
OUR COMMUNITY

The Van Wert City School District is made up of two communities: the city of Van Wert (approximately 11,045 people) and the village of Ohio City (approximately 760 people) located in Van Wert County, Ohio. These communities are surrounded by farm ground with agriculture being a major industry in Van Wert County. A variety of industries and businesses offer employment for business, professional, skilled and unskilled workers.

AN AWARD-WINNING EDUCATION



Van Wert City Schools is on the forefront of education as a PBL (Project Based Learning) district, bringing education to life with innovative instructional methods. Enrollment for the 2022-2023 school year is 2,202 students who are served by five schools: the Early Childhood Center (Pre K - K), Van Wert Elementary (1-5), Van Wert Middle School (6-8), Van Wert High School (9-12), and Van Wert School at the Goedde (alternative 6-12). Our district attendance averages 96.75% and the class of 2021 far exceeded the national average with a 95.7% graduation rate.





VAN WERT EARLY CHILDHOOD CENTER

VWECC serves our youngest learners (3, 4, and 5 year olds) with *all-day* preschool and kindergarten where students are encouraged to create, move, sing, discuss, observe, read, and play every single day. The ECC is proud to be a 5-Star Step Up To Quality school since 2016, as well as a 2018 & 2019 Ohio Department of Education "All A" and "Overall A" award winner. In addition to board-adopted curricula, all students learn in a play-based environment using Literacy Collaborative, Creative Curriculum, Heggerty Phonemic Awareness, Lucy Calkins Writing, and Big Ideas Math with the Numbers Talk framework.

VAN WERT MIDDLE SCHOOL


A true middle school, Van Wert Middle School is a 2021-22 PLTW (Project Lead The Way) Distinguished School serving grades 6-8. In addition to core curriculum, students experience Discovery classes such as art, music, engineering, STEM, physical education, life skills, and technology. Several extra-curricular opportunities are available to promote student involvement: athletics, 4-H, History Club, Quiz Bowl, Robotics Club, Cougar Leaders, LifeWise Academy, Campus Life, Taking Care of Business (TCB), and PINK & BLUE. PAWS is a designated 30 minutes set aside each day for students to complete work, get organized, and seek out teachers for additional instruction or any other needs.

PLTW DISTINGUISHED SCHOOL

VAN WERT HIGH SCHOOL

Van Wert High School is a pioneer in career readiness with its unique CEO (Career Education Opportunities) Program, which allows for seniors to gain high school credit while interning with one of our many community partners during the school day. PLTW offers two career pathways for students: engineering or biomedical sciences. The innovative Robotics program goes above and beyond the classroom, providing students with an after-school opportunity to compete against other schools. The new PBIS program has been very successful at the high school level, recognizing and rewarding students who display positive behavior and actions in school. VWHS students are encouraged to take an active part in their high school career by participating in any of the 11 clubs or 22 athletic programs offered.



VAN WERT SCHOOL AT THE GOEDDE

Van Wert City Schools prides itself on its dedication to meet every student at their level and is excited by the work being done at Van Wert School at the Goedde. This new "opportunity" school opened its doors to students in grades 6-12 in August 2021. VWSATG is an extension of Van Wert High School and Middle School, providing students with a classroom structure more suited for their learning style. High school students are encouraged to become active citizens in the community with a daily work-study schedule, while middle school students share their skills in the form of volunteerism. Students host several events throughout the school year and some of these events, such as the Thanksgiving feast, are shared with the community, making the life skills lab a crucial component of their education.



PBL [Project Based Learning]


Project Based Learning (PBL) is a unique learning environment, dedicated to developing critical thinking skills to ensure all students become college and career ready. Within Project Based Learning, teachers focus on Ohio's New Learning Standards, putting that content within the context of a real-world scenario or problem. As a result, students are engaged in the classroom and understand the purpose behind their work. Within a project, students develop skills such as written and oral communication and collaboration. In addition, they are introduced to the concept and development of a growth mindset, tackling what it means to take ownership over one's learning and grow through effort, practice, and challenge, not only in the classroom but in all settings.



LC [Literacy Collaborative]

Literacy Collaborative is a reading framework currently used by Preschool - 4th grade students at VWCS. This method engages students in authentic reading and writing across the curriculum. The framework consists of interactive reading aloud, shared reading, guided reading, independent reading, community writing, writing workshops,

and phonics, spelling, and word study. Students begin with high teacher support but as they progress in their learning, their independence is nurtured with self-guided reading and writing activities.

PLTW [Project Lead the Way]

Project Lead The Way (PLTW) is a curriculum designed to teach students problem-solving strategies, critical thinking skills, communication, collaboration, and perseverance through hands-on learning. PLTW empowers students to be successful in the classroom by providing lessons that focus on today's real-world challenges.

Van Wert Middle School is a national PLTW Distinguished School, offering the Gateway to Technology program that covers topics such as design and modeling, automation and robotics, energy and environment, science of technology, and green architecture, which lays a foundation for the two education pathways provided at Van Wert High School: Pre-Engineering and Biomedical.

The Pre-engineering track offers four courses, each focusing on different aspects of engineering including, but not limited to, the design process, mechanisms, strength of structures and materials, automation, circuits, and combinational and sequential logic, which then

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culminates with a year-long project that is designed to solve

a real-world problem. Biomedical Sciences prepares students interested in pursuing a career in the health or science fields. Working with the same tools used by professionals in hospitals and labs, students engage in compelling, hands-on activities and work together to find solutions to problems.

CEO [Career Education Opportunities] Program

The CEO Program provides "real-life" exposure and experiences to high school seniors who have an interest in a respective career field. Students report to their assigned business for 75-80 minutes during the school day and earn high school credit for their time working in these professional environments.

The goal is to respond to local business demand by utilizing student talents and skills. Likewise, the partnerships also lend the opportunity for students to enhance soft skills, technical skills, and overall employability skills. The hope is to foster relationships where students may be able to gain employment beyond high school.

The CEO Program was created by Kerry Koontz, Van Wert High School counselor, in 2015 and has since been extended to the seniors of Crestview and Lincolnview.



Madison Couch, a 2022 graduate of VWHS, made an impression on Van Wert Area Economic Develop during her internship as part of the CEO Program. She has recently been named their new program assistant.

PBIS [Positive Behavioral Interventions & Supports]

PBIS is a district-wide initiative designed to recognize and reward students for displaying positive behaviors and actions in school. Launched in the fall of 2021, the program has already seen tremendous success, thanks in part to several donors who actively support this program.
