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C. 2015-2016 Public Budget Hearing - Dr. Rumage presented the 2015-2016 Budget.

Dr. Rumage also acknowledged that approximately one year ago this day he was appointed as Superintendent. He thanked the Board, Administrative Team and Staff for their support. The children are remarkable and he is happy and proud to be here and stated we will reach our dreams.

- Ms. Viscomi stated that our schools are underfunded and that if we had received full funding the tax levy would be less and we could have done more.
- Mr. Ballard asked about revenues and asked if it was flat. Mrs. Pappagallo stated revenues were not flat.
- Mr. Ballard asked if salaries were budgeted to go up as there was an increase in overall salaries. Mrs. Pappagallo explained that the budget did reflect an overall increase in salaries as there were contractual obligations. She also explained that certain salary accounts include substitutes, extra work extra pay and stipends.
- Ms. Viscomi stated that as reviewed in a meeting with Mr. Ballard, the budget has no fat in it.

3045. ADOPTION OF THE 2015-2016 SCHOOL YEAR BUDGET AND TAX LEVY

WHEREAS, the Red Bank Board of Education adopted a tentative budget on March 17, 2015 to be submitted to the Executive County Superintendent of Schools for approval, and

WHEREAS, the tentative budget was approved by the Executive County Superintendent of Schools on March 26, 2015 and

WHEREAS, the tentative budget was advertised in the legal section of the (Asbury Park Press on April 21, 2015; and

WHEREAS, the tentative budget was presented to the public during a public hearing on April 28, 2015; and

Budget Adjustment – Enrollment:

RESOLVED that the Red Bank Borough Board of Education includes in the proposed budget the adjustment for enrollment in the amount of \$245,755. The district intends to utilize this adjustment for supplies and materials necessary for the additional students; and

Budget Adjustment – Health Benefits:

RESOLVED that the Red Bank Borough Board of Education includes in the proposed budget the adjustment for increases costs of health benefits in the amount of \$227,503. The additional funds are included in the base budget and will be used to pay for the additional increases in health benefits; and

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Budget Adjustment - Banked CAP:

RESOLVED that the Red Bank Borough Board of Education includes in the proposed budget the adjustment for banked cap in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-10.3(b). The district has fully exhausted all eligible statutory spending authority and must increase the base budget in the amount of \$239,675 for the purposes of instructional and contractual obligations. The district intends to complete said purposes by June 2016, and

<u>Travel and Related Expense Reimbursement:</u>

WHEREAS, the Red Bank Borough Board of Education recognizes school staff and Board members will incur travel expenses related to and within the scope of their current responsibilities and for travel that promotes the delivery of instruction or furthers the efficient operation of the school district; and

WHEREAS, N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-7.2 et seq. requires Board members to receive approval of these expenses by a majority of the full voting membership of the Board and staff members to receive prior approval of these expenses by the Superintendent of Schools and a majority of the full voting membership of the Board; and

WHEREAS, a Board of Education may establish, for regular district business travel as defined in NJAC 6A:23A-1.2, which includes attendance at regularly scheduled in-State county meetings, Department or Association sponsored events or in-State professional development activities for which the registration fee does not exceed \$150.00 per employee or board member, where prior Board approval shall not be required unless the annual threshold for a staff member exceeds \$1,500 in a given school year (July 1 through June 30); and

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Board of Education approves travel and related expense reimbursements in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A: 23A-7.3, to a maximum expenditure of \$150,000 for all staff and board members for the 2015-2016 school year; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the budget be adopted for the 2015-2016 School Year using the 2015-2016 state aid figures and the Secretary to the Board of Education be authorized to submit the following adopted budget to the Executive County Superintendent of Schools in accordance with the statutory deadline:
