VIII. OLD BUSINESS

- Dr. Stone stated that last year the AVID program was on the cutting block, and after tonight's presentation, good thing it wasn't cut.
- Mr. Ballard asked questions about AVID's student requirements such as GPA and how effectiveness and efficiency is measured. Ms. Sherwood stated there are rubric's on the student application. If the GPA is too high or too low, they do not qualify for the program, however, selection can only be on those who apply to be in the program. Dr. Rumage stated he will gather more information and present it to the Board.

- Ms. Roseman expressed frustration about the Charter School's ability to state whatever numbers they want and no one challenges them. The numbers are wrong. When we provide data to demonstrate the Charter School is wrong, no one in the media goes back to question the Charter School on validating their numbers.
- Mr. Forest congratulated the Leadership of the Board of Education and Staff on a wonderful response to the Charter School Expansion and that the community buy-in is amazing.
- Mr. Ballard commented on the district's Black History Month celebration and the Charter School's lack of diversity. He stated it's a great idea to expose the public to our diversity and we should have some kind of presentation publicly to thank the African American Staff.

At this time, Mr. Ballard made a motion to make a public presentation to thank the African American Staff. Mrs. Ludwikowski seconded this motion.

- Ms. Viscomi stated that this should be open to all ethnicities.
- Ms. Roseman suggested there should be a monthly recognition every month and that it would be great if Administration could set up presentations every month.
- Ms. Jones respectfully asked Mr. Ballard to withdraw his motion and have Dr. Rumage come up with a plan on how he wants to handle it.
- Mr. Ballard stated that October 15 through November 15 is Hispanic Heritage and recognition was paid and agreed the group should be recognized. Black history is a look back but we should recognize the people that are here now.

At this time Ms. Jones made a motion to table Mr. Ballard's prior motion until Dr, Rumage presents a plan. This motion was seconded by Ms. Roseman.
