



- Absence of assessments during Spring of 2020 impacts the progress and reporting contained in the traditional WBWF report and plan.
- Important to note that because the assessments were cancelled, this report attempts to highlight our current performance in light of our last benchmark point (*winter*)








Reading Performance by Race





Math Performance by Race







- → Continuing our emphasis on Pre-K, Kindergarten, 1st, & 2nd Grade Phonics
 - Explicit instruction in phonemic awareness & phonics
- Investment in digital learning tools to support continued literacy development
 - Raz Kids Plus
 - Increase equitable accessibility to online reading
 - Teacher progress monitoring tool
 - Continued implementation of the ISD 622 Multi-Tiered Systems of Support (MTSS) framework (i.e. WIN time)














High School Graduation: 4 yr. Graduation Rate District vs. State


4 Yr. Graduation by Race

POINTS OF PRIDE

Our Kindergarten:

• 622 is making positive gains toward closing the achievement gap when we analyze students' subtest results.

Our 3rd graders:

- Currently, our 3rd graders are attaining a greater level of proficiency than their 2nd grade proficiency.
- Our 8th graders:
 - We had minimal regression between Fall to Winter NWEA MAP testing.
- Achievement for ALL:
 - 622 continues its due diligence in ensuring we are closing the achievement by increasing equitable access for all students.
- Our District is growing graduates at a higher rate than State averages
- We are enrolling a higher percentage of students in Institute of Higher Education compared to the State
