Weibel, a native of Louisville, KY, graduated in engineering from Wright State University. He has had several careers. . . as an Air Force officer, engineer, and farmer. Mary Anne grew up in Pickaway County and graduated from Capital University. She was a teacher for thirty years, teaching twenty-three of those years at Clearcreek Elementary in Stoutsville. Don and Mary Anne are retired and live on their farm in Pickaway County.

#### 17. Martin "Buck" McHale Memorial Scholarship

Martin "Buck" McHale was a resident of the Amanda-Clearcreek Local School District since 1968. He had one daughter and one granddaughter graduate from Amanda-Clearcreek High School. Peggy, his wife of 55 years, wanted to establish this memorial fund in his honor to help students of the community further their education.

#### 18. The Leist Family Scholarship

The first generation of Leist siblings were graduating members of the following classes at AHS: Alice Anne, classes of 1951-50; Charles, 1953; Rosemary, 1955; Nancy, 1957. Alice Anne, received a BFA from Ohio University (1954), an MA and Ph. D. (1979), at the University of Maryland, with a clinical internship at Georgetown, and was awarded a postdoctoral National Institute of Mental Health Fellow at Stanford University (1980-82). Her early career was in teaching, but since 1983 she had a private practice as a clinical psychologist in Mountain View, CA. Anne is now deceased. Charles earned a B. S. in electrical engineering from OU(1962), retired from IBM after 27 years, and from the Computer Sciences Corp. after 14 years of service. Rosemary received a B. S. in education from OU (1959) and a MS in education from Bowling Green State University (1975). She retired after teaching 31 years in Ohio Public Schools. A second career in real estate began, and she eventually established her own real estate company in Columbus. Nancy started training for a nursing career at OSU (1957), which was interrupted when she married. Later, she returned to her alma mater and earned a B. S. in mathematics education (1992). She has worked for several firms, but found her niche at The Ohio State University as a Library Technical Assistant in the Serials Department of the Science and Engineering Library. The second generation of siblings from this family have graduated from colleges throughout the USA. Education has been an integral part and is on-going for this family who are proud to participate in the Endowment Program.

#### 19. Robert Adler Memorial Scholarship

Bob was a 1937 graduate of Amanda High School. He served in the US Navy Seabees during World War II, spending much of his duty in the South Pacific. During his working career he superintended the construction of industrial buildings in the NE United States. Bob and his wife, Clio, have two children. The principal donors for this scholarship are brother Bill Adler, son Craig, and widow Clio Adler.

#### 20. Wayne and Marie Reese Family Scholarship

As a family we were fortunate to live in a home interested in education. To honor our parents, the family has endowed a scholarship in their memory.

#### 21. The Meister Family Scholarship

This scholarship has generously been donated by five siblings: Robert Meister '37 of Ft. Myers, FL, Frank Meister '38 of Venice, FL, Dorothy Meister Abbott '39 of Reynoldsburg, OH, Virginia Meister '40 of Groveport, OH, and Marjorie Meister Creviston '43 of Cape Coral, FL. Virginia is the only sibling living today.

#### 22. The Ream Family Scholarship

This scholarship is donated by Louis Ream. His wishes were carried out by his widow, Lou of Granville, Ohio. The scholarship honors the memories of his parents, Albert and Marie Ream, and his three sisters. These three AHS graduates are Louella Ream Phillips '36, Jane Ream Reichelderfer '40, and Alberta Ream Hiatt '42. Louis was a graduate of Lancaster High School '50 and a graduate of The OSU School of Pharmacy '55. He operated retail pharmacies and Hallmark Shops in and around the Columbus area.

#### 23. Republic Services, Pine Grove Landfill Scholarship

Under the leadership of Tony Furgiuele, General Manager, the Republic Services, Inc. at the Pine Grove Landfill completed donations for this endowed scholarship. We are happy to be a part of this program. Republic Services supports activities that benefit the community.

