Positive Behavioral Interventions and Support

Hershey Elementary's Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) is an approach to support students in being successful in school. PBIS was developed from research in the fields of behavior theory and effective instruction. PBIS supports all students through interventions ranging from school-wide plans to developing individualized plans. School-wide PBIS focuses on the development and implementation of proactive procedures and practices to prevent problem behavior for all students and improve the school climate. We aim to foster and

promote a safe, positive, and respectful environment in which all students can achieve social, emotional, and academic success.

At Hershey Elementary School, we use The Trojan Way, which includes responsibility, respect, and safety. It is a set of expectations for all students to follow. Around our school, students see matrices posted that define expected behaviors in different school settings. Having a few simple, positively stated rules facilitates the teaching of behavioral expectations across school settings, as it aids students and staff in using the same language. Focusing on 3 simple expectations makes it easier for students and staff to uphold. Positively stated expectations are important because research has shown that being proactive is more beneficial to learning than being reactive to unexpected behaviors. By saying rules positively, staff will be more likely to use the expectations to catch students engaging in the appropriate behavior. With the expectations selected, the PBIS team believes that we can teach all specific behavioral expectations across all school settings.

Our elementary staff provides

students with what we call Hershey passes. They are utilized as an incentive to students as when they receive a pass, their name is placed in a raffle. Names are picked weekly out of the raffle to pick a prize from the treasure chest or to pick a Trojan Elementary Experience (TEE) with a staff member.

The PBIS team is representative of the entire school staff across grade levels, classified staff, Special Education staff, etc. Having a representative team improves communication and feedback about PBIS programs in our school and also improves involvement and commitment throughout our school community. Our PBIS team meets once monthly as a large group and various times throughout the month as sub-committees, it is a large system and takes a village. We also have a partnership with our PTO that we meet with once monthly as our system evolves and develops.

As we close out our school year, we reflect on our largely successful community night, where we had over a thousand members of the school community come together to connect the school and community after not being able to due to the pandemic.




