These assessments inform funding decisions at the federal and state levels that supply necessary support and resources to our school.

### V-E Day (May 8th, 1945) By Megan Rushing

On May 7th, 1945, The British Broadcasting Corporation (BBC) brought news that allied countries have been longing to hear: WW2 was finally reaching its end!

What began with Germany invading Poland on September 1, 1939, WW2 saw millions of casualties, and six years of fighting. Following the supposed death of Adoff Hitler in late April, both Germany and Russia agreed to an unconditional surrender- signing the surrender documents on May 8th, 1945.

As the news spread around the world, cheers, tears, and celebrations filled the streets of many nations, while soldiers returned home to their patiently awaiting loved ones. This marked V-E day, or Victory in Europe Day.

As Great Britain's prime minister, Winston Churchill announced the end of the war, V-E day came as a birthday present for the newly appointed U.S. President, Harry Truman, who dedicated the day to the recently deceased President Franklin Roosevelt, who was president for most of the war.

Although V-E day marked the end of the war with Germany and Russia, the war with Japan was not quite over. The official end of WW2 came three months later on August 14th when Japan finally agreed to surrender, in the week following the atomic bombings of Hiroshima and Nagasaki.

V-E day was a day of both celebration and mourning, as it is a day that marked the closure of WW2.