#### 24. The Tom Dum Scholarship

Tom was a 1946 graduate who went into farming with his father, Grover Dum. After being drafted into the U. S. Army with a group of Fairfield County boys in 1955, he went to Europe with the 10th Infantry Division. After completing service he enrolled at The Ohio State University and obtained a BS and MS degree. He then became a real estate appraiser with the Ohio Department of Highways and later moved to California, becoming an appraiser with United California Bank. In 1970 he started his own appraisal company which he continues today with his son Ed, who is a partner. Tom taught for the University of California extension program for 25 years. He was president of his Appraisal Institute Chapter and president of his local Safari Club International Chapter and a National Director at Large of the club. He has written a column for the national magazine Safari Times. Mr. Dum passed away in March of 2022.

#### 25. Francis Gehrett Huddle and Edna Chambers Huddle Scholarship

Francis Gehrett Huddle graduated from Clearcreek High School in 1915 and 1916, because the education system changed from a three year to a four year high school program. He enlisted in the United States Navy 7 Dec. 1917. His World War I battleship experience resulted in his children awakening to the morning wake-up call "Hit that deck sailor!" When he returned home he attended The Ohio State University for one year, but health and financial difficulties kept him from completing his studies. For forty years he was employed by the United States Postal Service as a railway postal clerk. Edna Chambers Huddle graduated from Clearcreek High School in 1919. She attended college at Ohio University and began her teaching career at Owl Hollow School (near Dutch Hollow). When she married in 1926, she resigned her position because married women were not allowed to teach. She resumed her formal education in 1957 and after an absence of thirty- two years, she returned to teaching in 1958.

Francis and Edna Huddle maintained a deep respect and love of learning, which they instilled in their children. Of their seven children, five were valedictorians of their class. Six graduated from Clearcreek High School and one graduated from Amanda-Clearcreek High School. All seven continued their education after high school. In recognition of all the love, guidance, and help our parents gave us, we established this scholarship.

#### 26. William Adler Scholarship

Bill is a 1945 graduate of Amanda High School and a 1949 graduate of Capital University. He has a major in Biology and a minor in Chemistry. He was in the United States Navy Hospital Corps during the close of World War II. His working career was in the pharmaceutical industry where he was a sales executive. He has a daughter and son, Deborah and Edward. Also, he has two stepdaughters, Nancy Assaf and Sharon Potts. He is proud of his heritage and grateful for his education and life's values gained from being raised in the Amanda community. The donor for this scholarship is Deborah Adler, Bill's daughter.

#### 27. The Saum Family Scholarship

This scholarship was donated by Barbara Saum Smith, a graduate of Amanda High School Class of 1954, and Paul and Lois Saum. Paul is a graduate of Amanda High School Class of 1955. The late Barbara taught high school Chemistry in Omaha, Nebraska 36 years before retiring in 1999. Paul and Lois help to operate the family farm near Amanda. They are the parents of three and grandparents of six Amanda-Clearcreek graduates.

#### 28. The Tilley Family Scholarship

Jack was born in Oklahoma, and raised in Missouri and then California. In California he was a firefighter with the California Division of Forestry and a captain in the fire department, city of San Bernardino, CA. before coming to Ohio to farm. He was a graduate of San Bernardino (CA) High School ('52). He served 12 years on the A-C Board of Ed. Jack passed away in 2016. Carolyn graduated from AHS in '55 and Capital University in '59. After teaching in northern Ohio and CA for 10 years, she returned to her home school, Amanda Elem. for 26 years, retiring in 2000. Cathy graduated from Forest Rose School and attends A Creative Journey in Lancaster. Jeff is an 1989 ACHS graduate and a 1993 graduate of The Ohio State University majoring in Agriculture Education. He currently teaches Agricultural Science and the Agricultural Business courses and is one of the FFA advisors here at ACHS.

