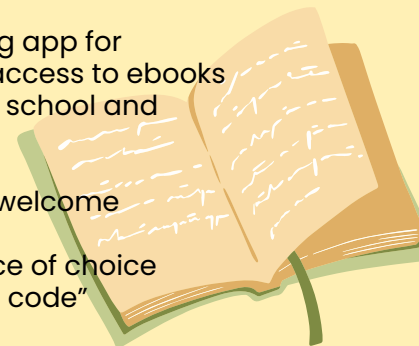


SORA

ACCUPLACER testing is virtual and required for all graduating students and will continue through the end of October. Check your calendar for your scheduled session.

Early Graduation Steps

If you are thinking about graduating early, reach out to your Guidance Counselor to create a plan. We offer 5-steps to help put your graduation goals in action.

1. Email your Guidance Counselor.
2. Have your LC write a letter in support.
3. Schedule the ACCUPLACER testing.
4. Email Dr. Browne for her approval.
5. Complete the Early Graduation Form.

Snack Attack: Pumpkin No Bake Cookies

- ¼ cup pumpkin puree
- ¼ cup unsalted butter
- 2 Tbsp. milk
- ½ cup sugar
- ½ cup 1 minute oats
- 2 cups old fashioned oats
- ¼ tsp. pumpkin spice
- 1 pinch salt
- ¼ tsp. vanilla extract



1. Add the pumpkin puree, butter, milk and sugar to a small pan and warm over medium heat. Bring to a simmer, then boil for around 1 minute. Remove from heat.

2. Meanwhile, add both your old fashioned oats to a bowl. Add the pumpkin spice and salt, and mix through.

3. Add the vanilla extract to the pumpkin-butter mixture and then add it to the bowl with the oats. Mix well.

4. Take spoonfuls of the mixture and press together with your hands just slightly to form into a somewhat flat ball. Set on the prepared baking sheet and allow to cool.
