

## RUNNING START – LWIT course equivalencies for ISD grad requirements

**NOTE:** LWIT determines courses & class times offered each quarter. Not all courses below are guaranteed to run in any specific quarter. Plan carefully with your school counselor to ensure you have access to classes needed for graduation.

### English

### Math

Any course in the Mathematics (MATH) department at or above the 100-level is accepted for Math credit (excluding any Independent Studies or Special Topics courses).

Running Start tuition only covers college-level coursework (100-level or above). HS level courses below the 100 level (like Alg 1) are not covered by Running Start, and should be taken at the high school. After careful consultation with and approval from your school counselor, families can opt to pay tuition for HS level classes at LWIT for an outside credit. **NOTE:** a 5-credit LWIT class below 100 level earns .5 credit on HS transcript, rather than 1.0 credit.

### Science

Classes in the following departments are accepted for Science credit. Consult with your school counselor to confirm which classes will count specifically as a Lab Science class:

- Biology (BIOL), Chemistry (CHEM), Environmental Science (ENVS), Geology (GEOL), Nutrition (NUTR&101), Physics (PHYS)

### World Language

LWIT offers courses in ASL and Spanish. Course codes marked 121 = first year, 122 = second year, 123 = third year

**Health & Physical Education:** Not offered at LWIT.

### Art

All course offered in the Art (ART) department is accepted for Art credit. Some courses in the Design (DSGN) may be accepted for Art credit, please consult with your school counselor for more information.

### Career Tech Ed (CTE)

Any course at the 100 level or above in the following departments are accepted for CTE:
