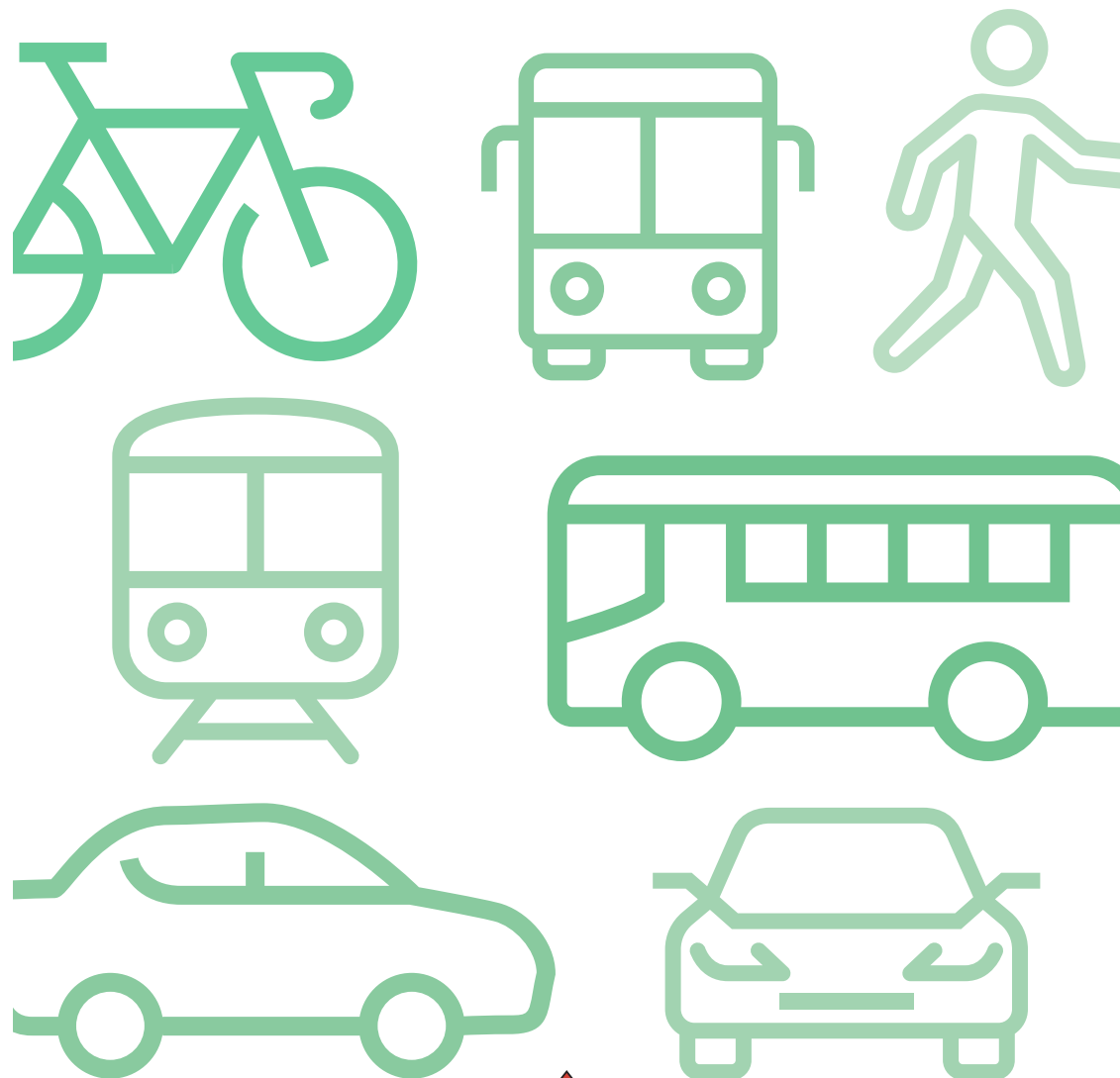

Dear Parents / Guardians,

Thank you for taking the time to look at Dame Allan's Schools' bus services for the 2023-2024 academic year. This is the second version of such a guide, which sets out the wide range of travel options available to the pupils at Dame Allan's Schools.

Building upon our successful partnership, we are pleased to announce the continuation of our collaboration with Vectare, a specialist school transport management company, to manage their school bus services. Vectare are responsible for over 2 million independent school journeys per annum. Vectare will continue to manage all aspects of the School's services, and any enquiries can be directed to their team at [dameallans@vectare.co.uk](mailto:dameallans@vectare.co.uk).

All bookings for school bus routes are made via our online booking system, which can be viewed at [dameallans.vectare.co.uk](http://dameallans.vectare.co.uk). This means that you no longer need to complete any paper forms. Payment for the service is made at the time of booking and your child's name will automatically be added to the register. The website also incorporates an interactive journey planner which allows you to enter your postcode and find your closest bus stop.

