MINUTES

1. CALL TO ORDER

Board President Peter Noble called the March 17, 2009 Board Meeting of the Red Bank Board of Education to order at 7:30 pm.

2. SUNSHINE STATEMENT

Pursuant to Section 5 of the Open Public Meetings Act, notice of this meeting was advertised as directed by resolution adopted April 22, 2008. Notice of this meeting was published in the *Asbury Park Press*, *The Hub*, and the *Two River Times* newspapers per code and sent to the Municipal Clerk, Red Bank Borough, within 7 days per code.

3. ROLL CALL

4. FLAG SALUTE

Mr. Noble led the Pledge to the Flag. Mr. Noble wished all present a Happy Saint Patrick's Day.

5. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

A. Smart Board Presentation – Middle School Students

Mrs. Morana introduced Ms. Rachel Donnelly, a 4th Grade teacher, and explained that Ms. Donnelly's class will highlight the use of technology in the classroom using a Smart Board. Ms. Donnelly explained how students use the Smart Board in language arts lessons to improve their writing skills. The students selected classmates, Board members, and Mrs. Morana to complete examples of punctuation. Mrs. Morana thanked Ms. Donnelly, the students, and their families for showcasing technology use in the classroom; and invited Board members to visit the classrooms. B. Preliminary Budget Adoption 2009-2010

Ms. Darrow distributed copies of the user friendly budget to the public. (Copy of presentation and user friendly budget in Board book). Mrs. Morana presented the 2009-2010 preliminary budget. She reviewed the budget process, issues impacting budget development, and student achievement among other items. Mrs. Morana announced that the administration was successful in meeting the goal of a flat tax levy dollar for the 2009-2010 budget. Ms. Darrow explained that although the tax levy was flat, tax payers will experience a slight decrease in the general school portion of their tax bill. This is due to an increased borough net value.

COMMENTS:

- The Finance Committee chairperson stated it was a pleasure being part of the budget process and acknowledged it was a credit to the governor and legislation for keeping their promise to support education.
- With the level of detail, it is astounding we were able to keep the tax levy flat.
- Mrs. Morana was thanked for her unrelenting pursuit of grant funds. An example was given that the 21st Century Grant is a competitive and well sought-after grant; and it is highly unusual for a district our size to be awarded such a grant. The Preschool Expansion Grant is another example, as we were one of five selected districts state-wide.
- Mr. Noble thanked Mrs. Morana, Ms. Darrow, and the Finance Committee for presenting the budget.
- There was a discussion regarding bilingual students outperforming general education students and whether they receive additional benefits. Mrs. Morana explained ESL and Bilingual federal and state

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requirements, as well as the role of analyzing data, and teacher recommendation in relation to exiting students. The district is scheduling an independent assessment to review the program. Mrs. Morana further clarified that ESL/Bilingual education is mandated and also teaches communication skills and guided reading by using the same or modified curriculum.

- Clarification was made that the statement that ESL/Bilingual students were outperforming general education students reflects the question that perhaps a certain segment of bilingual students should be in general education. This is the purpose of the independent assessment.

C. Primary School Site Visits – Update

The Child Development Foundation's feedback was extremely positive; they saw a solid program that addresses the needs for students and reflects alignment between grade levels.

D. Spring 2009 Assessment Action Plan

Mrs. Morana advised the Board that preparations are underway for a spring assessment. Training is being held tomorrow to learn about changes in the assessments. Information will go home with students, and parent information sessions will be held.

- A. Board Candidates

Mr. Noble stated the Board has three open three-year terms for the upcoming election. We have four candidates seeking a three-year term. They are, in the order they will be printed on the ballot: Anne Roseman, Grace Costa, Carrie Ludwikowski, and Toni Brown.

The Board also has a one one-year term open. We do not have candidates seeking a seat for this term. This term may be filled through a write-in candidate. If we do not have a write-in candidate, we will advertise for the position.

9. STATEMENT TO THE PUBLIC

Often times it may appear to members of our audience that the Board of Education takes action with very little comment and in many cases a unanimous vote. Before a matter is placed on the agenda at a public meeting the administration has thoroughly reviewed the matter with the Superintendent of Schools. If the Superintendent of Schools is satisfied that the matter is ready to be presented to the Board of Education, it is then referred to the appropriate committee. The members of the board committee work with Administration and the Superintendent to assure that the members fully understand the matter. When the committee is satisfied with the matter, it is presented to the Board of Education for discussion before any final action is taken. Only then is it placed on the agenda for action at a public meeting.

3374. TRAVEL AND EXPENSE REIMBURSEMENT – 2009-2010

WHEREAS, the Red Bank Borough Board of Education recognizes school staff and Board members will incur travel expenses related to and within the scope of their current responsibilities and for travel that promotes the delivery of instruction or furthers the efficient operation of the school district; and

WHEREAS, N.J.A.C. 6A:23B-1.1 et seq. requires Board members to receive approval of these expenses by a majority of the full voting membership of the Board and staff members to receive prior approval of these expenses by the Superintendent of Schools and a majority of the full voting membership of the Board; and

WHEREAS, a Board of Education may establish, for regular district business travel only, an annual school year threshold of \$700 per staff member where prior Board approval shall not be required unless this annual threshold for any staff member is exceeded in a given school year (July 1 through June 30); and
