

Letter from our Principal

ECA & CEC Parents, Students, staff and Community:

Wow!! We are eight weeks in and Fall Break is already here! This is our second newsletter of the year in our desire to provide you with as much information as possible about what is happening at our school. It has been an eventful four weeks since the last newsletter.....



ECA celebrated our unique version of Homecoming. The seniors were dominated by the underclassmen in a serious game of kickball on Wednesday. Tyler Sanchez kicked the longest ball in kickball history but the underclassmen used teamwork and great fielding to beat the seniors. There was a lot of fun and laughs (mostly at seniors!) during Spirit Week and it all culminated with a Friday night dance in our new outdoor venue. It was incredible!!

We continue to work with our ECA students in Advisory classes on socio-emotional issues, concerns and information. We have done a tremendous job of teaching students some skills and strategies to cope with an ever-changing environment and they are starting to pay off. Our CEC instructors are collaborating together and receiving professional development from the NM Public Education Department. This partnership with NMPED is one more example of how we are bringing

the very best of NM together to create incredible learning opportunities for your students.

We have also had our share of safety concerns. We had two lock-downs in less than ten days as a result of incidents at our neighbor school, Albuquerque High School. As per APS policy, if AHS goes into shelter-in-place, lockdown or evacuation, we do the same. We appreciate the patience that our students, parents and staff have shown as we work through these situations. Please remember that while our ECA students are here on campus all day, we have five different CEC sessions of classes, meaning that we have to train five different groups of students on where to go during a fire drill and also what to do in a shelter-in-place, lockdown or evacuation. Our students have been amazing and this was evident during these two most recent events. We are currently working with our district to develop a systematic approach to communicating with families and we feel we are very close. For starters, we have taken the lead on how we will respond during future incidents. We understand that the initial moments of an emergency situation can be the most intense for parents so we will get that announcement out via robocall or schoolmessenger as quickly as possible to announce that we are in a shelter-in-place. lockdown or evacuation. We have assigned a staff member to get that message out and we anticipate that message should go out within five minutes of making the announcement to the school. At that point, it will be the district's responsibility to send out a more detailed explanation of events while the event is occurring. At the conclusion of the event, we will then follow up with an APS-approved message detailing the events. We take the safety of our students seriously and want to be transparent with parents and the public.

We commit, through regular and ongoing training, to ensure that our school is a safe place where students can learn and grow, free from concerns about safety. Daily measures are taken to ensure this safety, including locking the exterior doors; training our staff for a variety of crises that may be encountered from health issues, accidents, intruders, and weather-related crises; routinely monitoring security cameras throughout the school;

and ensuring our facilities are well maintained and all equipment is in working order. As mentioned earlier, we are working on communication protocols and procedures that outline how we will communicate with the school community in an emergency.

Schedules, ParentVue and StudentVue



The sun has been very active the last week. The largest sunspot in several years is now starting to face in the direction of the earth. Another smaller sunspot launched the first X-class flare (the most intense of solar flares) in five months on Sunday. An ultraviolet image of the flare taken by the Solar Dynamics Observatory is below.

ASVAB TESTING Thursday, October 20th from 9am-11:30am in the Lecture Hall.

This is an online test. BRING YOUR CHROMEBOOK for testing.

You will be excused from classes. You can go to the first part of second period and then will be called to the lecture hall for testing at 8:50am.

Why should you take the ASVAB Career Exploration Test?

The ASVAB CEP calculates your scores for career exploration only. You can use your scores to explore careers that are suited for your interests both in and OUTSIDE of the military.

This is not a test for military enlistment into one branch of the military. If you were to participate in the enlistment testing program you would have to choose a service to sponsor you to take the ASVAB. Only that service would have access to your scores and you would only choose a job from that service. You would be limited to job choices offered by that service. One of the many benefits of participating in ASVAB CEP is you can use your ASVAB CEP score to enlist in any service and we

encourage you to have meaningful discussions with each service to see which one offers the job, mission and environment that fits you best. If you are interested in the Military your ASVAB CEP scores can help you negotiate with each of the services before committing. Contact a recruiter to discuss your options.
