- A. The Board of Education of the Borough of Red Bank, in the County of Monmouth ("Board") advertised for bids Roof Rehabilitation at Red Bank Middle School ("Project").
- B. On March 31, 2017, six bids were received for the Project from the following bidders:

 - Strober-Wright Roofing
 - Roof Management, Inc.
 - Pravco
 - JDS Industrial
 - D.A. Nolt
- C. Because MTB, LLC was the lowest bidder at \$859,000.00 and because its base bid exceeds the Board's projected budget, the Board's architect, Settembrino Architects, has recommended the rejection of all bids pursuant to *N.J.S.A.* 18A:18A-22.
- D. The Board, knowing that all bids may not be rejected for arbitrary reasons and without good reason, accepts and agrees with the Architect's rationale and recommendation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board that all of the bids received as of and opened on March 31, 2017 for the Project are hereby rejected for the reasons expressed herein, and the bidders shall be so notified in writing by the Architect.
