9. <u>SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT</u>

A. Opening of School/Enrollment Status

Dr. Morana reported that school opening was met with a high level of enthusiasm. Joe Passiment, Interim County Superintendent and County Business Administrator, was present to greet staff. Professional Development Day for staff was a success. It included a partnership program with Rumson-Fair Haven district, a book study, Harassment, Intimidation & Bullying (HIB) Policy review, overview of the new student information system (Power School Teacher), and teaching reading to ESL/Bilingual students.

Dr. Morana indicated enrollment was on target except for an increase in Kindergarten through 4th Grade. District enrollment it the highest it has ever been—in 2006 there were 790 students; current enrollment is 1,288.

B. Excellent Educators for New Jersey (EE4NJ) Pilot Program Grant Award Dr. Morana reported that our district is one of nine districts awarded the EE4NJ Grant. This grant will allow us to continue to provide support for teachers and provide expanded professional development to enhance the observation/evaluation system.

Dr. Morana asked for four teachers to serve as volunteers on how to go from "A to Z". Comments on the results were "well done"!
