It's time to start thinking about Re-Registration! The Re-Registration Parent Enrollment Portal will open Feb 27th. Please keep in mind that seats fill up quickly. If you are undecided, we recommend that you confirm and complete your re-registration anyway. If you do not complete your reregistration, your unconfirmed seat will be open to the public after March 8th.

Why choose virtual education? Why MEVA? Virtual schooling provides families the opportunity to have more flexibility within their student's education. MEVA is able to individualize a student's learning experience through alternative course options, external programs, work study, post-graduation planning and more.

MEVA supports include the HelpDesk and various types of study group options. Parents are also able to be engaged by monitoring their students grades, logging their student's attendance, and requesting team meetings to review student progress.

Virtual education allows for students to be more focused on their studies, be free from distractions, and have flexibility in making up work and classes. Students are able to work in their own comfortable environment. Safety is perceived as a strength of MEVA.

ACE Conservation Crew

After graduation, many of our students choose to continue their education, enter a trade, or seek employment. Others may ask, "Where do I go from here?"

The American Conservation Experience (ACE) Conservation Crew program is for participants, aged 18-35 who are considering land management as a career. Working alongside staff from the National Park Service, US Forest Service, US Fish and Wildlife Service, and many other public land agencies, members gain invaluable career perspectives and mentorship in a variety of areas.

Crew members may apply for 3, 6, 9 month or longer terms. Member support includes a cost of living allowance, transportation and food on projects, and free common housing on off days in most locations. Participants are also eligible to earn the Segal AmeriCorps Education Award.

Maine Educational Assessments (MEA) are mandatory **in-person** academic exams that will now be conducted **twice a year** starting the Spring and Fall of 2023.