This guide provides an overview of the bus service network and contains further details including fare and timetable information. All bookings for all routes can be made via the dedicated transport website. The website allows you to book travel 24/7 from anywhere in the world, meaning that if you need to leave early for work one morning or you are running late and you would like your child to travel on a school bus as a one off, you can make a booking right up until the bus is due to depart.

If you need any further assistance, or you would like to discuss travel options from areas not currently served by our network, please contact us via the bookings website and we will be pleased to assist.

## Buses

We provide several different bus services from across the area, alongside the regular public transport timetables, to encourage pupils to take the bus to school. By taking the bus you avoid congestion in and around the local area and help protect the environment.

We expect all of our pupils to behave responsibly on transport to and from Dame Allan's Schools. The vast majority of our bus services are managed by a specialist school transport management company, Vectare. They manage six different routes to and from the Schools:

### Burnopfield

### Central Station

### Great North Park

### Tynemouth

### Great North Road

### Hillcrest

For Junior School pupils using any of these services there is a school minibus shuttle to and from the Senior Schools.

## Public Transport

The Schools are also accessible by public transport.

**36** runs every 18 minutes from Blackett Street to Fenham Hall Drive.

**63** runs every 18 - 20 minutes from Killingworth via Blackett Street to Fenham Hall Drive.

**87, 72** runs at 30 minute intervals rotating (i.e. 87 at 07:03; 72 at 07:33) from Grainger Street and Blackett Street to Fenham Hall Drive.

**12** runs every 10 minutes from Wallsend, Walker, Byker via Blackett Street to Wingrove Road/ Nuns Moor Road and Hadrian Road.

**32/32A** - Walker - City - Benwell - Kenton runs at roughly 30 minute intervals.

You can see further information on the timetables for these services on the stagecoach website. Nexus also provides a journey planner which may assist you in planning your route to the Schools.

## Travelling by Train or Metro

We recognise that some pupils may be travelling from further afield and may not be able to take a bus direct to the Schools. They may find it more convenient to come into Newcastle by train or Tyne and Wear metro. They can then catch the Central Station Vectare bus service to the Schools.

