COMMUNITY RELATIONS – 1000

BE IT RESOLVED by the RED BANK BOROUGH BOARD OF EDUCATION that upon the recommendation of the Superintendent the following COMMUNITY RELATIONS resolution(s) are approved as indicated:

1003. IN SUPPORT OF RESTORATION OF THE FEDERAL DEFERRED ACTION FOR CHILDHOOD ARRIVALS (DACA) PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the Red Bank Borough Board of Education is committed to educating all school-age children who live in our community; and

WHEREAS, the public schools of New Jersey are obligated under state law and regulation and federal court decisions to educate all children residing within their boundaries, regardless of immigration status; and

WHEREAS, the federal Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) program has enabled individuals brought to the United States as children to fully and confidently pursue an education at the elementary, secondary and post-secondary levels and to begin a pathway toward becoming contributing members of our society; and

WHEREAS, the DACA program has also provided these students with stability and protection; and

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WHEREAS, the federal administration discontinued the DACA program in September 2017, leaving it up to Congress to determine whether the program would be restored through legislation. Now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED that the Red Bank Borough Board of Education urges Congress to take immediate action to restore the protections and educational opportunities provided to children under the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals program, and be it further

RESOLVED that this resolution be sent to U.S. Senators Robert Menendez and Cory Booker and U.S. Representative Chris Smith, and be it further

RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the New Jersey School Boards Association and the Monmouth County School Boards Association.

Comments:

- Mr. Forest asked for clarification – Dr. Stone replied.
- Mr. Labetti thanked Dr. Stone and Dr. Ramage for bringing this to the Board even though it was not discussed in Community Relations due to the deadline to submit this resolution and there not being a Committee meeting before then. He stated that this resolution was directly from NJ School Boards. The Board of Education functions as a non-partisan entity with no party affiliation when members are elected. Taking action on this item is taking steps towards the slippery slope of politics. He later asked Dr. Stone why other resolution samples were not considered as there were other versions. Dr. Stone answered he did not see other versions so this was the one that was being presented.
- Ms. Roseman agreed with Mr. Labetti. She feels people on both sides of the aisle agree with this and it seems backwards to undo what was already done.
- Ms. Viscomi concurs with Ms. Roseman because we are talking about children who had no say. She felt our job was to educate and she is in support of the resolution.
- Mr. Kalorin agrees 100% with Mr. Labetti. He really would like to say yes, but the politics concern him. He is not sure how he will vote but he was not in favor of the School Board becoming involved in politics.
- Mr. Forest stated he would vote in the affirmative. Unfortunately the issue has been politicized, but the victims are kids and it affects our community. He was sorry it was politicized, but it is not the kids' faults.