#### 29. The A-C PTO Scholarship

This scholarship was given by the members of the Amanda-Clearcreek Parent Teacher Organization.

#### 30. Moody-Dickson Scholarship

The donor of this scholarship was Elsie Dickson Bookman AHS '34. Mrs. Bookman owned and operated the Amanda Furniture Store in Amanda for over 50 years. This scholarship was particularly given in honor of Elsie's uncle, her mother's brother, Clarence Moody. 2007 was the 100th anniversary of his graduation in 1907 from Amanda High School. Mr. Moody became president of the Fuller Brush Company and made his home in Glendale, California. Mrs. Bookman passed away in 2012.

#### 31. "Nothing Less Than Your Best" Scholarship

This scholarship is designed for a young lady who has lettered in varsity soccer in her junior and senior year. She must show the attitude of team over individual on the soccer field. It is given in memory of Jess Veach, a volunteer soccer coach. It is given by his family and friends.

#### 32. Albert and Lata Barr Memorial Scholarship

The Albert and Lata Stump Barr endowed scholarship is established by Robert and Betty Barr Masters, their daughter and granddaughters, Christie Janssen, Brook Masters and Jandyl Doyle. Albert and Lata were graduates of Amanda High School Class of 1920. Albert attended the College of Agriculture at Ohio State University, and Lata received her teaching certificate from Ohio University at Athens, Ohio. Their children Betty and George Barr also graduated from Amanda High School. Albert and Lata were an important part of the community and supportive of the Amanda school programs. Lata served as Postmaster in Amanda for 28 years, from 1934 to 1962. Albert retired from the Midwest Manufacturing Company in 1965. In retirement Albert and Lata lived in Cape Coral, Florida.

#### 33. The Hunter Family Scholarship

Donated by Mable Hunter Green, Amanda High School Class of 1951, the Hunter Family Scholarship was established to honor its family alumni. After her high school graduation, Mable worked as a secretary in the AHS office and later settled in nearby Circleville. Her father, Russell Hunter, served on the Amanda School Board from 1938-1944. She is the proud grandmother of two ACHS graduates, John Boggs '03 and Miranda Boggs '08. Mable's desire was to give back to the school and community that so richly influenced her life. The Hunter Family Scholarship honors the cousins and siblings who attended and graduated from AHS/ACHS. They are Mable Hunter Green '51, Earl Hunter '54, Elsie Hunter Shupe '56, Jay Hunter '59, Arlene Hunter Baldwin '63, Carl Furness '66, Harold Furness '66, and Carol Hunter Smith '69.

#### 34. The Miller Family Scholarship

The scholarship was established by Joyce Steelton Miller, AHS 1948, as a memorial to her husband, Maynard, SHS 1944 and her oldest son Steve, ACHS 1968. Maynard and Joyce were raised in the Amanda and Stoutsville areas and were married in 1948. They lived here their entire lives, raising four children, all of whom graduated from Amanda-Clearcreek High

School. Maynards' mother, Hazel, taught in one-room schools in the area, and his father farmed. Joyce worked for Amanda-Clearcreek schools for several years, and Maynard served on the Board of Education for many years. The Miller family is a fifth generation farm family in the Stoutsville area.

#### 35. The Frank G. and Marlene M. Weigerding Scholarship

Frank Weigerding grew up in the Dayton area, served in the Army Air Corps during World War II, and graduated from Sinclair College, working in civil engineering. Marvene was raised in nearby Hocking County and met Frank during the war effort. They were married fifty-five years, raising two children. In their later years, they supported various charities with their philanthropy. They learned of the A-C Alumni scholarships through their great nieces, Teresa Thomas Bond ('78), Michelle Thomas Christopher ('81) and Beth Bradney Bell ('87) and committed to fund a scholarship.

#### 36. St. Peter's Lutheran Church-Amanda Scholarship

In 1884, A. H. Fishburn, from Stoutsville, serving Israel Lutheran, organized St. Peter's Lutheran in Amanda. The Lutherans purchased the building the Methodists had built in 1842 at 132 East High as they had built a new building just down the street. In 1886 St. Peter's became part of a parish of other churches and at times over the years shared a minister with several small churches. In 1984, the church celebrated its 100th anniversary. In May, 2011, the congregation decided to close its doors on its history, and the building was sold. Part of the sale was used to provide this scholarship to help youth of the community have a future.

#### 37. The Charles J. and Ruby Christy Family Scholarship

Charles Joseph Christy and Ruby (Kinser) Christy were both born to farming families and were raised in the Amanda area in the 1920 and 30's. Joe attended the Amanda School System and graduated as valedictorian of his class in 1937. Ruby attended the Clearport Schools and graduated in 1939 from the Walnut Twp. Schools which later became part of the Teays Valley Schools. They married in 1944 and after WWII, Joe became a plumber and started his own plumbing and heating business in Circleville and later his own water well-drilling business. Ruby worked diligently in both businesses as well as being a homemaker. Together, they raised two children, Robert and Nancy, on the family farm near Dutch Hollow. Bob graduated from Amanda-Clearcreek in 1965 and became an educator and administrator in the Amanda-Clearcreek Schools from 1973 to 1994. Nancy graduated from Amanda-Clearcreek in 1967 and became a surgical room nurse primarily in the OSU Hospitals. As individuals and as a family, we have benefited from an excellent education in the Amanda-Clearcreek Schools and wish to help current and future A-C students to further their education, better their lives and become productive citizens in society.

#### 38. The Wendell and Hazel Henderly Family Scholarship

Wendell graduated from Amanda High School in 1948. Hazel graduated from Bloom-Carroll in 1947. Their children graduated from Amanda-Clearcreek: Rita Henderly Francis 1970, Margaret Henderly Thomas 1971, and Max Henderly 1981. They also had four grandchildren to graduate from Amanda-Clearcreek: Malinda Francis Sullivan 1991, Angie Thomas Bolin 1994, Wendy Francis Booth 1996, and Mark Francis 2002. They would like for this scholarship to help others in the community to further their education.

#### 39. The Thad Davis Family Scholarship

This scholarship has been established by Sandy ('67), Tom '68) and Don ('77) in honor of their father, Thad (Stoutsville '45) and their mother Louise. Thad and Louise raised their children in Amanda and were avid supporters of both the school and community. Running was a very important aspect of Thad's life. He emerged as an clite age group runner over the last four decades of his life. He was instrumental in mentoring many A-C High School runners, sharing guidance and support in their running careers. Although not an A-C graduate, Louise was a staunch supporter of her children, and of the school, serving in volunteer roles with the district throughout her life. Sandy works for Lancaster-Fairfield Head Start, Tom was a Professor of Counselor Education at Ohio University, and Don is a Professor of Mathematics at Lakeland Community College.

#### 40. The Rex Shupe Memorial Scholarship

Rex Shupe was a 1970 graduate of Amanda-Clearcreek High School, and a 1974 graduate of Ohio University. He earned a Masters Degree at the University of Dayton. Rex taught school and coached football for 35 years. He started his teaching and coaching career at Berne Union School where he spent 6 years. He then moved to Logan Elm Schools teaching and coaching football for 13 seasons before returning home to Amanda-Clearcreek in 1993 ending his career in 2009. Rex was an integral part of the success of the Amanda-Clearcreek football program. It is because of his passion and dedication to students and athletes that his family offers this scholarship to a member of the Amanda-Clearcreek football team.

