COUNSELOR CORNER

Hello ECA families,

I hope this email finds you all well in the new year. I wanted to give you some information on upcoming counseling sponsored events and student opportunities in the spring semester.

Some highlights of continued or upcoming presentations with your students through our **advisory program** on a variety of topics:

- Currently Freshmen are learning about graduation requirements, credits, GPA, dual credit opportunities and how to read a transcript
- Sophomores and Juniors will be setting up their individualized test prep through Khan Academy to help them prepare for the next PSAT or SAT testing.
- Sophomores will be learning more about self-care, mental wellness and how to advocate for themselves and others when they are "Not OK." It's OK to not be OK.
- All grade levels will be working with a community group- <u>Breaking the Silence</u> which will present and facilitate discussion about mental health, warning signs and breaking the stigma of mental illness. See attached document for more details.
- All grade levels will have the opportunity to use YOUSCIENCE. This is a dynamic Interest and Aptitude test that will help students learn about themselves, their skills and this may apply to certain careers.
- All Freshmen, Sophomores and Juniors- Upcoming in January/February- All Freshmen, Sophomores and Juniors will be thinking about what classes that they will be taking at ECA and CEC for the 2023-24 school year. Students will be learning more about what opportunities there are for them through ECA, CEC, CNM, UNM and IAIA. Dual credit classes can be taken on campus through CEC AND off campus, independently. Please be in communication with your student about classes and/or programs they are wanting to engage in. They will be choosing classes in January and February. All ECA students will register for any CEC classes through our registration google form that will be on our website, starting January 6th.

Seniors-

As of right now, less than ½ of you have completed your FAFSA. Now is a great time to sit down and get it completed. Only 1 parent is needs to create an FSA ID and fill out the application with you. The sooner the better! Many colleges have a FAFSA priority deadline. UNM's priority deadline is January 5th, so get your FAFSA completed! Even if you think your family will not qualify for federal aid for college, there are many scholarships that list "FAFSA completion" as one of the requirements. If you miss a priority deadline, it is still not too late to fill it out, but the sooner the better. If you need assistance filling it out, go sit with an expert and get the help that you need! Or if you just have one question, these resources are for you too!

ECA Senior Meetings: I am available to meet with seniors. I meet with every senior individually at least once but will meet with a senior student as many times as they need in order to make sure their transition to college or career is as smooth as possible.

- Please continue to check the **CLASS OF 2023 Senior Google Classroom**. I post student opportunities and NEED TO KNOWS, sometimes daily. This will be the main source of senior student communication around Senior only events and GRADUATION information and events.
- SENDING TRANSCRIPTS: Most of you will need to send your transcripts to colleges that you are applying to. Don't forget that if you've taken ANY dual credit classes, you'll also need to send colleges your CNM and/or UNM transcripts in order for you to receive college credit for those classes. All students are required to send both their high school transcripts and CNM and/or UNM transcripts through

Parchment.com. Students can either just go straight to Parchment.com, set up an account and search for Early College Academy OR they can go through our website: <u>https://cec.aps.edu/</u> At the bottom of our homepage, to the right, there is a big box, "Order your Transcripts" click there and get started!

We'll be going over all things college admissions, financial aid, SAT and resources to give your students a jump start on the process. - All Juniors will be taking the SAT in April of 2023 • on the ECA campus. The test will be free. Students will start preparing for the test with some help in advisory and a SAT prep class More details on the SAT prep class coming soon!

The Summer Multicultural Engineering Training (SUMMET) program is an engineering, science and technology program designed for rising juniors and seniors who are from underrepresented populations, including ethnic/racial minorities, women and prospective first-generation college students as well as students with demonstrated financial need.

SUMMET combines non-accredited coursework, hands-on projects, industry tours, team-building activities and social events. SUMMET provides exposure to the lifestyle, opportunities and challenges of college and is designed to help build skills and experiences for a smooth transition from high school to college. SUMMET is a one-week residential program, allowing participants to live on campus for the duration of the program, experience life as a college student and participate in STEM-related curriculum instruction.

This program is available at no cost to participants with the exception of a \$50 confirmation fee for students accepted into the program. Transportation to and from the program is not included in the cost and

- What are words your teachers, coaches, or • peers would use to describe you?
- Share an experience or example of a time that shaped you into the person you are today.
- A free response on a prompt of your choosing.
