## What's coming up in Advisory?

It's SAT Prep Season! Ms. Alicia and Student Advisors will be helping Juniors and then Sophomores create CollegeBoard accounts and Khan Academy account to transfer their PSAT scores to Khan Academy's AWESOME Official SAT Practice Class! This will customize student's SAT practice. Advisories will be using this tool periodically to encourage students to use the SAT Practice on their own. Did you know? Research shows that there is a positive relationship between score growth between the PSAT/NMSQT and SAT and time spent on Khan Academy's Official SAT Practice. TWENTY HOURS spent practicing is associated with an average 115-point score gain on the SAT-nearly double the average gain among students who did not use the SAT Practice!

### All Grades:

 The 2023 application for the College Board National Recognition Programs will be available on BigFuture® beginning next Wednesday, February 15. These programs award academic honors to top-performing Latino, Black, Indigenous, and rural and small-town students.

On February 15, eligible sophomores and juniors will receive an email from BigFuture inviting them to apply.

Visit <u>bigfuture.org/NRP</u> to apply. June 12 Deadline for all students to apply. This deadline will not be extended. Early Fall If you receive recognition after applying, you'll receive an email with instructions to access your official certificate of recognition. Counselors receive an email with a list of their school's awardees.

#### APS African American Youth Empowerment Summit, which will be held on March 4th from 9:30am - 3:30pm at the APS Berna Facio Professional Development Center.

Although targeted in part towards Black/African high school students, all APS high school students are encouraged to attend. The summit is a great opportunity for students to learn about leadership and becoming a strong ally, as well as to build their cultural understanding. #### 3) UNM Encourages Young Women in Orthopedics and Engineering

The University of New Mexico is proud to support the Perry Initiative and its mission to inspire young women to be leaders in the fields of orthopedic surgery and engineering-two fields in which women are sorely under-represented. On April 1, we'll be hosting a one-day, hands-on outreach event for high school students, offering young women an opportunity to perform mock orthopedic surgeries working side by side with female engineers and surgeons, attend talks from female mentors in both careers, and engage in experimental testing of repaired bones. This is UNM's tenth year hosting the Perry Initiative, which can serve as a pipeline for young women to enter our own academic programs. Interested applicants may apply using the form on the Perry Initiative website—and we'll see you here on April 1.

#### 5) MIT FREE MATH SUMMER PROGRAM!!!

√mathroots is a 14-day math accelerator summer program for high-potential high school students from underrepresented backgrounds or underserved communities who are interested in exploring creative topics in mathematics and problem solving. This year, it will take place June 23–July 7 on the MIT campus. Sponsored by the Math department at MIT and MIT PRIMES, the program explores creative problem solving and critical thinking in mathematical topics. Participants will work with a team of MIT instructors who have diverse experiences teaching both research and competition math, and will learn by doing!

All classes, food, and housing costs are generously covered by the program's funders. Students are required to pay for their transportation to and from MIT. However, a limited number of travel scholarships are available for students with need.

Former participants have shared that √mathroots taught them more about the wonderful, complex world that is logic and math, gave them an opportunity to explore exciting ideas and puzzles, and was a life-changing experience.

We hope you will share this opportunity with anyone you know who you think would be a good fit for  $\sqrt{mathroots}$ —for example, students who show a high degree of interest in math, or those who have a favorite math book. The \$5000 scholarship is awarded to a high school junior or senior planning to study a STEM field, who qualifies for free or reduced-price lunch, and who is preferably the first person in their family to go to college. The scholarship is open to high school Juniors and Seniors in New Mexico who meet the qualifications and submit an application. We will award at least two scholarships in 2023, and we will conduct a fund-raising campaign with the intent of raising enough to award a third scholarship.

## SCHOOL RECOGNITION

Early College Academy has added a new award to the recent National Blue Ribbon Award won in 2019 – ECA is now a 2023 Certified National Magnet High School.