#### 41. The Ned and Rebecca Young Scholarship

Ned graduated from Amanda High School in 1937, and Rebecca attended Amanda until her marriage to Ned. Even in high school Ned began his long career in the electrical contracting field. He joined the Navy Seabees in 1943 serving in the South Pacific and was in the reserve until 1953. After the war he came home to Amanda with his own shop and served as mayor. He moved to Chillicothe to work for the Veterans Administration, then many other companies. In Circleville he worked for DuPont and had his own company. After additional schooling, he was employed by Ross/Abbott Labs in Columbus as a Project Engineer retiring in 1985. All this time he and Becky raised 3 children, and Ned was active in many, many organizations with many honors such as from the Ross County Shrine Club as outstanding Shriner of the Year, twice, while always doing local electrical work. When the A-C Alumni was at its lowest point, Ned helped rescue the association, and was president when the Scholarship Endowment Fund was started. Becky typed all alumni into a data base that Ned and she kept for many years. Becky is the only person to have received the status of an Honorary Alumni of A-C, and Ned has been named a Distinguished Alumni. The great achievement of the A-C Alumni Endowment Fund was made possible through the contacts the Association was able to maintain through the data base of graduates. In 2011 Ned was inducted into Ohio Veterans Hall of Fame as the 309th inductee. This is presented for not just military service, but the many community activities in the life of the person. Ned passed away in the year of 2017.

#### 42. The Trenton and Jean Kern Memorial Scholarship

The funding for this scholarship comes from the estate of Trenton and Jean Kern. Jean graduated from Amanda High School in 1939. She grew up on the Ritchie farm at the base of "Mile Hill". Trenton graduated from Amanda High School in 1937 and grew up on the Kern family farm in Clearport. Both Jean and Trenton were part of the original conversation in the development of the A-C Endowment Board and Association. This scholarship is to honor Trenton's wife, Jean, who was an outstanding athlete of her time and was so honored by her induction as one of the original members of the inaugural class inducted into the Amanda Clearcreek Athletic Hall of Fame in 2009.

#### 43. St Jacob's Lutheran Church Scholarship

The history of the church can be traced back to the time when early settlers were entering this section of Ohio in 1807, most coming from Pennsylvania. The Rev. Jacob Leist, then a young man, also an immigrant from that state, a licensed missionary of Lutheran churches, organized the first church in Tarlton, Ohio. At first both German and English speaking church services were held. Worship was in a log cabin until the 1830, when a log and frame building was built for both congregations. The German Reformed Society disbanded and St. Jacob's Evangelical Lutheran Church was officially established on November 8, 1861, named presumably in honor of Rev. Jacob Leist. A new St. Jacob's was built in front of its former building and consecrated for worship on July 19, 1925. For many years it was a two parish congregation with Stoutsville Trinity Lutheran until Trinity dissolved in April of 2002. St. Jacob's then joined St. Peter's Lutheran of Amanda and St. Matthew's of Sugar Grove in a parish until 2011 when St. Peter's closed. With the attendance dwindling St. Jacob's sadly closed its doors on December 11, 2016. The building was sold, but continues as the Community Church of Tarlton. The church did many good things over the years, just as they are doing now with the dissolution and distribution of funds, part going to help a student move forward in their endeavors for higher education.

#### 44. The Garrett Family Scholarship

This scholarship is given in memory of Vernon, Eileen (Class of AHS'47), and Brent Garrett (Class of '73), and in honor of Bruce and Lola Garrett (Classes of '68 and '69), retired teachers from A-C; Brenda Garrett, MA-CCC-SLP, speech pathologist (Class of '96); and Dr. Brian Garrett, DNP-CRNA, head of Otterbein Nurse Anesthetist Program (Class of '91). The preference for this scholarship is a graduate student in either education, allied health in speech therapy, or nursing.

#### 45. The Ernest and Edith Francis Family Scholarship

Ernest and Edith were married on October 27,1930. They were a lifelong farming family. They started farming; using work horses around Whisler, Ohio; share cropped in Union County; farmed around Canal Winchester; then came to Amanda, Ohio in February, 1945. The family raised livestock and grains. They were blessed with 10 children; all graduated from Amanda and Amanda Clearcreek High School. The couple were both involved at their church and were members of Farm Bureau Council #15. Mr. Francis was a charter member of the Amanda Lions Club and served for many years on the Board of Education.