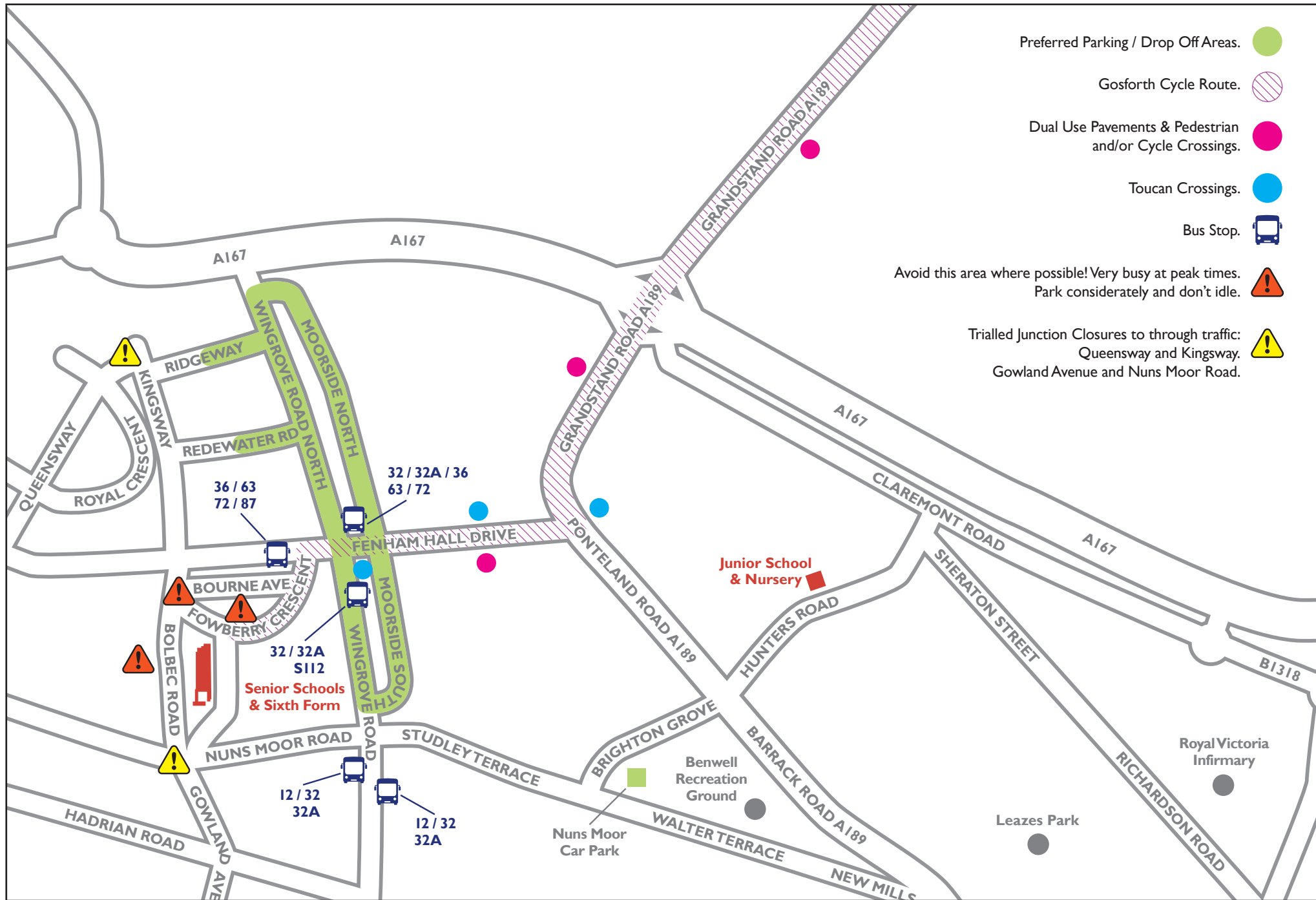

## Cycling

We really encourage pupils to consider cycling to school. There is an off-road safe cycling route from the Gosforth area to the Schools and pupils are able to store their bikes securely in bike sheds on site. You can see further details on our map on pages 10 and 11 which highlights the main cycle route.

We understand that cycling to and from school every day may not be convenient or appealing for everyone. However, we would still suggest that even occasionally cycling to the Schools is beneficial.

Asides from the overwhelmingly positive environmental benefits it is also a great way to start the day. Whilst most people will only think of the benefits of exercising as simply keeping fit, there is an abundance of research that discusses the impact of exercise on your brain.

From reducing stress and anxiety and increasing your focus and concentration immediately after exercising, to improving your sleep and memory in the long term, cycling is a really great way to start your school day.

## Walking

As we have already mentioned, exercising on the way to school is not only a great way to start the day, but it is also hugely beneficial for the environment. We would therefore encourage pupils to walk to school if possible.

There have been significant attempts to make pedestrians feel safer when walking such as the latest updates to the Highway Code or Newcastle City Council's initiatives. Newcastle City Council are conducting trials where both Gowland Avenue and Nuns Moor Road are closed as through routes to vehicles. Both routes will remain open to people on foot and bike. You can see this illustrated on the map (pages 10 and 11). Further details of the measures can be found on Newcastle City Council's website.

## Driving

We realise that for some driving is a necessity and will often form a part of a family's daily routine. As there are a number of pupils that travel to school in the car, we thought that it would be worth sharing a few tips and reminders.

- 1. Avoid Fowberry Crescent, Bolbec Road and Bourne Avenue.** We would recommend avoiding these three roads, as they are often very busy, especially at peak times. Nearby residents have to bear the brunt of the impact of this traffic and we are really keen to reduce the issues they face.
- 2. Don't idle and leave your engine running!** Not only will you save money but this is also hugely beneficial for the air quality around the Schools, thus protecting the environment and more importantly the health of your children.
- 3. Drive safely and park carefully.** If there are no other options and you need to park in the close vicinity of the Schools, please do so considerately. Take care not to block the drives of our residents when you are parking your vehicle and to adhere to the 20mph speed limit that is in place. Remember the raised area at the junction of Fowberry, Bourne Avenue and Bolbec Road is a pavement, and therefore cars should not be parked there.
- 4. Park and Stride.** Parking and striding (dropping pupils off short of school and allowing them to walk the rest of the way) allows you to get the best of both worlds. You can travel to the Schools efficiently and also do your bit for the environment. You will also avoid the stress of parking in the busy areas such as Fowberry Crescent, Bourne Avenue and Bolbec Road. There are a few preferred parking areas, detailed on

the map on pages 10 and 11, that allow your children to walk the final part of the journey.

