ECA and CEC Students, Parents and Families:

Welcome back to the Early College Academy and the Career Enrichment Center for School Year 2022-2023!!! We are 17 days in and the year has started off fantastic! It is always exciting and rewarding to send out a message to our incredible families, and this message has some added meaning because you all are invited to our ECA/CEC Open House AND Grand Re-Opening of our newly remodeled building. This upcoming Thursday, September 8 from 5:30pm to 7:30pm please come join us to celebrate this muchanticipated event and also visit with your child's teachers. You can see where they go and ask all the questions you want! For over two years we have been anticipating the moment we could open our doors and get to work with teaching and learning that will prepare your student to become a part of an effective 21st century workforce.

Our new space is all we could hope for after two years of COVID and construction. We have almost all of our classes in the new building, our LPN Nursing program has classrooms and a lab worthy of this incredible program, ECA students have lockers (first time ever!), our teachers are primed and going strong, and the atmosphere is electric in our building! We are providing awesome instruction and relevant curriculum for all our students. Our teachers are delivering learning opportunities that engage our students in critical thinking, problem solving, social emotional awareness, and collaboration. I am so proud to be a part of this school community as we move into a post-pandemic and post-construction era.

STUDENT SAFETY UPDATE FOR ECA/CEC

Administration at ECA/CEC has stepped up the security on our campus to insure the safety of every student who enters our doors. We now have a vestibule entry model and only one door of entry into our school. The contractor is wrapping up the final installation but we have tested it and it is very effective. In addition, all students will be required to wear a student ID card visble for admin and security at all times. Students will be required to purchase a new one if they lose or forget the

one they received free. We will be conducting ALICE training and have already conducted five fire drills or shelters-in-place. We will put out safety updates in every newsletter so please read them.

Parking Permits

All eligible students in grades 10th - 12th may purchase a parking permit for the school year. However, parking is limited and we want to emphasize that transportation is available from every high school and back. Parking permits are \$45 for the full year. We are no longer selling semester only permits. Students must fill out the CEC PARKING PERMIT FORM and meet all requirements before purchasing a parking permit. Requirements for students to purchase a parking permit:

- Parking Form must be filled out before arriving to purchase your parking permit (click <u>here</u> to print your form)
- Students must have a Driver's License (NO DRIVER'S PERMITS will be accepted)
- Students must show proof of insurance and the vehicle that is being registered must be listed on the insurance
- Students must know the registered vehicle's license plate #, year, make, and model

- Students must bring \$45 CASH or CHECK (checks payable to ECA). NO credit/debit cards are able to be accepted and please have exact amount for cash
- Students cannot have any outstanding fines (Library, Cafeteria, Textbooks, Laptops, etc.

***Purchasing a parking permit does not ensure that a space will be available. Please ride the bus if possible.


Schedules, ParentVue and StudentVue

COVID UPDATE

The US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has updated recommendations for COVID-19 guidance. As a result, and in accordance with updated guidelines communicated by the New Mexico Public Education Department Friday afternoon (8/12), there have been some updates to the school district's COVID-19 guidance.

Effective Monday, August 15, APS will no longer require:

- Social distancing
- Quarantining for close contacts
- Close contact tracing, including notification of exposure to a positive COVID-19 case
- Participating in the APS Test to Stay Program

The following COVID-19 safe practices and protocols remain in place:

- Schools and departments will provide at-home rapid antigen test kits for students and employees who exhibit symptoms
- School administrators and department supervisors must report all positive cases to Nursing Services
- Employees are responsible for self-screening prior to coming to work
- Parents are responsible for screening their child at home prior to coming to school (parents should be reminded regularly to not bring symptomatic/sick children to school)
- Students and employees should stay home if they are sick
- Symptomatic students and employees are to isolate for 5 days - individuals who test negative on 2 athome rapid antigen tests, taken 24-48 hours apart, or test negative on 1 PCR test may return before 5 full days of isolation
- Students and employees who test positive must to stay home for at least 5 days and may return after 5 days if fever-free for 24 hours without fever-reducing medication and symptoms are improving
- Students and employees who test positive must notify their school/supervisor
- Students and employees who test positive and are returning to school/work after 5 days must wear a mask for an additional 5 days

The NMPED Toolkit will be updated in upcoming days. Once published, school administrators and department supervisors will be informed of additional updates. Based on recent updates, the district's plan for current and enhanced COVID safe practices is under

review. Changes will be made accordingly once the updated Toolkit is released and reviewed.

Positive COVID-19 cases reported by schools and departments will continue to be monitored. Additional guidance and mitigation strategies will continue to be considered if deemed appropriate when monitoring cases reported within the school district.