#### 46. The Lewis R. Taylor Family Scholarship

Lewis and Eleanor Taylor came to Amanda in 1959 and started the Taylor Funeral Home, which at the time, were the youngest to ever open and operate a funeral home in the State of Ohio. They had two children, Tambria Taylor (1961-2010) and Tom Taylor both of whom graduated from Amanda-Clearcreek High School. Eleanor taught Learning Disabilities at Amanda-Clearcreek for many years. Lewis and Eleanor both were involved heavily in the community as the funeral home served as the emergency services for the surrounding area. In 1974, Lewis, along with the aid of some in the community established the Emergence Medical Service for Amanda Twp. Lewis was both a volunteer firefighter and EMS Coordinator for Amanda Township. Lewis also was a school bus river for many years in the Amanda-Clearcreek School System. The Taylor family have been ardent supporter of Amanda-Clearcreek Athletics and other areas of curriculum both in personal support as well as monetary support, and the support continues today. Lewis passed away on October 10, 2020 and in continuing his legacy, his wife, Eleanor and son, Tom thought of no better way than to establish this scholarship to further the education of Amanda-Clearcreek seniors as they endeavor to charter their course in education.

#### 47. The Thad Davis Memorial 5K Run/Walk Scholarships

This scholarship is presented from proceeds of the Tenth Annual Thad Davis Memorial 5K Run/Walk of 2022 to A-C athletes.

#### 48. The Frank Family Scholarship

Luther Frank and his brother Gary Frank and his wife Helen Frank are presenting this scholarship in memory of their parents Pearl and Alice Frank. The Frank family have been farming in the Amanda area since 1965. Luther is a 1982 graduate of ACHS, and a VP at Mid-West Fabricating Company with a career spanning more than 39 years. He has a love of flying, agriculture, machinery, and business. Brother Gary has had a 41 year career as a welder at Diamond Power. Study preferences for the student chosen reflect these interests.

#### 49. The Elmer (Ted) and Patricia (Pat) Scott Scholarship

Ted and his wife Pat moved to Fairfield County, Amanda Clearcreek School District, in 1969. Ted served on the Amanda Township Board of Appeals fro seven years. He was in an atomic bomb test in Las Vegas in 1951. He served seven months in Korea during the war, and was a Navy Seabee attached to a Marine Air Force unit. He was a carpenter by trade, but did much engineering work. He worked on the sixth-floor addition of Fairfield Medical Center, the addition at Mt. Carmel East, and the Rhodes Hall at OSU. Before moving, Pat worked 19 years at Lazarus Dept. store in Columbus. She was an avid gardner and loved her many flower beds. She also donated and enjoyed many volunteer hours in the area. Ted passed away in 2006 shortly after setting up the scholarship and Pat in 2022, whereupon the estate came to the Endowment Fund in December of 2022.

#### The A-C Endowment Fund for Scholarships

The fund was established with a 501(c)3 designation in 1991 with the first actual endowed scholarship from the fund presented in 1993. However, there had been three prior to 1990 and seven scholarships given between '90 and '92 with the funds that were donated, especially from individual classes. With the year 2022, we have presented a total of 1127 scholarships for over \$2 million. This is almost as much as we have invested counting the Johns, the Barr, and the 48 other individuals or groups who have set up endowed scholarships. Our total invested amount at the end of 2022 is \$2.7 million. The amount needed for an endowed scholarship has gone from \$15,000 to \$20,000 during the years. The trustees have now set the amount to \$25,000 beginning January of 2014. We have part of the Johns funds invested with the Fairfield County Foundation and the Hedges-Strickland funds are invested there, also, for our use each year. This has all been made possible with help of many people who regularly donate to the fund with memorials and gifts. We are so grateful to our alumni community for their continued support.