## Did you know?

**26% of those caught idling are spotted doing so outside school.**

**Idling for more than 10 seconds uses more fuel and produces more emissions that contribute to smog and climate change than stopping and restarting your engine does.**

This means school children are facing the consequences of poorer air quality more so than most others. (RAC Research)

## 5 Top Tips for Travelling to Dame Allan's Schools

- 1. Stay safe** - We have regular talks on road and pedestrian safety to help make sure the children feel as safe and as confident as possible when travelling to school. Pupils should make sure they have the right equipment, for example, if they are cycling, they should be wearing a cycle helmet.
- 2. Plan your journey and avoid peak times (8:20 - 8:30) (3.45 - 4.00).** Plan your journey to school before term starts, working out how long it will take you and familiarising yourself with the route. That way your child will feel comfortable with their journey and as a parent you can ensure an enjoyable travel experience. Planning ahead will also help you avoid the rush of cars at peak times in the surrounding areas around the Schools. There are plenty of brilliant co-curricular activities on offer, before and after school,

as well as the after school area where pupils can wait until 17.45 which may also help you avoid the peak time traffic.

- 3. Start small** - We recognise that converting to sustainable transport options may be a big change and not necessarily a simple one. We simply ask parents and pupils whether they can make small steps with us. For example walking and cycling or getting public transport once a month, then twice a month and so on.
- 4. Get a Nexus Travel Card** - We recommend that pupils travelling by public transport take advantage of the discounts available to them. The Nexus Pop and Pop Blue cards allow children to travel with concessionary fares every day on all public transport in Tyne and Wear. Further details can be found here on the Nexus Website.
- 5. Travel with a friend** - It is always nice to have a travelling companion whether you're walking, cycling or using public transport. If you are interested in lift sharing arrangements, you will now also be able to find other parents on the Vectare portal, at the same web address (dameallans.vectare.co.uk). Sign up is voluntary and when registered, you will be able to connect with others local to you who are either offering or looking for lift sharing. This will help lighten the load on your busy schedules and allow children to travel to the Schools together.

We hope that you find this information helpful. Our transport provision is evaluated at the end of each academic year and we always look to improve our offering and make travelling to Dame Allan's easier. If there are any questions, please do get in touch with us - finance@dameallans.co.uk

## Terms and Conditions

1. This agreement is made between all school bus passengers, their parents and Dame Allan's Schools in order to provide safe, comfortable and civilised journeys for all passengers.
2. Arrangements for pupils' journeys to and from school are the responsibility of their parents. To assist with discharging this responsibility, Dame Allan's Schools provides a school bus service. Parents are responsible for their son/daughter at all times including both prior to and after boarding and alighting.
3. Transport on the school bus service must be arranged in advance and is paid for through the online booking system.
4. The school bus service is only available to Junior Pupils in year 5 and 6, or to pupils in year 3 and 4, when accompanied by an older sibling from the Senior School on the bus.
5. In order to access the cheaper rate you must regularly use the service. We class regular use as travel booked for half a term at a time (not necessarily every day). If you book for half a term and then want to add additional travel it will be at the 'one-off' rate.
6. Bookings are non-refundable in the event of a pupil failing to travel.
7. Bookings are to be made via [dameallans.vectare.co.uk](http://dameallans.vectare.co.uk)
8. Each pupil for whom an online form has been submitted will be added to a bus list detailing the service they travel on, their bus stop and what travel has been paid for. Their name will appear on a list which will be checked by the driver.
9. It will be the parent's responsibility to inform the school via the Contact Us form on the website if they no longer wish for their child to use the school bus service. Notice of half a term must be given by a parent prior to the removal of a pupil from the school bus service.
10. No pupil is permitted to travel on the school bus service if not pre-booked for that bus. Other arrangements for journeys to and from

school must be made by the pupil or their parents. Pupils must travel to and from Dame Allan's Schools in full school uniform. Full school tracksuit or non-uniform can only be worn when permission has been granted.

11. Pupils should be at the bus stop 5 minutes before the scheduled time of departure to ensure they do not miss the bus. Drivers will not wait past the scheduled departure time.
12. Good conduct is required at all times. Shouting, use of inappropriate language, dropping litter, playing loud music or any other misbehaviour is strictly forbidden, as is eating on the bus. Pupils must ensure that any online activity will not cause distress to others as set out in the school ICT Acceptable Use Agreement. Pupils are expected to behave responsibly on transport to and from Dame Allan's Schools. This means following all safety guidelines and adhering to the Schools' code of conduct and behaviour policies, which can be found on the website: [dameallans.co.uk/contact/transport](http://dameallans.co.uk/contact/transport)
13. Except when embarking or disembarking, all passengers must remain seated with their seat belts fastened correctly.
14. Whilst on a school bus, all passengers must accept the authority of a member of staff or driver, who may ask them to obey any reasonable instruction such as pick up litter, cease from certain actions or to move to a different seat.
15. Failure to comply with these conditions may result in the matter being referred to the pupil's form teacher or Head of Year and may result in disciplinary action, including temporary or permanent withdrawal of permission to use the school bus service.
16. Dame Allan's School aims for 95% of journeys to operate within the transport industry window of tolerance of one minute early to five minutes late, however timings may vary due to traffic conditions or unforeseen circumstances.
